

DSWD DROMIC Report #11 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon as of 03 August 2017, 6PM

SUMMARY

On 27 July 2017, a flood incident affected the City of Malabon and Valenzuela due to the Southwest Monsoon. The said weather disturbance continues to bring about heavy rains in Metro Manila and other areas of the country such as Regions I, CAR, III, CALABARZON, and MIMAROPA.

To date, there are **3,783 families** or **16,549 persons** affected in **169 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, CAR, III, and CALABARZON** (see Table 1).
