Cholera in South Sudan

Situation Report # 42 as at 23:59 Hours, 27 June 2014

Situation Update

As of 27 June 2014, a total of 2,340 cholera cases including 63 deaths (CFR 2.7%) had been reported in South Sudan as summarized in Table 1 for Juba County and Table 2 for outside Juba County.

Figure 1. South Sudan Cholera Epicurve 23 April to 27 June 2014

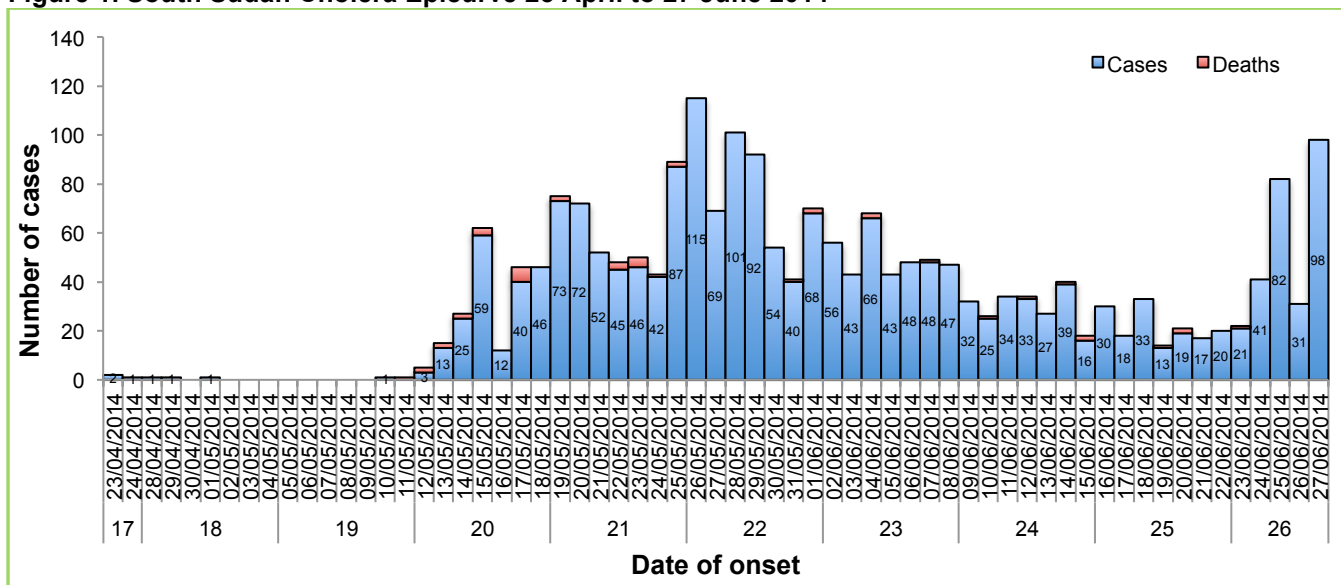

28/06/2014	<p>MSF reported two cases of suspected cholera from MSF hospital PoC2 clinic in Bentiu.</p> <p>The first case is a 4 years old female, admitted 3 days ago with malnutrition, pneumonia and vomiting. She developed diarrhoea while in the ward and RDT for cholera was positive. She had received the 2 doses of OCV. No other persons with similar symptoms in the family. They live in POC4. The symptoms are now subsiding.</p> <p>The second case is a 6 months baby from POC1, admitted 3 days ago with diarrhoea and vomiting. RDT for cholera was positive. The symptoms are now subsiding. No similar symptoms from her 6 siblings. The family came from Bentiu town to PoC1.</p>	Bentiu POC 1 and 4, Unity State	<p>Stool samples from both cases were taken for onward transport to Juba for laboratory confirmation.</p> <p>Investigations and household visits conducted.</p>

Torit and Lafon Cholera Outbreak Situation Update

As of 27 June 2014, a total of 257 cholera cases including 11 deaths (CFR 4.3%) have been reported since the beginning of the outbreak on 14 June 2014. A detailed situation report on Torit/Lafon will be issued on 29 June 2014.
