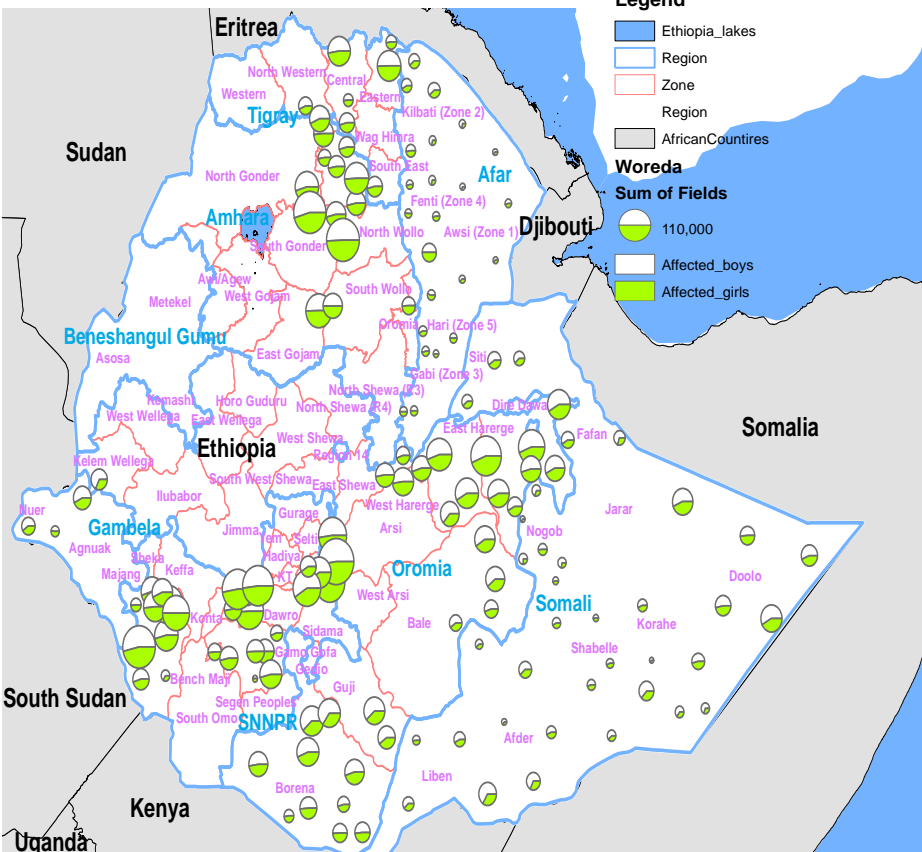

In 2017 HRD, Education Cluster targeted 2 million school age children. The prolonged drought conditions are exacerbated and the targeted school age children have increased to 2.8 million. This in turn increases funding requirements by nearly \$22 million from the current \$45.5 million appeal that is 23 per cent funded. The two most critical factors that make children discontinue their education in Ethiopia are shortage of water and food. Apparently, the Education Cluster strategically focuses on the provision of school feeding, WASH and learning supplies. Revised number of people in need in 2017: 2.8 m (increased from 2 m). Revised funding requirements for 2017: \$67.5 m (increased from \$45.5), of which \$13.2 m received.
