Rainfall Performance (7th to 14th Oct. 2012)

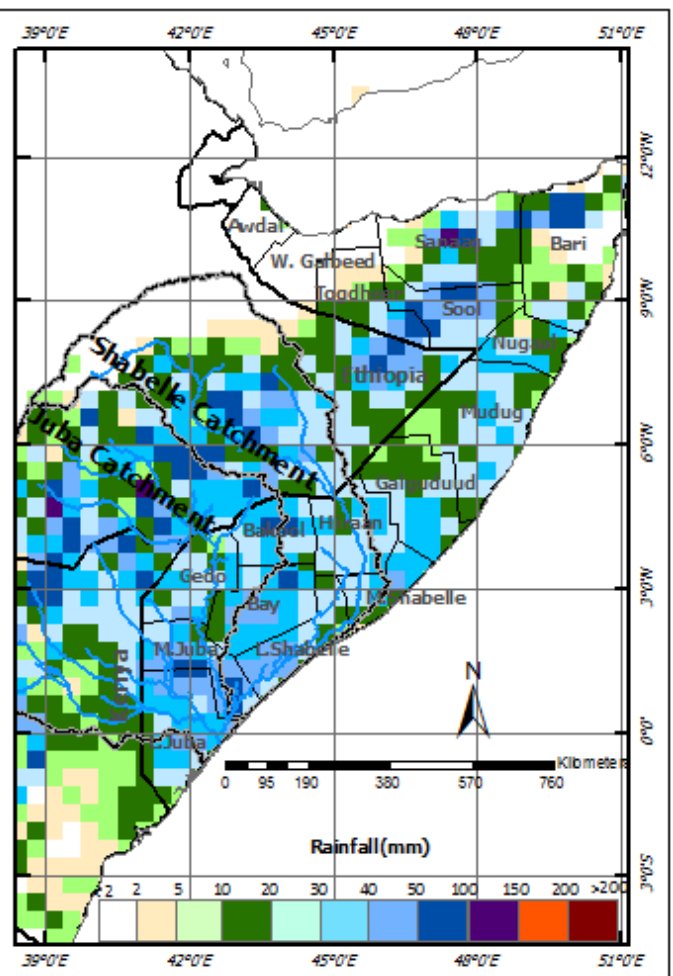
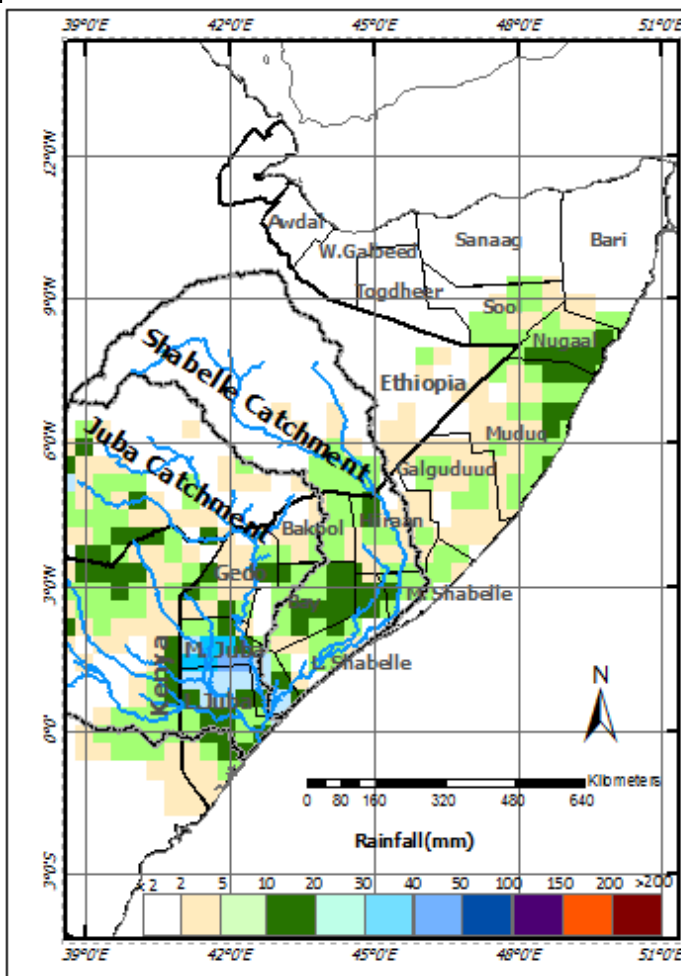
During the last week, moderate to heavy rains were reported in many parts of the southern parts of the country. The lower parts of the Ethiopian highlands received significant rains which have led to a slight increase of river levels along the Juba and Shabelle rivers in Somalia, however, there is no immediate risk of flooding along the two rivers.

Rainfall Forecast (15th to 21st Oct. 2012)

The three day rainfall forecast (map 1) calls for continued rainfall activities in most parts of the country apart from the northern regions. The rainfall is expected to intensify as the week progresses as shown on the seven day rainfall forecast (map 2).
