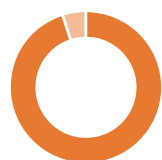

NEWS & UPDATES

1. The Orientation on Inspection SOP for POs was held on 4 Jan. It was raised during the session that the inspection SOP does not cover a number of housing typologies and materials relevant to the local context, or emerging technical approaches.
2. POs have been requested to support with providing technical assistance and the DL-PIU engineers are responsible for conducting inspections. The strict nature of the SOP, which has no tolerances for any specifications, was felt by some to be a major challenge for households to follow the inspection process, causing more cases of non-compliant construction.
3. According to LDO, Ward level Reconstruction Committee needs to be formed by the end of January.
4. Helvetas has started On the Job Training in some of its working VDCs, two model houses have completed as of 6 Jan. Helvetas informed that the trainees will be paid NPR 250 per day, slightly lower than the market wage. All POs are requested not to overpay trainees and use fixed district wage or less wherever training programmes are conducted.
