**Assessment Result**

**Key Issues/Highlights:**

- Close coordination meeting with the PDRRMO of Lanao del Norte , Governor Imelda ‘Angging’ Quibranza-Dimaporo, Col. Jon Goyena and Engr. Joseph Apat of the Provincial Engineering Office-LDN
- Joint assessment with OCHA conducted in one of the hardly hit barangay of Salvador by the TS Vinta
- A joint assessment with OCHA, visited Brgy. Mindalano- one of the severely damaged barangay of Salvador

**Geographic Information:** Municipality of Salvador with 26 barangays, 10 are affected while the 6 barangays are identified as the severely damaged out of the 10 by TS Vinta.

**Demographic data:**

There were 10 affected barangays and 6 are the hardly hit barangay’s.

**Relief Effort Assistance/ Shelter/ Food Security**

According to the MSWDO shared that LGU is continuously distributing food packs and Hygiene kit food for 1 week consumption to the affected families and they have enough supply of food packs up to present but not sure if it will last for a month. While conducting the assessment the Philippine Red Cross distributed standard hygiene kit, blanket, plastic mats, tarpaulin, and grocery items from Puregold, 2pcs of 10L white jerry cans, and 3,000 cash as financial support to the selected beneficiaries that lost their loved once and those that houses are totally damaged by the typhoon Vinta. Medecin Sans Frontieres-MSF distributed Hygine kit and water kit to the 4 severely affected barangays namely; Calimodan, Pansur, Padian and Mindalano.

### **Water Supply**

Most of the infrastructure such as houses, mosques, latrines and water source (reservoir), water lines are totally damaged. During the interview according to the resident their main source of drinking and domestic water is coming from the spring prior to Vinta, currently the community source of water is coming from the neighbouring purok but it was too far from the community. LGU is continuously delivering mineral water from the refiling station to the severely damaged communities.

### **Water Purification/ Treatment**

Access to drinking water is difficult in the severely affected barangays and using aquatabs in treating water is new to the community so the need to conduct follow up Hygiene promotion activities on the importance/benefits and proper use of aquatabs.

### **Sanitary Facilities**

Prior to typhoon Vinta 50% of the families have access to functioning sanitary toilet, currently majority of the families have limited access and community resort to open defecation. Most of the existing latrines are totally washed out by the flash flood. There's an emerging need to put up a temporary communal latrines with handwashing facilities, bathing and laundry facilities.

### **Hygiene**

There were simultaneous distribution of Hygiene kits, water kits from MSF and PRC. MSF were able to distribute to the 4 barangays (Calimodan, Pansur, Padianan and Mindalano) while PRC have only targeted beneficiaries. There's still remaining 2 barangays (Pagayawan and Pagalongan) for the distribution of the basic WASH items. The lack of Hygiene promotion awareness campaign during the distribution is identified as a gap. Need for re-enforcement of HP awareness on importance of proper use of latrine, handwashing during critical times and proper use of aquatabs/hyposol.

### **Health**

No data available during the time of assessment. IPHO-LDN conducted medical missions

### **Nutrition**

There were no relevant data gathered during the conduct of assessment. During the conduct of medical missions it was observed by the team a number of malnourished children.

### **Protection/Women and Child Protection**

An immediate need for psychosocial intervention specifically for children and adults and pregnant and lactating mothers. Since the water system nearby were damaged, women and children are forced to carry water from far distance source, the lack of cooking/kitchen utensils add up to the existing burdens, DSWD distributed some kitchen utensils but shared by 5 to 6 families. Access to sanitary pads is also part of the women and girls struggle due to lack of available menstrual hygiene materials.

### **Emergency Education**

No significant damages on the school infrastructures but an immediate need for the school supplies and school uniforms for the pupils.

### **Emergency Telecoms/Communications**

The telecommunications both globe and smart network is working.

### **Access**

No major problems in accessing the affected barangays except for brgy. Mindalano that can only be accessed via Kapatagan and Sapad municipality.

### **General Observations/ Challenges and Recommendations:**

- Majority of the affected barangays are accessible via land trip
- The lack of preparation of the communities at the municipal and barangay level contributed to the severe damages of the typhoon.
- Distribution of basic Health and Hygiene items (water kit, hygiene kit, dignity kits, kitchen utensils) and hygiene promotion activities
- provision of semi-permanent or permanent latrines
- Immediate repair of the hand pumps and water lines
- Water quality monitoring/test
- Monitoring of mortality and morbidity
- Debris clearing and provision of tools such as shovel, rake, wheel borrow, dust pan and broom stick
- Need for MHPSS intervention
- Families that are located to water ways needs to be relocated
- Shelter assistance is needed
