### III. Humanitarian Needs and Response

Humanitarian partners on the ground in Badakhshan continue to reiterate their readiness to provide assistance following assessments, once access permits.

### IV. Coordination

OCHA continues to conduct daily coordination meetings with humanitarian partners and the local government authorities.

The provincial governor suggested that the next PDMC will be conducted on Thursday 26 January 2012 at 10:00 hours. On Sunday 22 January, OCHA will conduct a coordination meeting with humanitarian partners to map strategies for humanitarian assessments.

Local authorities suggested the following access routes to the affected areas:

- Shahri-Buzurg – can be accessed through Tajikistan by boat or road
- Yawan – access by air – helicopter, difficult to access by boat or road
- Khwahan – no bridge on the Tajikistan/Afghanistan border - access by air (helicopter) only
- Raghistan - access by air (helicopter) only
- Kohistan - access by air (helicopter) only
- Yaftal Sufla - access by air (helicopter) only
- Kuf Ab - access by air (helicopter) only
- Arghanj Khaw - access by air (helicopter) only
- Shahada – access by road from Fayzabad if not blocked and
- Ishkashiem - access by road from Fayzabad if not blocked.

ANDMA reported that two Ministry of Defence helicopters would land in Fayzabad today for a mission tomorrow to the Shavi community in Arghanj-Khaw district where 15 villagers have been affected by extreme cold temperatures and require urgent medical treatment (two high school graduates reported on 20 January are amongst the fifteen to be recovered). ANDMA faces challenges to fuel the military helicopter due to lack of resources and has been unable to conduct the necessary assessments to determine the impact of the disaster. NGO partners remain reluctant to use Ministry of Defence air assets.
