



SITUATION

- Tropical Cyclone ENAWO made landfall over north-eastern Madagascar on 7 March and then moved west south-west over land and towards the southern areas, crossing the country.
- Severe weather, including heavy rain, strong winds and storm surge, has been affecting the country, causing casualties and damage.
- As of 13 March, the Bureau National de Gestion des Risques et des Catastrophes (BNGRC) of Madagascar reported that the death toll has reached at least 50 people. They also reported 20 people missing, 195 people injured, 84 660 people displaced. The most affected regions due to strong winds, heavy rain and storm surge are Sava, Analamanga, Analanjirofo and Atsinanana.
- The Copernicus EMS was activated on 7 March.
