

Key issues in the past week:

- **Conflict forced 8,600 people from their homes across the country, according to initial reports.**
- **More than 9,500 people returned Afghanistan from abroad during the past week.**
- **244 survivors of Gender Based Violence were assisted by Cluster-partners.**
- **More than 40,000 people received aid across the country from some 20 humanitarian partners.**

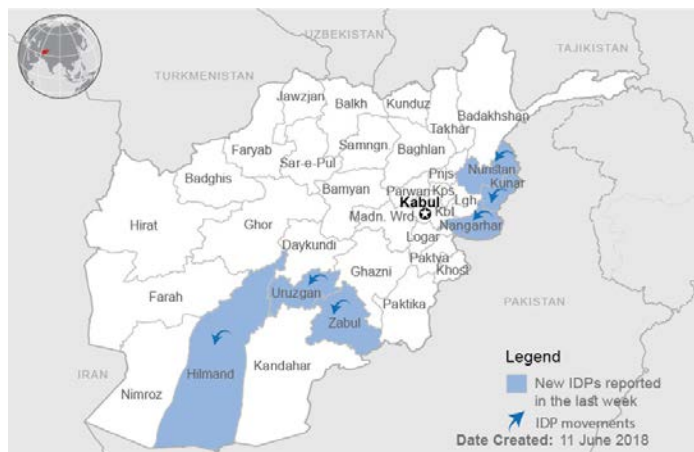

Countrywide conflict displacement

A total of 127,045 people has been verified as having displaced by conflict in 2018, according to OCHA's [Displacement Tracking System \(DTS\)](#). This is up by more than 10,000 people compared to the previous week. The DTS tracks displacements based on humanitarian assessments.

Conflict Displacement Alerts *(see map)*

Conflict displacement alerts are shared based on initial information received from the ground. Numbers can change as more information becomes available.

Eastern Region: Nearly 3,500 people have been displaced in Dehbala district of Nangarhar Province due to ongoing military operations. Further, some 300 people were displaced within Pachieragam district, Nangarhar, according to initial reports from the ground. In addition, according to authorities in Kunar, Nangarhar and Nuristan provinces, more than 2,600 people have recently been displaced due to insecurity and intimidation in the three provinces.

Northern & North-Eastern Region: No significant new displacements have been reported in past week, whereas more than 4,800 recently displaced people were identified as being vulnerable in humanitarian assessments and recommended for assistance in Badakhshan, Baghlan, Faryab, Jawzjan, Kunduz, Sar-e-Pul and Takhar provinces.

Southern Region: Due to ongoing clashes between Afghan military and members of armed groups, some 900 people displaced in Uruzgan, 1,125 in Hilmand and some 375 people in Zabul province. Due to the ongoing fighting, three health facilities in Daychopan district of Zabul were closed down temporarily.

Natural Disasters and Drought

Eastern Region: Nearly 1,400 people have been affected by the rising water level of Kabul river in Zakhail village, Kama district of Nangarhar province.

Northern & North-Eastern Region: More than 160 people were verified as affected by flash floods in Fayzabad City of Badakhshan province.

Western Region: Humanitarian response for more than 22,000 people affected by recent flash floods in Muqur and Abkamari districts of Badghis province is planned to commence shortly.

To support families affected by the drought, authorities in Badghis will start transportation of wheat to six districts of the province for distribution to the most vulnerable.

Returns to Afghanistan

From 03 May to 9 June, a total of 9,574 Afghan citizens returned to their home country from abroad. According to [IOM](#), 213 Afghan citizens returned spontaneously from Pakistan; from Iran, 2,069 people returned on their own and 7,093 were deported. Further, [UNHCR](#) repatriated and assisted 79 Afghan refugees from Pakistan, 19 from Iran and 1 from another country.

Cluster Updates

Partners of the **Health Cluster** in the Eastern Region reached more than 3,700 displaced people and returnees from Pakistan with health services and consultations and vaccinated more than 400 g. The **sub-Cluster Gender Based Violence (GBV)** reached more than 6,200 people with GBV services, including 244 female survivors of GBV.

Security Incidents and Humanitarian Access

In Jawand and Balamurhab districts of Badghis Province, supplies of clinics are banned by NASGs and is affecting the health service provision. Whereas in Saghar district of Ghor province, NASG warned health worker about establishment of voter registration centre that is very close to clinic.

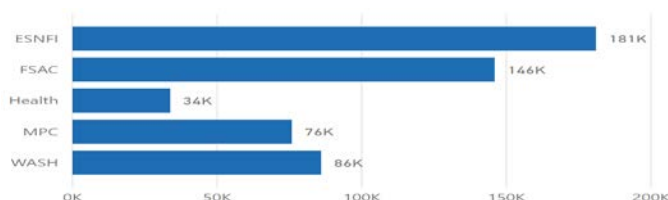
During the past week, more than 40,000 displaced people, returnees, refugees, vulnerable host communities and families affected by natural disasters received humanitarian aid or participated in health awareness activities.

Activities were reported from Badghis, Baghlan, Farah, Ghor, Hirat, Kabul, Khost, Kunar, Kunduz, Laghman, Nangarhar, Nuristan, and Takhar by organizations including **ACTED, Afghanaid, ANDMA, CoAR, CWSA, DACAAR, IMC, IOM, IRC, Mission East, NCRO, NRC, OXFAM, PU-AMI, RI, SCI, UNHCR, UNICEF, and WFP.**

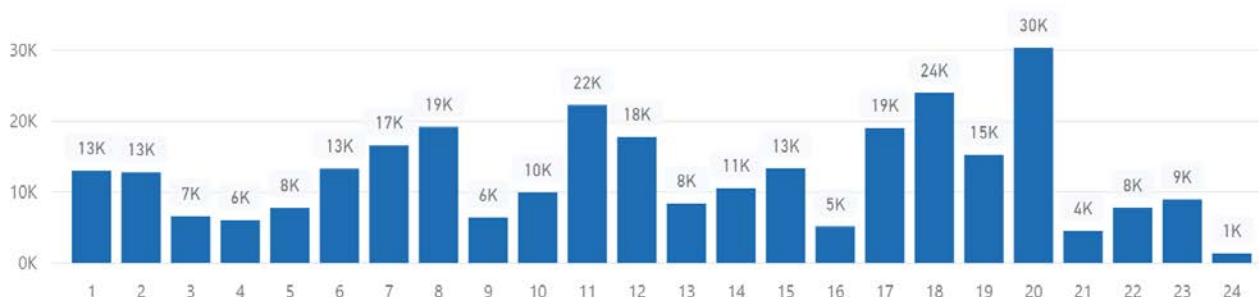
