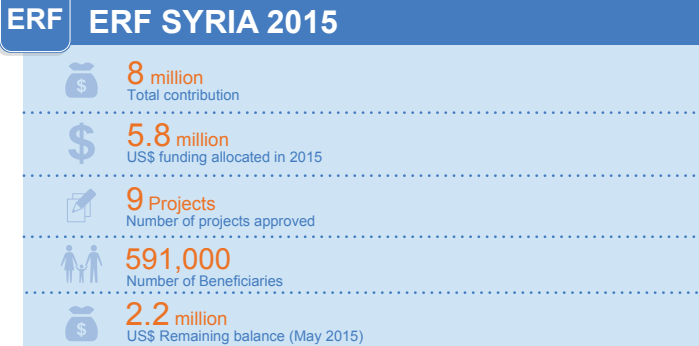


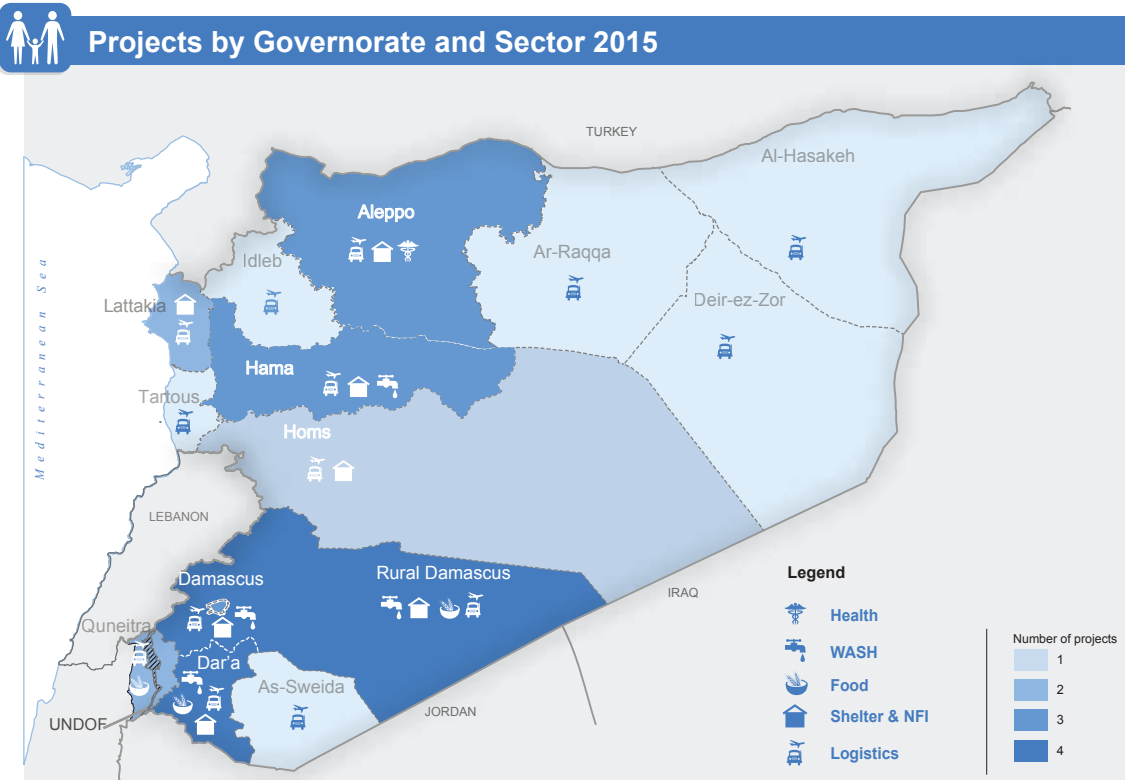
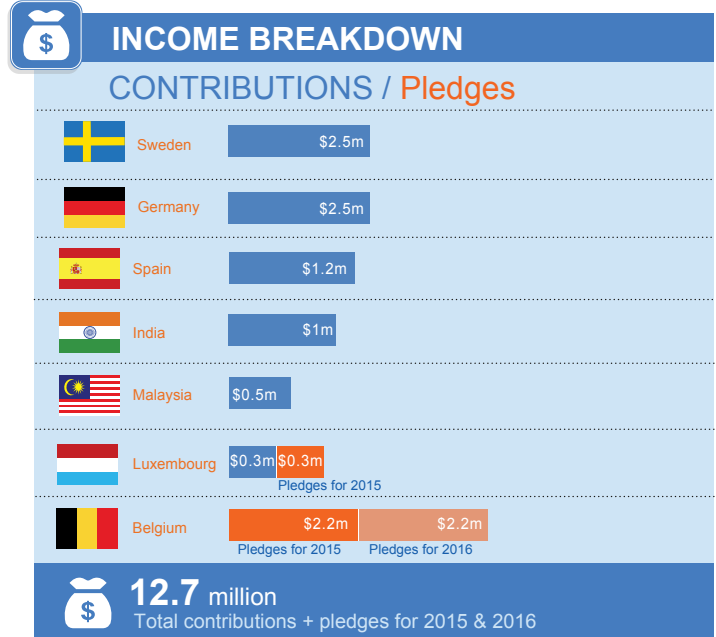
## Overview

In January 2015 the new Syria ERF allocated US\$4 million to six projects for life-saving winter response interventions. In addition, three projects were approved on a rolling basis as of May 2015, including a health project by a national NGO. An additional project to support a planned airlift to besieged areas of Deir Ezzor is under review. A majority of approved projects include components aiming to address needs in hard-to-reach areas and efforts are being made to increase the number of NGOs that benefit from the fund in line with the Syria ERF's commitment to allocate 50% of funds to NGOs by the end of 2015.

## Regional ERF 2012-2014

The Regional ERF funded 85 projects inside Syria between 2012-2014, of which 12 are under implementation. Of the remainder, 45 projects have been completed and closed, 9 have been sent for closure, 4 are under audit and 15 are pending closure.

 FAO	Emergency assistance to vulnerable families in Rural Damascus, Dar'a and Quneitra Governorates through backyard poultry production.	\$750,000
The six months project aims to support 1,750 families (12,250 persons) living in underserved hard-to-reach areas in Rural Damascus, Dar'a and Quneitra with the provision of 20 hens and 100 kg of poultry feed to produce their own food. The project aims to increase beneficiaries' food security and nutrition status.		
 UNRWA	Provision of life-saving winter NFIs to Palestine Refugees in Syria.	\$750,000
The three months project aims to strengthen resilience of 5,358 conflict affected displaced refugee families through the provision of essential winter NFIs as well as the provision of three month supply of heating fuel to collective shelters inhabited by 6,695 displaced families in Damascus, Hama, Lattakia and Aleppo.		
 UNICEF	Provision of winter supplies for internally displaced children.	\$750,070
The three months project aims to benefit a total of 59,500 people, including children and adolescent boys and girls through the distribution of winter kits (5,000), blankets (22,000) and the installation of heating facilities, fuel tanks and the provision of fuel to 100 schools (benefitting 30,000 school children and 2,500 teachers) in Rural Damascus, Eastern Aleppo and Homs City.		
 UNHCR	Provision of winterisation core relief items and clothes to vulnerable internally displaced persons.	\$750,337
The project aims to address the most pressing needs of 10,625 IDPs through the provision of winterisation core relief items and clothing in Homs and Hama.		
 IOM	NFI and shelter support for winter-affected population inside Syria.	\$750,000
The project aims to provide winterization items and kits to 18,500 IDPs. In addition, more than 3,500 IDPs will benefit from the provision of shelter materials and tools needed for shelter rehabilitation/upgrade. 50 per cent of the project activities is targeting beneficiaries in hard-to-reach areas in Rural Damascus.		
 UNICEF	Emergency WASH interventions to IDPs and host communities affected by harsh winter conditions.	\$700,800
The three months project aims to provide emergency WASH services to 410,000 host community members and IDPs (Including in hard-to-reach areas of Damascus, Rural Damascus and Dar'a) through quick repairs of sewerage networks damaged by snowstorms, as well as repairs of electro-mechanical equipment and water heating equipment.		
 Oxfam GB	Emergency WASH winter response.	\$300,000
The project aims to provide generators and equipment to the water authorities in Hama (7) and Aleppo(5), in order to provide emergency water supply, benefitting 50,000 individuals.		
 WFP	Ensuring vital humanitarian deliveries.	\$749,350
The four months project aims to support the Logistics Cluster's cross-line and cross-border transshipment hubs, as well as provide 100,000 litres of fuel to vulnerable populations in IDP shelters in Damascus, Homs, and Hama.		
 Monastery Saint James the Mutilated	Secondary healthcare and emergency obstetric care clinic in the Nayrab camp	\$342,443
The project aims to improve access to essential curative health services targeting 7,900 people through the establishment of a surgical mobile clinic with X-ray and laboratory equipment in Aleppo. In addition, the project will enhance the technical capacity of 55 medical staff.
