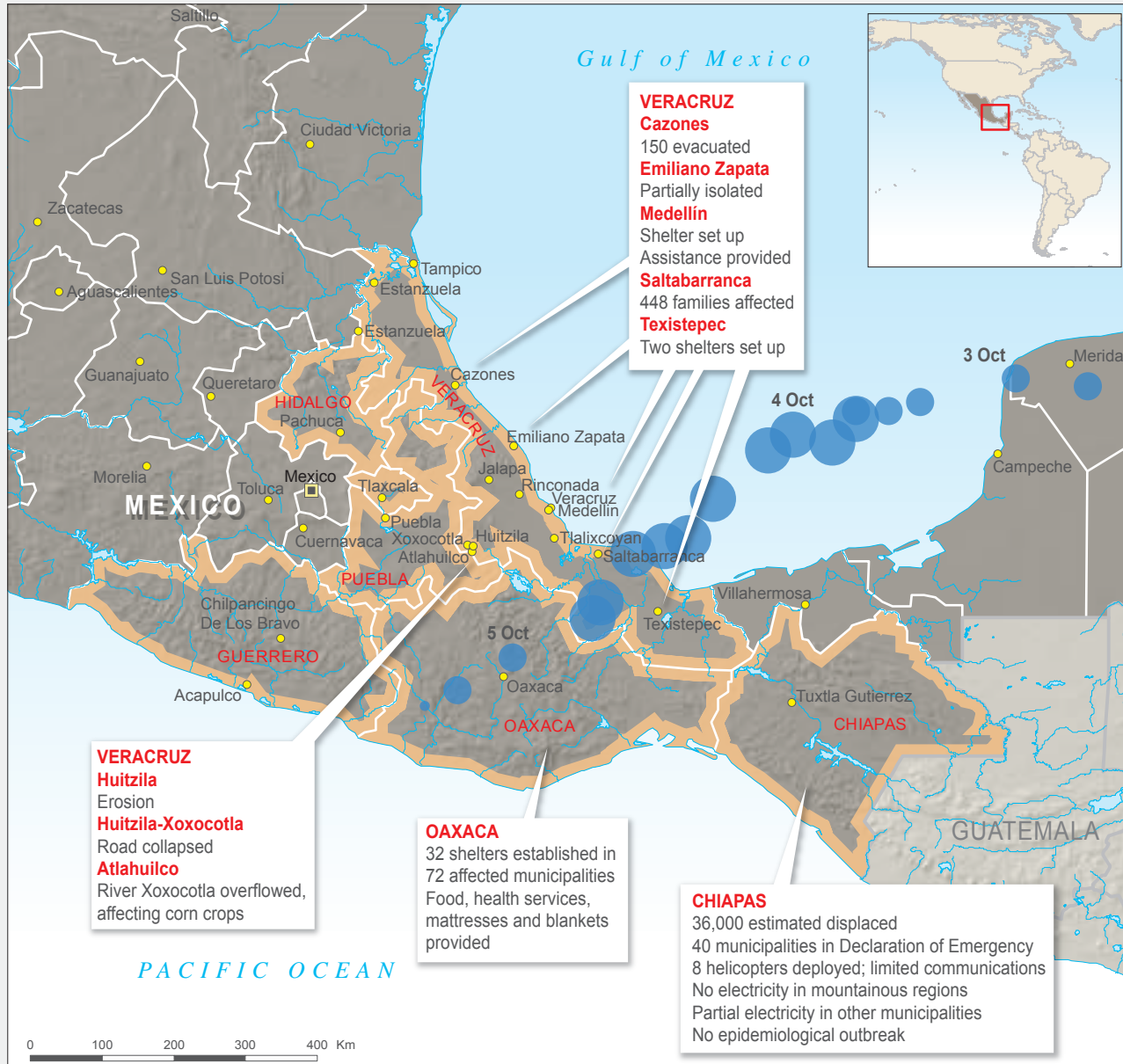




Mexico: Hurricane Stan

"Affected areas include the coast of the Gulf of Mexico, particularly the South of Veracruz as well... the Central-South part of the country."



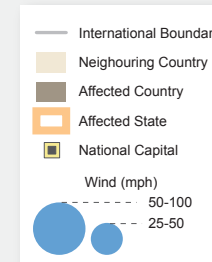
SITUATION

Hurricane Stan caused floods in Mexico, damaging crops, roads and communication infrastructure, leaving some areas isolated.

ACTION

National System of Civil Protection, DN-3 emergency plan, State departments and local civil protection organizations responding to the emergency. Warehouse to store water and food supplies established in Chiapas; Secretariat of Health has also opened a warehouse. Government has not requested international support though several offers have been made.
