"The United Nations Resident Coordinator in Lima reports that the departments of Puno and San Martin have been affected by above average rainfall since the beginning of 2004."

Cajamarca
16,000 hectares of crops lost
18,000 hectares of crops and pasture severely affected by drought and frost.
State of Emergency declared



San Martin
Floods and landslides affected the provinces of El Dorado, Lamas, Picota, Moyobamba, Bellavista and San Martin.

Puno
Overflowing of the Ramis and Hancane rivers has caused floods affecting 18 communities in the provinces of Huancane, Lampa, Azangaro, San Juan de Putina, Collao and San Roman.
State of Emergency declared

These phenomena, when compounded have had the following impact:

- Affected persons: 8,800 (3,250 severely affected)**
- Houses damaged: 1,730**
- Houses destroyed: 866**
- Crops affected: 7,525 hectares (1,900 destroyed)**
