PREPARED BY:	The Office of the UN Resident Coordinator and the UNETT, based on reports received from the COE, and UN Agencies, local and regional as well as other international agencies in Panama.																														
CURRENT SITUATION:	Weather conditions have improved in all of the country. Alerts are issued for moderate rain with thunderstorms for certain areas over the Caribbean coastline from the northern coast of Veraguas to the eastern coast of Colon (Costa Arriba) and over the Gulf of Urabá in the vicinity of Puerto Obaldía and La Miel. Efforts are concentrated in the distribution of aid, and recovery. Only two shelters remain open in Bocas del Toro and two in the Panama northeastern area.

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PROJECTED EVOLUTION:	<p>Secondary threats: The affected population is at risk of skin, intestinal and respiratory infections and other related water-borne diseases. Pollution of superficial waters by drag of refuse material and/or agro-chemical products could also poses a serious health threat.</p> <p>Climatic situation: Images of the Doppler satellite radar show cloud conglomerates over the Eastern region of Panama, the Colon Costa Abajo area, and Central Panama. Rainfall has expected duration of one to two hours.</p>																														
IN COUNTRY RESPONSE:	Organization: The National System of Civil Protection (Sistema Nacional de Protección Civil) – SINAPROC, is activated with good coordination. All Governmental institutions as well as Embassies and the civil society are involved in the relief efforts.

RESPONSE:**

Operations: The National Government continues to collect and dispatch essential relief items through the office of the First Lady and SINAPROC personnel has been distributing blankets. Water and foodstuff. SINAPROC's warehouse operations continue with a plan to dispatch goods to communities that, according to information from the field, have not been assisted.

The Ministry of Housing carried out a housing census in 31 affected communities in Bocas del Toro. Of 630 houses assessed, 162 (26%) are partially damaged and 232 (37%) with total damage as seen in Annex 1.

The UN Resident Coordinator has been coordinating relief activities with SINAPROC, the Ministry of Health and other governmental institutions. The UNDAC team continues supporting the COE-SINAPROC in information management through the elaboration of a guide for reporting in order to compile information from the different institutions and sectors and consolidate the report as SYSTEM.

A meeting with the Director of COE Bocas del Toro and the Director of the Social Investment Fund (FIS) is planned with the objective to work on strategic vulnerability maps being developed by the UNDAC team. Constant coordination (Panama/ Changuinola) to carry-out field evaluations to zones not yet visited. The preliminary evaluation plan is the following: 5 December: Joint evaluation composed by SINAPROC, Governor's office, and UNDAC team to visit the following zones by land from Changuinola: Almirante, Chiriquí Grande, El Guabito, Palmitas de Yorkim, Datle, and Buena Selva

An updated list of donations, compiled by OCHA is attached as Annex 2.

An updated list of status of teams on missions to the field is attached as Annex 3.

OCHA secured an US\$30,000 emergency cash grant (ECG) from the Government of Norway to provide immediate life-saving and life-sustaining support to the victims of the floods. A net amount of US\$29,100 will be available for relief activities once mandatory operating and handling charges of 3% are deducted and a cost plan is submitted for approval.

PAHO and the Ministry of Health mobilized of 7 national experts to the affected areas to accompany health authorities and the UNDAC mission, to provide technical support to the country teams in mental health, epidemiology and health services.

FAO deployed an expert to Bocas del Toro to initiate damage and needs assessment on food security and agriculture sectors within the context of early recovery.

WFP's shipment of high-energy biscuits arrived and is being distributed to NUTREHOGAR, a nutritional foundation for children, in Changuinola, to the National Hospital in Chiriquí Grande, and other communities.

WFP activated emergency staff roster, deploying altogether four logistics officers and an information manager to the field and donating one mobile warehouse to the Chiriquí Emergency Operations Center (COE) of SINAPROC, which has been operational since December 1.

WFP facilitated a basic workshop on supply chain and warehouse management to Government SINAPROC, FIS (Social Investment Fund) and the Office of the First Lady and provided technical support to the Government in Logistics planning and coordination, warehouse management and contingency planning.

UNFPA distributed, in coordination with local authorities, community leaders and the National Police, 22,000 hygiene family kits in San Felix, Chiriquí.

UNHCR, through its main counterpart in Darien, the Vicarage of the Darién, is coordinating a USD5,000 support to the communities in Jaqué, and Sambú; and will distribute non-perishable products.

IFRC allocated 380,500 Swiss francs from its Disaster Relief Emergency Fund to respond to the most urgent needs and launched an emergency appeal for US\$572,000 to support the Costa Rica and Panamá Red Cross societies to respond to the flooding affecting several parts of both countries. This operation will assist approximately 15,000 persons over the next nine months and will provide the affected communities with first aid, food supplies as well as relief items. Safe water tablets, mosquito nets, food, water, clothing, and hygiene kits have been dispatched and are being distributed to the affected families in both countries.

The two helicopters facilitated by OFDA to distribute goods in isolated areas, have completed their hours/mission.

UNDP/BCPR, will team up with FAO and UNEP for early recovery coordination. UNDP Track funds in the amount of US\$90,000 are available for damage assessment, an expert in recovery, and assistance for the coordination and rehabilitation.

The Spanish International Cooperation for the Development Agency (AECID) donated 14 tons of humanitarian supplies. The goods (blankets, mosquito nets, family kitchen kits, and hygienic family kit) were transported in trucks from their Logistics Center, in Panama city, to David's airport. AECID is monitoring the evolution of the emergency and in contact with Panamanian authorities to evaluate other possible emergency relief actions.

SUMMARY OF REPORTS BY AGENCIES (INCLUDING DAMAGE AND NEED ASSESSMENT, CHALLENGES AND DELIVERY OF AID):

A joint assessment mission comprised by experts from AECID, OCHA, OPS, SINAPROC and the National Red Cross was carried in the Colon Costa Abajo region in coordination with the local COE.

UNICEF deployed a regional Water and Sanitation expert to Changuinola on evaluation mission, which reported no major threats or pollution by agro-chemicals in the water systems. The major need is the cleaning of the latrines.

PAHO allocated the amount of USD \$36,226, to support the immediate response in health assistance, 5,000 blankets, logistics support staff for sanitary response, and has assisted the Ministry of Health in areas identified as priority: safe water, surveillance, and outbreak control. PAHO will provide two chlorine plants and is currently assisting in the design of a water distribution system from Changuinola to Chiriquí Grande, for the distribution of chlorine to the indigenous regions and municipalities within the affected area. With this, improvement of the water treatment conditions and the quality of the water for human consumption in the zone is expected.

An UNDAC team has been working with national authorities and humanitarian actors in

Chiriquí, Changuinola, and at the National COE, in Panama City. The OCHA ROLAC Office has been providing coordination support to the UNCT and the UNETT.

Challenges

Some of the affected communities are isolated and located in difficult to reach areas (only by plane or helicopters), which has complicated the distribution of relief goods.

An important number of wells are still contaminated, thus, the quality of water for consumption is still not recommendable in some areas in some areas.

Access roads are not a 100% safe, slowing down the recovery and assistance processes.
