

HIGHLIGHTS

- **271 residents** living in the site of Alexandria as of October 2nd
- **89 new arrivals** were received throughout September from Chios, Lesvos and Leros islands as well as from Evros border crossing
- All welcomed and briefed about services and amenities and provided with food and non-food items by NRC
- **8 spontaneous departures**, **44** under the accommodation scheme, **17** under the family reunification, **1** under relocation
- The Deputy Minister of Migration Policy visited the site early September and praised it as a dignified and very well maintained camp for asylum seekers
- PRAKSIS started again providing protection services. They have daily presence on site with one roving team which identifies all the cases that are in need of PSS. To avoid any duplications, tasks were shared among PRAKSIS and IRC who also do PSS
- The medical team of St. Elizabeth University is phasing out at the end of October and will be replaced by another health actor which has not yet been finalized
- NRC distributed diapers, baby wipes and other hygiene items twice during September
- NRC organized and conducted a day trip to Ag. Nikolaos Naoussa for the whole camp population

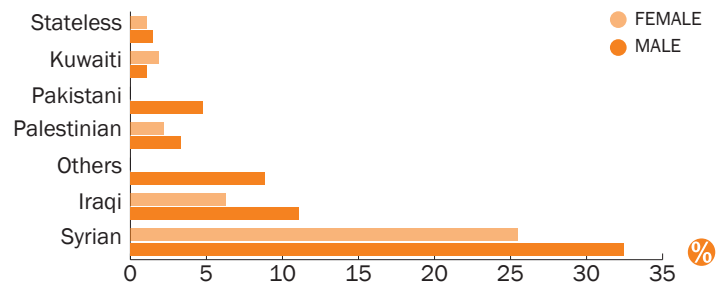

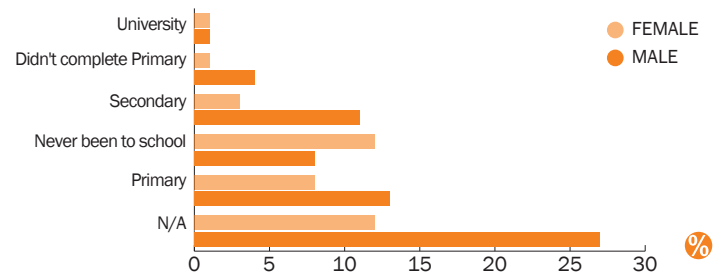

EDUCATION BACKGROUND



ALEXANDRIA SITE is located in Central Macedonia in the north of Greece, approximately 0.5km from Alexandria town and 500 km from Thessaloniki city. The site is a former Greek Air Force air base, and began serving as a Hospitality Centre for asylum seekers in April 2016. The site is managed by the Greek Air Force, with support from NRC. The Ministries of Health and Education have representatives working on site. Accommodation is provided in isobox containers, each of which is equipped with an air conditioning unit, fridge and cooking stove. Data are collected periodically, with frequent updates for new arrivals/births and departures.
