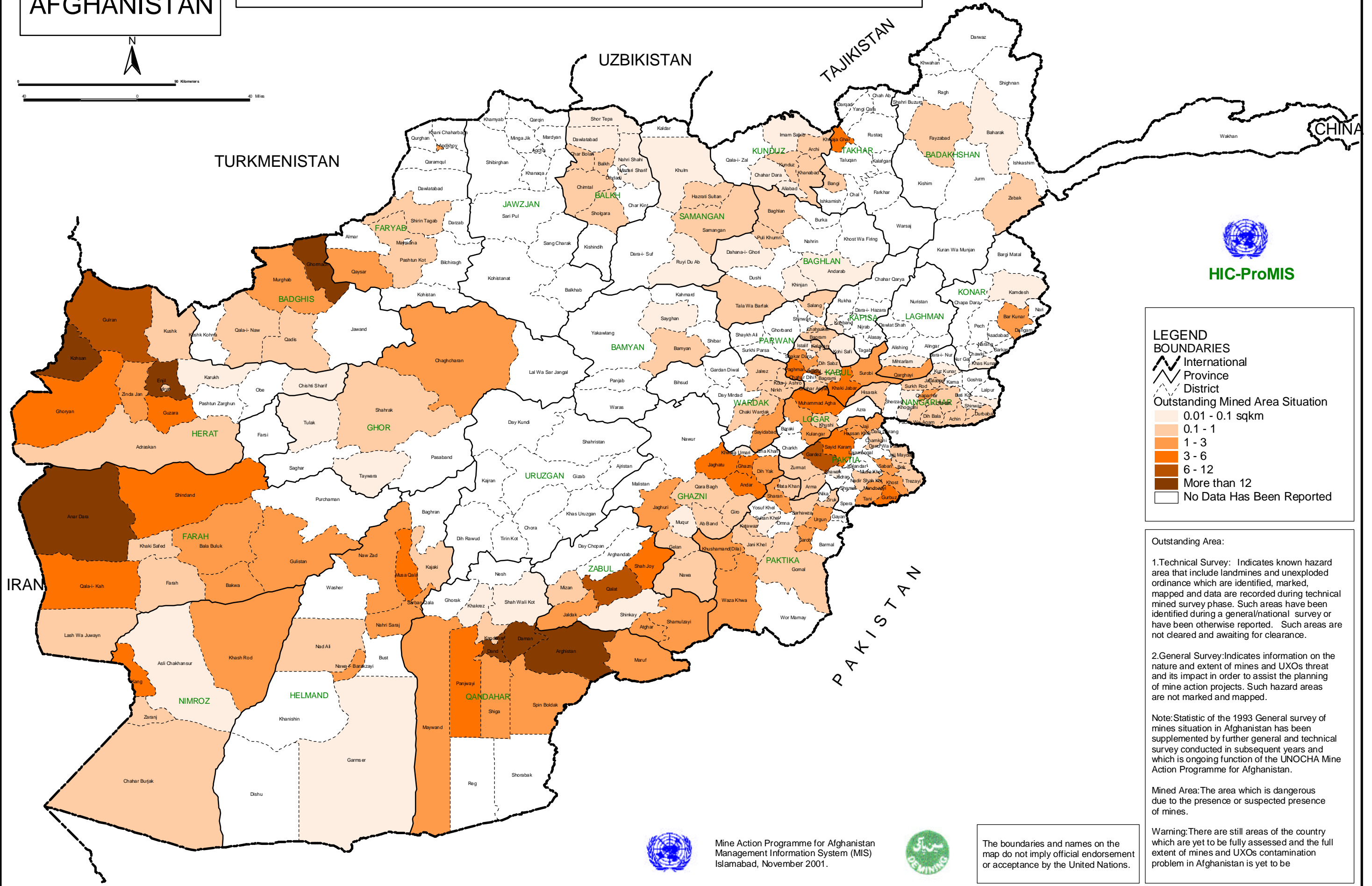


# AFGHANISTAN

### Outstanding Area:

1. Technical Survey: Indicates known hazard area that include landmines and unexploded ordnance which are identified, marked, mapped and data are recorded during technical mined survey phase. Such areas have been identified during a general/national survey or have been otherwise reported. Such areas are not cleared and awaiting for clearance.

2. General Survey: Indicates information on the nature and extent of mines and UXOs threat and its impact in order to assist the planning of mine action projects. Such hazard areas are not marked and mapped.

Note: Statistic of the 1993 General survey of mines situation in Afghanistan has been supplemented by further general and technical survey conducted in subsequent years and which is ongoing function of the UNOCHA Mine Action Programme for Afghanistan.

Mined Area: The area which is dangerous due to the presence or suspected presence of mines.

Warning: There are still areas of the country which are yet to be fully assessed and the full extent of mines and UXOs contamination problem in Afghanistan is yet to be
