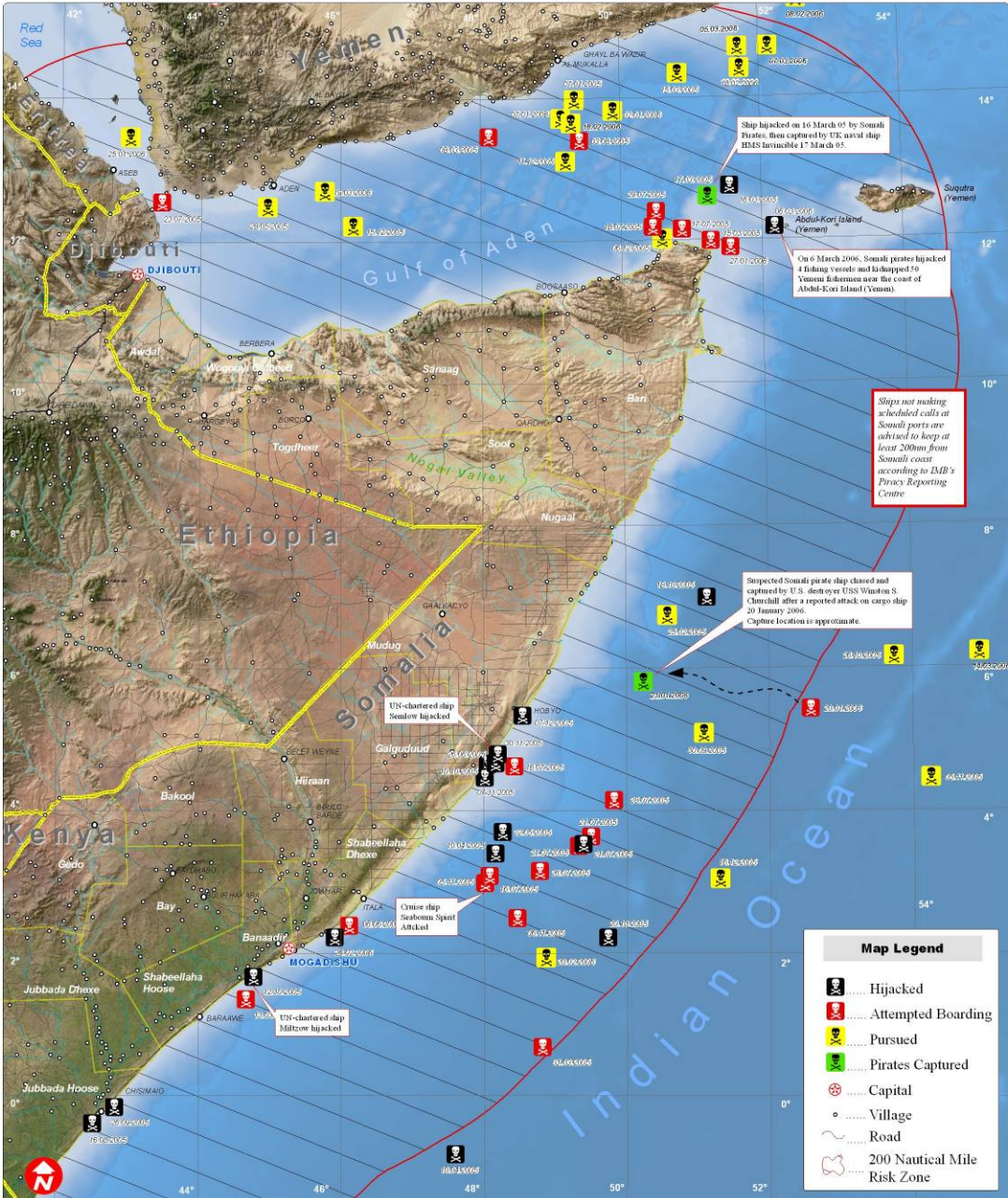


Reported Incidents of Pirate Attacks & Hijackings off the Coast of Somalia

January 2005 - March 2006

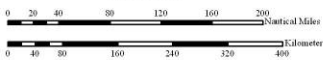

This map illustrates the reported cases of attacks and hijackings of ships by pirates off the coast of Somalia from January 2005 to March 2006. The incidents have been classified into four basic types: "Hijacked" where pirates have taken control of the ship, "Attempted Boarding" when pirates have deployed weapons and attempted to board a ship but were not successful, "Pursued" when a ship was followed or chased by pirates, and "Pirates captured" when pirates have been arrested by the naval forces of a government. All incident data provided by the International Maritime Bureau (IMB) Piracy Reporting Center and the NGA Anti-Shipping Activity Message (ASAM) service.
