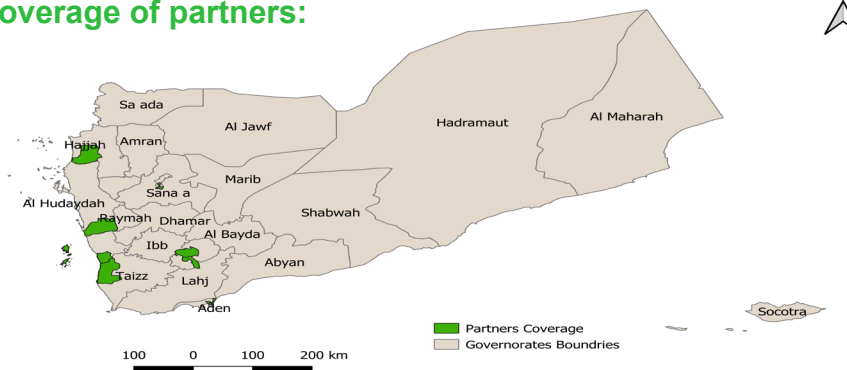


Cash Consortium of Yemen (CCY) - Remittances Tracker - May 2021

Key findings:

- Countries keeps restricting travel as new variants of the COVID-19 virus are appearing around the world, causing instability for global trade.
- Less than a third of the shops (13 out of 48) indicated an increase in the number of remittances in the past two weeks.
- Taizz and Sana'a City have the largest number of exchange shops that have not returned to pre-COVID levels of remittances.
- Aden, Lahij and Al Dhale'e have the largest number of exchange shops that have returned to the pre-COVID levels of remittances.
- (35 out of 48) shops stated the remittances have returned to pre-COVID level

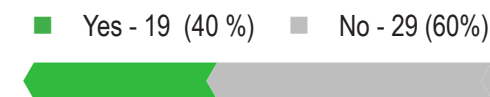
Coverage of partners:



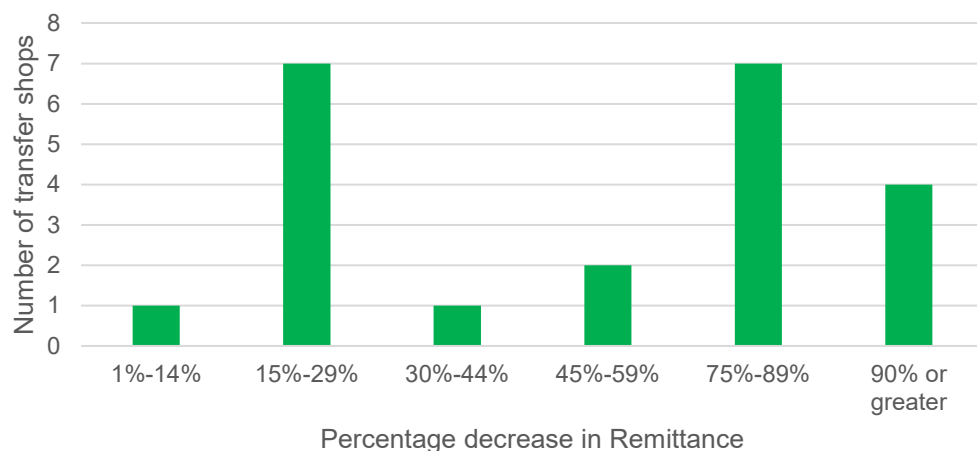
Has COVID-19 affected foreign remittances since March 2020? Yes - 22 (46%) No - 26 (54%)



Has the percentage of remittances changed in the past two weeks? Yes - 19 (40%) No - 29 (60%)

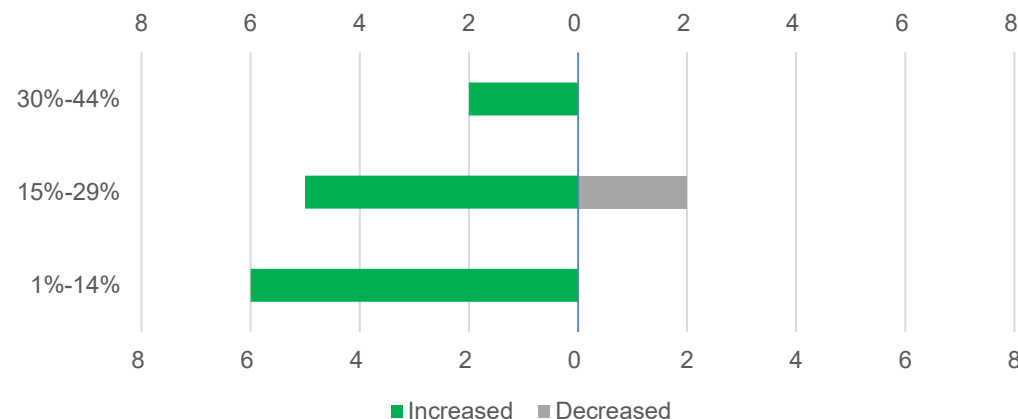


Percentage decrease in remittances from COVID-19



Of the 22 exchange shops who stated that COVID-19 has affected remittances from March 2020, all exchange shops stated that remittances decreased.

Percentage of decrease or increase in remittances in past two weeks



Of the 19 exchange shops who stated that remittances have changed in the past two weeks, 13 exchange shops indicated increased, while 2 indicated decreased, and 4 indicated stayed the same. The shops were concentrated in the governorates of Sana'a City, Taizz, Al Hudaydah, Aden, Lahij and Hajjah
