


COVID-19 cases in Uzbekistan


EPIDEMIOLOGICAL UPDATE



This chart shows the daily increase in confirmed new cases, as well as a 5-day moving average which helps smooth out the 'noise' from short-term fluctuations by averaging the data from the last five days reported.

Latest National COVID-19 Response News

- As of 3 February, **955 patients are being treated** in medical institutions, of whom **153 are in serious condition and 29 are in critical condition** (MoH on coronavirus.uz and via Public Relations Dept).
- **President issues instructions for vaccine readiness.** Shavkat Mirziyoyev gave instructions to determine priority population groups and to prepare vaccination departments and mobile teams. Over 3,000 vaccination departments in family polyclinics and rural medical centers are to be set up (gazeta.uz).

HEALTH RESPONSE

Health Capacity-Building

- WHO Country Office continues working on the improvement of **surveillance indicators for COVID-19**, including a reporting system for a regional platform.

- From 9 to 11 February, **WHO** and the Ministry of Health conducted trainings for medical staff on **'Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) in the provision of medical care to people with suspected COVID-19'**. Over **180 participants** joined the training to improve their knowledge on the main IPC components and measures to be followed in health care settings.
- On 10 February, **WHO** Regional Office organized a seminar on **'The immune response to viral infections and SARS-VOV-2'**. The seminar covered the innate and adaptive immune response phases and what is currently known about the immune response to SARS-CoV-2, re-infection, variants and immunity through vaccination.

Vaccine

- The COVAX Interim Distribution Forecast as of 3 February foresees a delivery of **2,600,000 AstraZeneca vaccine doses** for Uzbekistan, **30%** of which will be arriving in the country as early as **end of February**.

ADDITIONAL RESPONSE PRIORITIES

Risk Communication and Community Engagement

- On 16 February, **WHO** Regional Office will organize a webinar on **'10 steps of community readiness - What countries should do to prepare communities for a COVID-19 vaccine, treatment or new test'**. The webinar will explore ten well established Risk Communication and Community Engagement principles and practical tools, in order to place communities at the heart of the roll-out of new vaccines, treatments and tests.

Socio-Economic Mitigation

- With funding from the Japanese Government and within the framework of the **UNDP** Integrated Business Support Initiative, **43 people** from small enterprises in the Jizzakh, Kashkadarya, Surkhandarya, Navoiy, Namangan and Andijan regions took part in **20 trainings and coaching sessions**. This improved their marketing, finance, business optimization, and soft skills. The **best 29 proposals will receive equipment** to scale up their businesses.

- By the end of 2020 **UNDP** and the Chamber of Industry and Commerce, with funding from the Japanese Government, held **3,333 hotline consultations and 61 online webinars**. As a results, **representatives of 2,570 small businesses enriched their knowledge on business practices**. The related Telegram channel which offers consultations for small businesses now has 4,500 subscribers.
