In response to the action plan and humanitarian support of Fundación Abba Colombia for the different affected areas, AbbaCol humanitarian team has carried out a preliminary analysis of the effects by department and the assistance required in these places where the aid is currently being implemented.

## **GRAPH 2: Data and information on how it is affected:**

Kits for distribution and points affected: The aid required is specified by department and aid required.

Assistance required.

health kits: with basic necessities.

Food kits: canned food and basic necessities.

Protection and clothing kits: medical attention is required for families and the affected population. Due to the COVID19 it is necessary to follow biosecurity protocols imposed by the national government, AbbaCol humanitarian team complies with these protocols. Early recovery is also included in humanitarian assistance, focusing on the reconstruction of homes and other affected areas. Finally, humanitarian assistance is required to focus on psychosocial and emotional support to the population that has lost their homes, etc.

Children and adolescents: between 0-17 years.

Men: between 18-65 years old


Women: between 18-65 years old

### GRAPH 3: COVID19 HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE IN COLOMBIA


200 Families benefited from Abba Colombia medical day; with the help of national entities AbbaCol lead a medical day where families of Sutatausa, Cundinamarca benefited.

1000 where reached with our humanitarian response during COVID19 in 2020.

1000 families benefited from our psychosocial and emotional support given by our volunteers and our team.

500 messages in different media have been distributed about the importance of hygiene and health during the time of covid19 – mostly in social media: Facebook, twitter, Instagram, WhatsApp, national radio and other sources.

500 sanitary kits where distributed: inside the kits: towels, shampoo, soap, brush teeth, toothpaste, women sanitary pads, baby cream, toilet paper.

During the Christmas season Abba Colombia continue the humanitarian response.

50 Blankets distributed to elderly people affected by winter wave in Colombia.

2000 families positive affected by our response.



(The following is a summary of the aims and objectives of the intervention in 2020, this will continue in 2021).

# Description for the intervention

---

Due to the current winter wave in the country caused by the two hurricanes ETA and IOTA and the phenomenon of the girl child "Fenomeno de la niña, also due to the health emergency of the covid19, Fundación Abba Colombia has developed a humanitarian response plan in line with the national action plan to help those affected who are in a vulnerable state due to this winter wave during the covid19. This plan will also cover families affected by the pandemic. The programme has its focal point in the city of Bogotá DC and its most affected focal points. Giving priority to families that have been affected by the winter wave and covid19. The programme has given priority to the following population: children and adolescents, women and families in emergency situations, being this population victims of the armed conflict in Colombia and migrants.

Purpose 1: Creation of community and volunteer networks for the distribution of health kits (which will include basic hygiene items), distribution of food kits (which will include basic non-perishable food), distribution of personal protection kits (which will include precautionary items in natural disasters), distribution of clothing items (which will include clothing items, blankets and others).

Purpose 2: Fundación Abba Colombia team together with the competent national authorities in focal points will generate an immediate support and a priority response of humanitarian and health assistance to the families that are in a vulnerable state due to the winter wave and covid19.

Purpose 3: Fundación Abba Colombia will call for the incorporation of doctors and staff

This appeal will be made within the affected communities, focusing on adequate medical assistance for children and adolescents, the elderly, people with disabilities, women and men who have suffered from the winter wave, following the guidelines of the national health system, especially during the covid19 in the different affected areas.

Purpose 4: Dissemination of messages in different media with recommendations, precautions for personal and health protection during the winter wave highlighting the biosecurity guidelines of the covid19; dissemination of messages and awareness raising including MHPSS. Inclusion of humanitarian support due to COVID19: this programme will cover families that have also been affected by the pandemic. AbbaCol will continue the work of medical days that it has been carrying out during

COVID19 with extension and prioritizing the focal points affected by the winter wave mentioned above, following the guidelines of the national plan to give an effective priority response.

Purpose 5: To cover vulnerable populations that are victims of the armed conflict in Colombia and at the same time migrants who have been affected.

## **Inclusion for intervention**

---

- It analyses and seeks to address protection risks, including risks faced by people who are generally more vulnerable
- The aim is to guarantee the sustainability of the interventions
- Approximate # of population benefited: 2000 families
- It seeks to prioritise humanitarian aid to the population that is victim of the armed conflict in Colombia and to migrants.

## **Progress in the intervention and achievements**

---

- Food and health kits have been distributed to over 2000 families
- Families of victims of the armed conflict and migrants in Colombia have been reached
- Continuity planned for 2021

## **Goals to be achieved and reached**

---

- Reaching more families so they can receive humanitarian aid
- To raise funds for the purchase of health kits, food and other basic necessities
- Recruit qualified staff for humanitarian support
