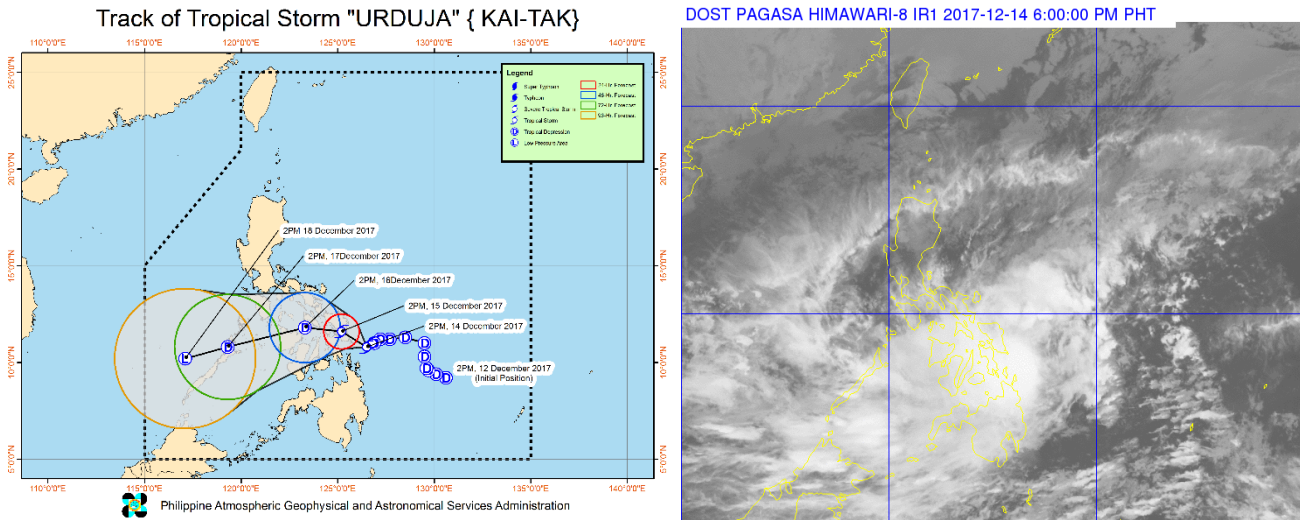


DSWD DROMIC Preparedness for Response Report #2 on Tropical Storm “URDUJA” as of 14 December 2017, 8PM

Situation Overview



TROPICAL STORM "URDUJA" INCREASES ITS THREAT IN SAMAR PROVINCES.

- Expected to make landfall over Eastern Samar tomorrow morning.
- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 400 km diameter of the Tropical Storm.
- Scattered to widespread rains is expected over Visayas and the regions of Bicol, Caraga and Northern Mindanao within 24 hours. Residents in these areas are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the eastern seaboard of Bicol Region and in the seaboard of Visayas due to rough to very rough seas associated with the approaching Tropical Storm.

Location of eye/center:	At 4:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Storm "URDUJA" was estimated based on all available data at 85 km East Southeast of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.7 °N, 126.4 °E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 65 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 90 kph
Forecast Movement:	Forecast to move West at 7 kph

Predictive Analytics for Humanitarian Response

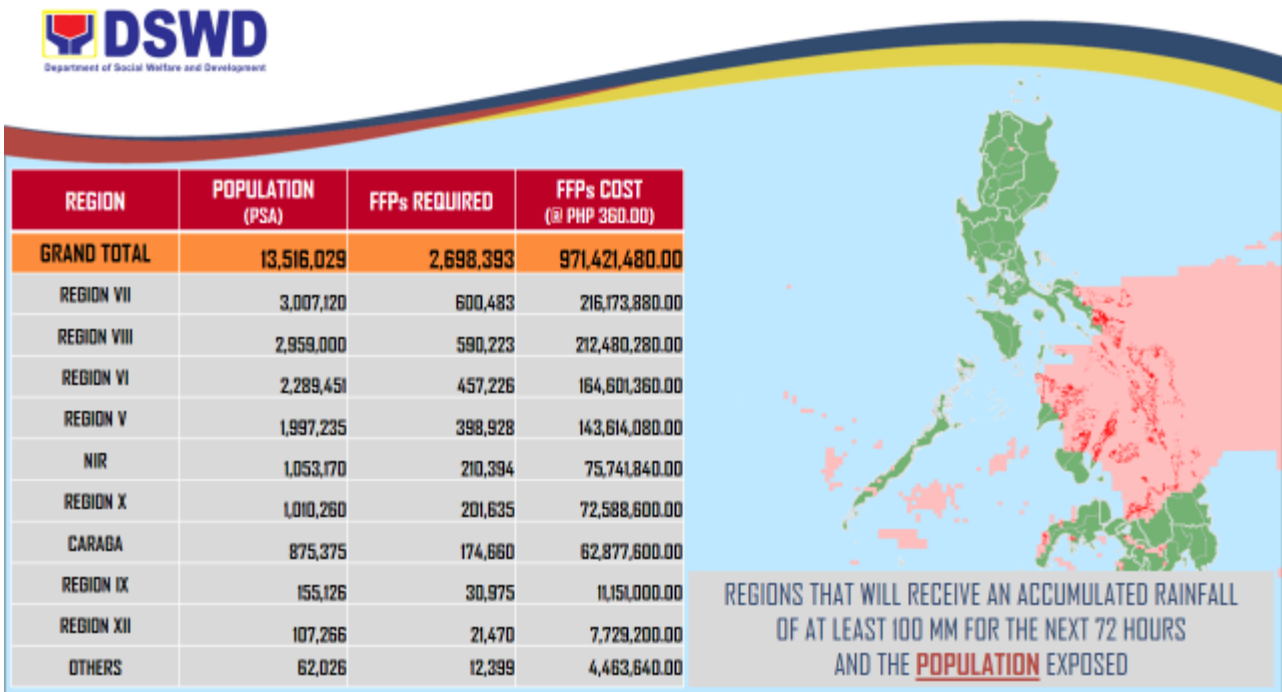


Figure 2. Exposed Poor Families (DSWD), Required FFPs, and Cost

Based on the GSM and WRF data of PAGASA initialized on 13 December 2017, 2AM, the DSWD Predictive Analytics for Humanitarian Response results show **2,698,393 families** (see Figure 1) exposed to high susceptibility of flooding and rain-induced landslide in the next 72 hours; of which, **867,833 families are poor** (see Figure 2).

Figure 1. Exposed Population (PSA), Required FFPs, and Cost

Status of Prepositioned Resources: Stockpiles and Standby Funds

The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to **₱762,432,382.75** (see Table 3) with breakdown as follows:

a. Stockpiles

A total of **368,684 Family Food Packs (FFPs)** (see Table 4) amounting to **₱123,023,249.30** and available **Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)** amounting to **₱393,500,972.83**.

b. Standby Funds

A total of **₱245,908,160.62** standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **₱199,863,131.43** is the available Quick Response Fund in the CO.

Residents were cautioned over possible flooding and rain-induced landslides that Urduja could bring. • Fisherfolks were already advised to refrain from venturing out due to moderate to rough seas. • Classes in elementary and high school in a few areas in Northern Cebu has already been suspended this afternoon.

13 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Earlier today, RDRRMC-7 called for an Emergency Response Preparedness meeting relative to the impending threat which will bring moderate to heavy rainfall that will result into flashfloods and rain-induced landslides. PAGASA Mactan presented the weather forecast for Central Visayas and the conditions and impacts relating to it. DSWD-7 DRRM Focal Ms. Sheba S. Dabon, updated the plenary of the latest stockpile status of the region including LGUs with prepositioned goods. OCD-7 will be issuing an advisory later today with regards to the current weather developments including gale warnings and recommendations for the suspension of classes. As of the moment, scattered rain showers are experienced in the region.
