

## DSWD DROMIC Report #11 on Tropical Depression “AGATON” as of 12 January 2018, 6PM

### Situation Overview

On 01 January 2018, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) east southeast of Surigao City has developed into a Tropical Depression and was named "Agaton". Which heavily affected the Regions of MIMAROPA, Region VI, Region VII, Region VIII and CARAGA.

### Status of Affected Families / Persons

**18,513 families** or **83,772 persons** are affected in **267 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII, X, and CARAGA** (see Table 1; details are in Annex A).
