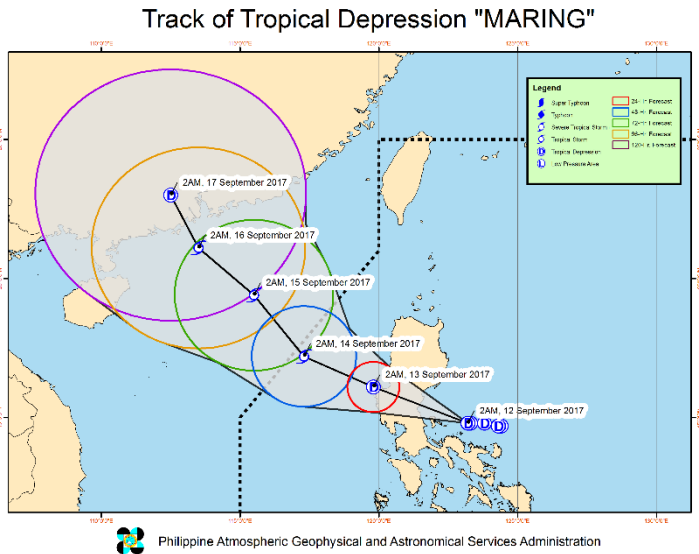


DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on Tropical Depression “Maring” as of 12 September 2017, 4PM

Situation Overview



- Moderate to heavy rains will be experienced over Metro Manila, Central Luzon, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA and Pangasinan due to TD "Maring". Residents of these areas are alerted against possible landslide and flashfloods.
- Sea travel is risky over the seaboard of Mindoro and the eastern seaboard of Aurora, Quezon, and Bicol region.
- Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal over Camarines Sur is now lifted.

4. Status of Prepositioned Resources: Stockpiles and Standby Funds

The DSWD Central Office (CO), concerned Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to **₱836,623,830.73** (see Table 4) with breakdown as follows:

a. Stockpiles

A total of **196,896 Family Food Packs (FFPs)** (see Table 5) amounting to **₱72,623,951.49** and available **Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)** amounting to **₱186,227,538.30**.

b. Standby Funds

A total of **₱577,772,340.94** standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **₱555,110,259.05** is the available Quick Response Fund in the CO.

| 11 September 2017 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The DSWD-FO NCR alerted and activated the Region's Quick Response Team (QRT) Leaders (Monday to Sunday Team) on the eventualities and immediately prepare/inform their team members. • The DSWD-FO NCR coordinated with Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA), Office of Civil Defense - National Capital Region (OCD-NCR) and DOST-PAGASA for advisories and updates on the tropical cyclone. • The DSWD-FO NCR coordinated with LGUs for possible provision of augmentation support and status of possible evacuation centers for the families. |

| 12 September 2017 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The DSWD-FO CALABARZON informed and coordinated with the member agencies of the Response Cluster of the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council to be on standby alert status and ready for mobilization for possible effects of TY Lannie and TD Maring in the region. • The DSWD-FO CALABARZON activated its Disaster Management Unit for Disaster Duty to monitor any untoward incidents and/or emergencies. • The DSWD-FO CALABARZON through the Disaster Management Unit is closely coordinating with RDRRMC IV-A Secretariat for updates and developments in the Region in connection with TY Lannie and TD Maring. • The DSWD-FO CALABARZON through the Disaster Management Unit is closely coordinating with Provincial/City/Municipal Social Welfare and Development Offices and SWAD Teams for significant updates on their preparedness levels and any untoward incidents. • The DSWD-FO CALABARZON advised MSWDOs to conduct pre-emptive evacuation in any possible occurrence of flooding and landslide in the region. • Two individuals are dead due to a landslide in Sitio Hapay na Mangga, Brgy. Dolores, Taytay, Rizal and were identified as beneficiaries of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino. There are also 2 injured individuals which currently are being treated in the nearby hospital. |
