

## DSWD DROMIC Report #25 on SEVERE TROPICAL STORM "VINTA" (TEMBIN) as of 06 January 2018, 6PM

### Situation Overview

On 22 December 2017, the monitored Low Pressure Area east of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur has developed into a Severe Tropical Storm and was named "Vinta" (international name: Tembin). It exited Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on 24 December 2017.

### Status of Affected Families / Persons

**165,392 families** or **780,440 persons** are affected in **1,153 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, VII, IX, X, XI, XII, CARAGA, and ARMM** (see Table 1; details in Annex A).
