

DSWD DROMIC Report #27 on SEVERE TROPICAL STORM "VINTA" (TEMBIN) as of 12 January 2018, 8PM

Situation Overview

On 22 December 2017, the monitored Low Pressure Area east of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur has developed into a Severe Tropical Storm and was named "Vinta" (international name: Tembin). It exited Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on 24 December 2017.

Status of Affected Families / Persons

167,368 families or **789,502 persons** are affected in **1,181 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, VII, IX, X, XI, XII, CARAGA, and ARMM** (see Table 1; details in Annex A).

Provincial/Municipal Disaster Quick Response Team were in Barangay Mangsee, Balabac to conduct master listing and validation of the list of reported damaged houses.
25 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> DSWD-FO MIMAROPA has provided augmentation and released family food packs to affected municipalities and isolated islands.
24 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Residents were advised to take appropriate actions against possible occurrence of flash flood and landslides. Sea travel remained risky over the southern seaboard of Mindoro Provinces. National roads and bridges in MIMAROPA were passable to all types of vehicles.
23 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> DSWD-FO MIMAROPA ensured availability of on-call truck to deliver goods to the affected areas due to the TS Vinta. DSWD-FO MIMAROPA ensured availability of relief goods both food and non-food items (FNIs) ready at any given time. Skeletal duty teams are available to render duty even during holidays. DSWD-FO MIMAROPA closely coordinated with partner agencies and concerned LGUs for updates and provision of situational awareness for the effects of Tropical Storm VINTA in the provinces of the region particularly in southern Palawan.
20 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Alerted all P/C/M Quick Response Teams in five (5) provinces of MIMAROPA to regularly monitor the situations in their areas. RDRRMC through the OCD also issued a memorandum for all local chief executives and local disaster risk reduction and management focals to continuously monitor area and issue regular weather bulletins to residents and other stakeholders, conduct PDRA, alert emergency responders for possible deployment, and conduct pre-emptive evacuation to flood and landslide prone areas. PDRRMOs convened and instructed LGUs to be on heightened alert and monitor areas highly prone to floods and landslides. SWAD Operation Centers are ready; field staff were on alert for any eventualities. DSWD-FO VII Quick Response Team was activated on 13 December 2017 and was on standby for any support and augmentation needed.

The IDPs requested for blankets and ready-to-eat food. In Baloi, Lanao del Norte, 99 Marawi IDPs of Balono Evacuation Center were temporarily transferred to Baloi Central School due to damaged tents as a result of strong winds. Damaged roof and flooding in Momongon Learning Center resulted to the transfer of 35 IDPs to Pacalundo Elementary School. 15 families staying in tents at Abdulhamid EC were transferred to the Abdulhamid Madrasah for safety. A total of 30 tents were damaged due to heavy winds and rains. In Pantar, Lanao del Norte, there were three (3) damaged tents reported and the IDPs were secured inside the multi-purpose hall within the Pantar Tent City. The QRT of DSWD Field Office 10 continues to monitor and closely coordinate with local disaster risk reduction management council throughout Northern Mindanao.
22 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CDRRMC of Cagayan de Oro City issued at 9:30pm a Hydromet Evacuation Protocol, raising the code from yellow to Code Orange given the development of TS Vinta and the 1.91-meter high tide at 12AM, December 22, 2017.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> As for Misamis Oriental Province, the provincial government implemented the preventive evacuation of residents living in flood-prone villages in the towns of Jasaan, Lagonlong, Claveria and Binuangan.
