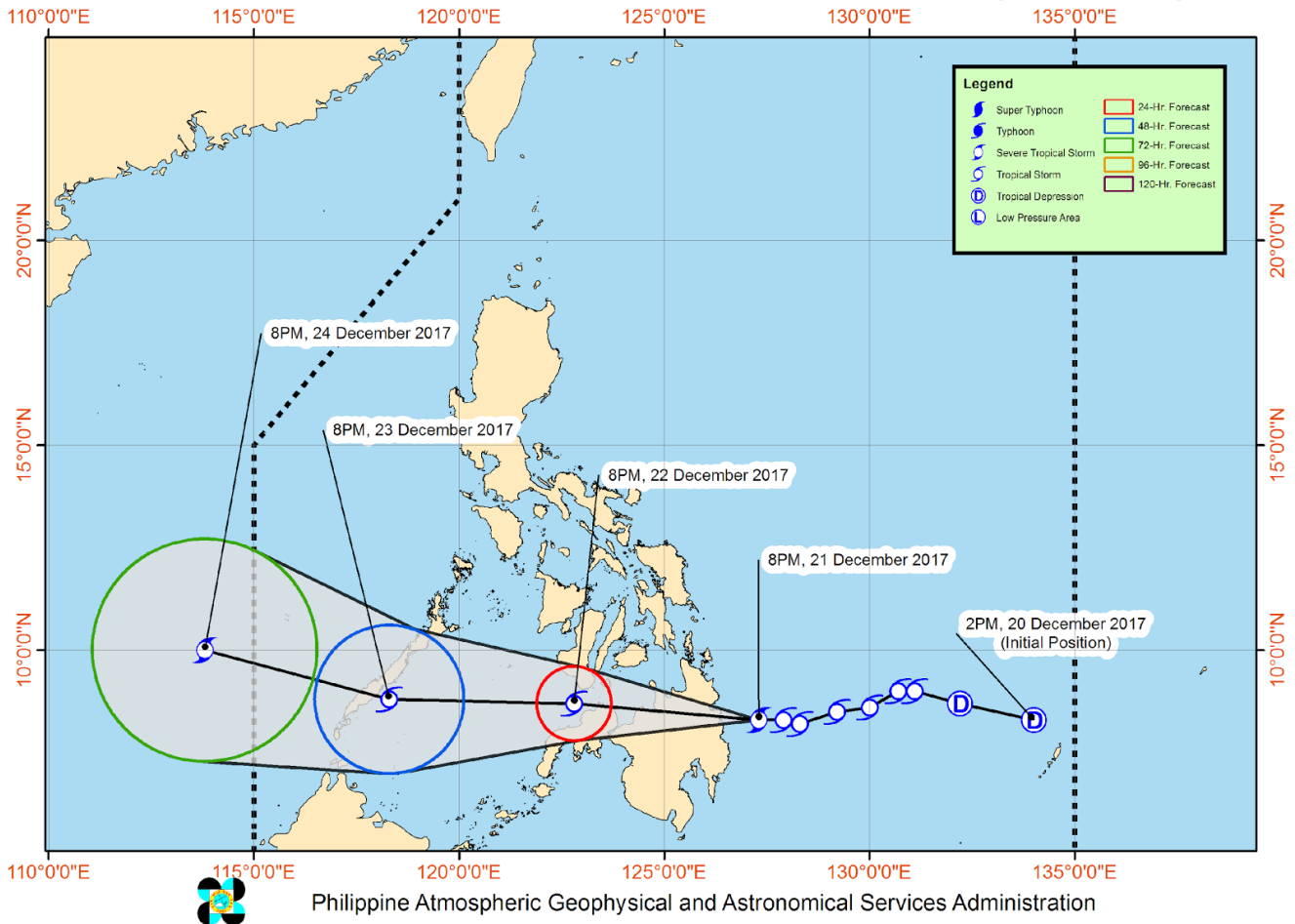


DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on Severe Tropical Storm "VINTA" (TEMBIN) as of 22 December 2017, 2AM

Situation Overview

Track of Severe Tropical Storm "VINTA" {TEMBIN}



Issued at 11:00 PM today, "Vinta" has intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm and is about to make landfall in Surigao Del Sur.

- Scattered to widespread moderate to heavy rains will prevail over Visayas, Caraga, Davao Region, Northern Mindanao, Zamboanga Peninsula, Lanao del Sur, Maguindanao and North Cotabato within 24 hours. Residents of these areas must make appropriate actions against flooding and landslides, coordinate with their respective local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates.
- Sea travel remains risky over the seaboard of areas under Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS).
- Expected to make landfall over Surigao del Sur this midnight.

Status of Affected Families / Persons

3,278 families or **50,894 persons** are affected in **43 barangays** in **Regions X, XI, CARAGA** (see Table 1).

20 December 2017 - present	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DReAMB is on standby for monitoring reports related to Tropical Depression "VINTA". DSWD-FO MIMAROPA

DATE	ACTION(S) TAKEN
20 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Alerted all P/C/M Quick Response Teams in five (5) provinces of MIMAROPA to regularly monitor the situations in their areas. All members of R/P/C/M QRTs were on-call status and standby to be on duty if needed. Advised our P/MQRTs to coordinate with concerned LGUs to report any unusual eventualities in their respective areas and take appropriate actions. Closed coordination with the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) for any warning signal updates for monitoring purposes and response mechanism for areas that will be affected.

DSWD-FO VII

DATE	ACTION(S) TAKEN
21 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Philippine Coast Guard cancelled all trips to and from the affected provinces in Central Visayas due to the tropical cyclone warning signal raised by PAGASA. Trips are suspended until tomorrow, 22 December 2017, or until warning will be lifted. OCD-7 Operations Center raised alert level from Blue to Red effective 8AM today. RDRRMC through the OCD also issued a memorandum for all local chief executives and local disaster risk reduction and management focals to continuously monitor area and issue regular weather bulletins to residents and other stakeholders, conduct PDRA, alert emergency responders for possible deployment, and conduct pre-emptive evacuation to flood and landslide prone areas. PDRRMOs have already convened and instructed LGUs to be on heightened alert and monitor areas highly prone to floods and landslides. SWAD Operation Centers are ready. Field staff are on alert for any eventualities. Bohol SWAD Team Leader reported that there are staff who are at the warehouse repacking relief goods to increase number of available goods for augmentation if the need arises. DSWD-FO VII will continue to keep track and monitor on the current weather disturbance. Also, assessment of the situation in the field in close coordination with the different PATs, P/C/MLs, SWADs, SWO 3 TLs, and the various MAT members for any incidents and effects. DSWD-FO VII Quick Response Team was activated on 13 December 2017 and is on standby for any support and augmentation needed.
20 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Continued monitoring and dissemination of weather updates to the regional and provincial staff through PAGASA and PHIVOLCS bulletins issued on the

	agencies' websites <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Actively participated and attended the Emergency Response Preparedness (ERP) meetings convened by the RDRRMC / OCD-7 • Continued communication and close coordination with the local DRRM and SWO through the various C/MATs assigned in the field • Continued manual repacking of FFPs to replenish the goods shipped to Biliran in Region VIII.

20 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensured availability of FNIs and coordinated with DSWD-CO for replenishment of funds to maintain 3M standby funds. • The DSWD-FO IX continued repacking FFPs to maintain the required 15,000 FFPs minimum; likewise, prepositioned FFPs in its satellite offices. • DSWD-FO IX DRU prepared and disseminated a memo on preparedness response to officially inform its SWAD Team Leaders to monitor the situation in their AOR. • The QRTs of the Region were on standby for any flashflood incident. • The DSWD-FO IX DRU and DROMIC focals attended the PDRA convened by OCD in the region.

22 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A total of 346 families or 1, 307 individuals have evacuated to different evacuation centers opened by local disaster risk reduction management offices in the provinces of Bukidnon and Misamis Oriental. • Of this number, Misamis Oriental has 316 families or 1,187 individuals coming from Cagayan de Oro City (97 families or 371 individuals); El Salvador (80 families or 272 individuals); Lagonglong (113 families or 440 individuals); Gingoog City (21 families or 84 individuals; and Claveria (five families or 20 individuals). • Bukidnon province, particularly in Pangantucan town has 30 families or 120 individuals evacuated. • A total of 11 evacuation centers throughout Northern Mindanao have been opened to cater to the 346 families or 1,307 individuals. Pangantucan, Bukidnon has one evacuation center housing the evacuees; Cagayan de Oro City has four evacuation centers; El Salvador has one; Lagonglong has two; Gingoog City has two; and Claveria has one operating. • Per report from the City Social Welfare and Development Office of Cagayan de Oro City, on-going evacuation of families living near Cagayan de Oro River and other low-lying and identified flood-prone areas. • 150 Evacuation Centers (ECs) in Cagayan de Oro City were earlier opened all over the city (Primary and Secondary ECs), but 10 ECs are located at flood-prone areas, thus residents on those sites are advised to go directly to the Secondary ECs. • CDRRMC of Cagayan de Oro City issued at 9:30pm a Hydromet Evacuation Protocol, raising the code from yellow to Code Orange given the development of TS Vinta and the 1.91-meter high tide at 12AM, December 22, 2017. • By Code Orange, it means CDRMD declares "GET SET" status for residents of concerned barangays and pre-emptive evacuation for vulnerable sectors (children, elderly, pregnant women, lactating women, PWDs, the sick and the elderly) is in effect. • As for Misamis Oriental Province, the provincial government are implementing the preventive evacuation of residents living in flood-prone villages in the towns of Jasaan, Lagonlong, Claveria and Binuangan.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The QRT of DSWD Field Office 10 continues to monitor and closely coordinate with local disaster risk reduction management council throughout Northern Mindanao. The Iligan Operation Center has issued directive to all Camp Managers to monitor situation of evacuation camps occupied by IDPs of the Marawi siege 24/7.
21 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> DSWD-FO X activated the Quick Response Team to monitor and update the possible effects of TS Vinta. Respective SWADT Leaders are on standby in coordination with the P/C/LDRRMO.

22 December 2017	<p>Source of information: MDRRMO Baganga, Davao Oriental</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Based on the latest partial and unofficial report from the MDRRMO in Baganga, a combined total of 350 families are currently staying in both of the Evacuation Centers in the relocation sites of Brgy. Campawan and Brgy. Labajon while there are more than 400 families who have already entered in the Evacuation Center in the relocation site of Brgy. Saoquigue as of now. Another 400 families from Brgy. Baculin have also admitted themselves inside the Baculin Elementary School plus additional 3 families are currently staying in the Lucod Elementary School in Barangay Lucod. The Camp Managers are still conducting interviews to sort out the exact number of families per Evacuation Center
21 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> DSWD-FO XI activated the Quick Response Team including the Camp Management Team with updated list indicating the designation/position and area assignment of each staff, and contact numbers for easy communication and coordination of response actions to be undertaken.

21 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> DSWD-FO XII and its DRRMS staff are directed to monitor the situation in the areas of Regions XII and ARMM, the Quick Response Team members is on-call while the DRRMS staff, RP vehicles and drivers are on 24/7 duty or on standby to immediately response to any disaster incident that may occur.

DATE	ACTION(S) TAKEN
22 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Three provinces, namely: Agusan del Norte, Surigao del Sur and Province of Dinagat Islands have been affected by TS Vinta covering eight (8) municipalities and thirteen (13) barangays. A total of sixteen (16) evacuation centers are activated (1 existing and 15 newly-opened) with 1,152 families and 5,581 persons affected. There are 101 stranded passengers in Surigao City (56 persons in Lipata Port and 45 persons in Macapagal Port) due to travel suspension. Nine (9) municipalities of Surigao del Sur experienced power interruption, namely: Tandag, Lianga, San Agustin, Marihatag, Cagwait, Bayabas, Tago, San Miguel and Cortes. The Regional Quick Response Team of DSWD FO Caraga is closely coordinating with the local QRTs for more updates.
21 December 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provinces of Surigao del Sur, Surigao del Norte, Agsan del Sur, and Agusan del Norte have already issued suspension of classes to pre-school, elementary, and high school while the province of Dinagat Islands has issued suspension of

	<p>classes from pre-school to elementary levels.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The municipality of Lingig, Surigao del Sur conducted a MDRRMC meeting and advised all barangay officials to take pre-emptive evacuation to the families living along coastal areas. ● DSWD-FO Caraga activated all Quick Response Teams (QRTS) from regional level down to the provincial level to monitor the situation in close coordination with the LSWDO and LDRRMO.
