

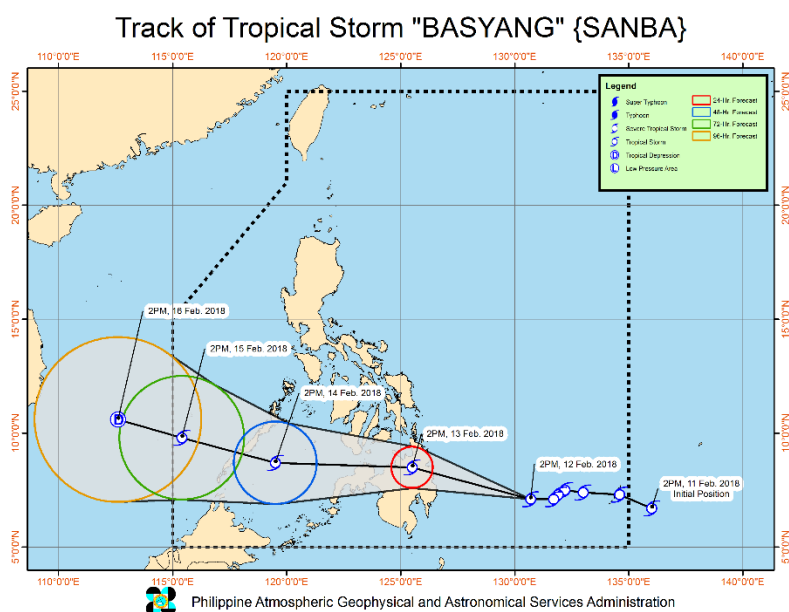
## DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on Tropical Storm “BASYANG” (I.N. SANBA)

as of 13 February 2018, 6AM

### Situation Overview

Issued at 5:00 am today: "basyang" continues its threat over caraga region.

- Scattered to widespread moderate to heavy rains will prevail in the next 24 hours over Visayas, Caraga, Northern Mindanao, Zamboanga Peninsula and the provinces of Davao del Norte, Davao Oriental, Compostela Valley, and Lanao del Sur. Meanwhile, scattered light to moderate with at times heavy rains is expected over Bicol Region, MIMAROPA, and the rest of Mindanao. Residents of these areas must continue monitoring for updates, take precautionary measures against possible flooding and landslides, and coordinate with their respective local disaster risk reduction and management offices.
- Expected to make landfall in Caraga Region this morning.
- Sea travel remains risky over the seaboard of areas under Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS), the seaboard of Northern Luzon and of Visayas, the eastern seaboard of Central Luzon, and the eastern and southern seaboard of Southern Luzon due to the approaching Tropical Storm and the surge of the Northeast Monsoon.



<b>Location of eye/center:</b>	At 4:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Storm "BASYANG" was estimated based on all available data at 175 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (08.1 °N, 127.9 °E)

13 February 2018	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Assigned a DReAMU staff to render duty at the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) tonight.</li> <li>Predetermined the task force who will render duty at the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) and Operation Center (OPCEN) for the succeeding days of Operations in TS "Basyang".</li> <li>DROMIC Focal is continuously monitoring weather condition and in close coordination with SWADTs for any incident reports on the ground. Likewise, in coordination with PDO rendering duty at the OCD for any additional updates that possibly necessary to capture. There is a total of 183 stranded passengers: 108 in Lipata Ferry Terminal and 75 in Eva Macapagal Port of Surigao City. It has to be noted that the 108 stranded passengers in Lipata Ferry Terminal are now served in Lipata National High School evacuation center.</li> <li>Classes in all levels both in private and public schools are suspended in the Municipality of Sibagat, Agusan Del Sur; and in the Provinces of Agusan Del Norte and Surigao Del Sur.</li> <li>Province of Dinagat has suspended classes only from Pre-school to Elementary level, while in Surigao Del Norte from Pre-school to High School level.</li> <li>Currently, respective P/C/MDRRMCs across the region are activating its Quick Response Teams in preparation for TS Basyang. Moreover, the SWADT, PAT and C/MAT are also coordinating strongly with them for on-going data generation and reporting.</li> </ul>
12 February 2018	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All QRT members are on standby for possible deployment.</li> <li>As per report from Philippine Coast Guard - Surigao Norte Station, sea travels from Surigao, Lipata and Dinagat Islands were already suspended as well as sea travels from and to Nasipit Port in Nasipit, Agusan del Norte are suspended since 11 February 2018 due to TS Basyang</li> <li>Per report from Lipata Ferry Terminal in Brgy. Lipata, Surigao City as of 8AM, 12 February 2018, 38 passengers are stranded going to Liloan and Benit, San Ricardo, Southern Leyte.
