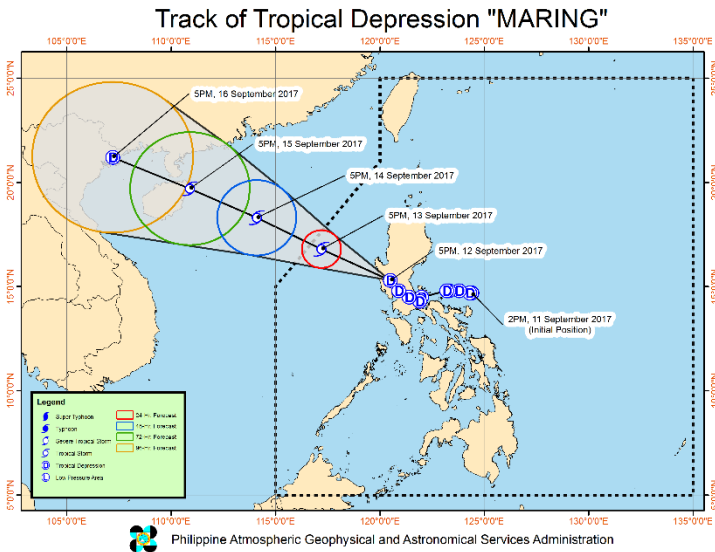


DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on Tropical Storm “Maring” as of 13 September 2017, 5AM

Situation Overview



- Light to moderate with occasionally heavy rains during thunderstorms will be experienced over Bataan, Zambales, and Batangas. Residents in these areas are alerted against possible landslide and flashfloods.

- Sea travel remains risky over the western seaboard of Central and Southern Luzon due to TS "Maring"

- TS “Maring” is expected to exit PAR tonight or tomorrow early morning.

- Tropical Cyclone Warning Signals elsewhere are now lifted.

Location of eye/center:	At 4:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Storm "MARING" was estimated based on all available data at 270 km West of Iba, Zambales (14.9 °N, 117.5 °E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 75 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 90 kph
Forecast Movement:	Forecast to move West Northwest at 15 kph

2. Status of Displaced Families / Persons

a. A total of **1,857 families** or **7,549 persons** are currently staying in **116 evacuation centers** in **NCR, REGION III and CALABARZON** (see Table 2).

b. A total of **96 families** or **389 persons** from **Region III and CALABARZON** are presently taking shelter with families/friends (see Table 2).

4. Status of Prepositioned Resources: Stockpiles and Standby Funds

The DSWD Central Office (CO), concerned Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to **₱ 836,623,830.73** (see Table 4) with breakdown as follows:

a. Stockpiles

A total of **196,896 Family Food Packs (FFPs)** (see Table 5) amounting to **₱72,623,951.49** and available **Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)** amounting to **₱186,227,538.30**.

b. Standby Funds

A total of **₱577,772,340.94** standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **₱555,110,259.05** is the available Quick Response Fund in the CO.

13 September 2013	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The LGUs of Navotas, San Juan, Taguig, Valenzuela, and Manila City have provided hot meals and other relief goods to the affected families. Also, the said LGUs have not yet requested augmentation assistance from the Field Office. The Region will continuously monitor and provide updates on the status of the affected families from the said LGUs. The twelve (12) other LGUs monitored by the Disaster Response Section in coordination with Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA) Flood Control Center as of 5:00 pm, no flooding incidents affecting residential areas were reported and no other evacuation centers were set up. Three (3) members of the Tuesday Quick Response Team and Nine (9) staff of Disaster Response Section are still on duty and have coordinated with the 17 LGUs and MMDA Flood Control Center to monitor the possible occurrence of flooding and status of the families who might be affected.
12 September 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> LGU has not yet requested augmentation assistance from the Field Office. Of the other sixteen (16) LGUs monitored by the Disaster Response Section in coordination with Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA) Flood Control Center as of 12:00 pm, no flooding incidents affecting residential areas were reported and no other evacuation centers were set up.

11 September 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The DSWD-FO NCR alerted and activated the Region's Quick Response Team (QRT) Leaders (Monday to Sunday Team) on the eventualities and immediately prepare/inform their team members. • The DSWD-FO NCR coordinated with Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA), Office of Civil Defense - National Capital Region (OCD-NCR) and DOST-PAGASA for advisories and updates on the tropical cyclone. • The DSWD-FO NCR coordinated with LGUs for possible provision of augmentation support and status of possible evacuation centers for the families.
