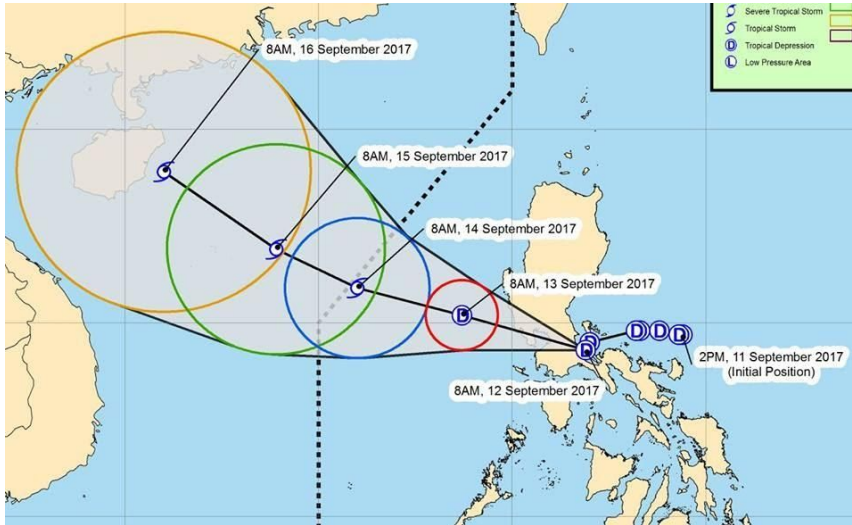


## DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on Tropical Storm “Maring” as of 14 September 2017, 12MN

### Situation Overview

As of 5:00PM, 13 September 2017 Tropical Storm “Maring” is now outside of the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). The center of Tropical Storm “Maring” was estimated based on all available data at 495 km West of Iba, Zambales (15.6 N, 115.4 E) with maximum sustained winds of 85 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 105km/h. It is forecast to move West Northwest at 18 km/h.
