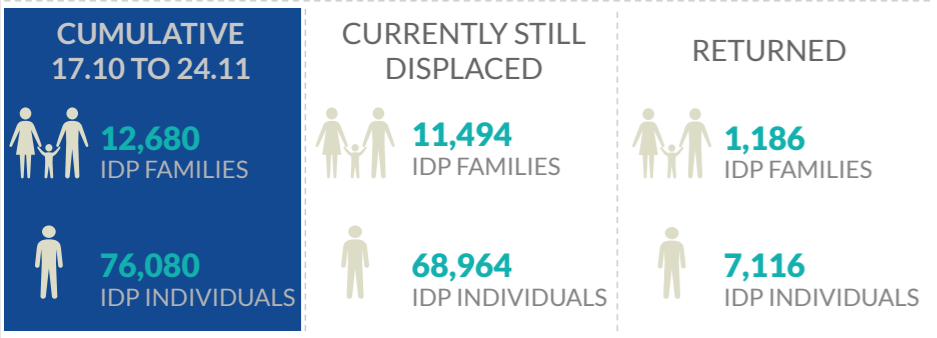
FACTSHEET 4# - MOSUL OPERATIONS FROM 17 OCTOBER TO 24 NOVEMBER

The Emergency Tracking (ET) system is a crisis-based tool that aims at tracking sudden displacement or return movements triggered by specific crises. The ET figures reported on this portal are not cumulative of the all persons affected by the Mosul crisis thus far, rather the

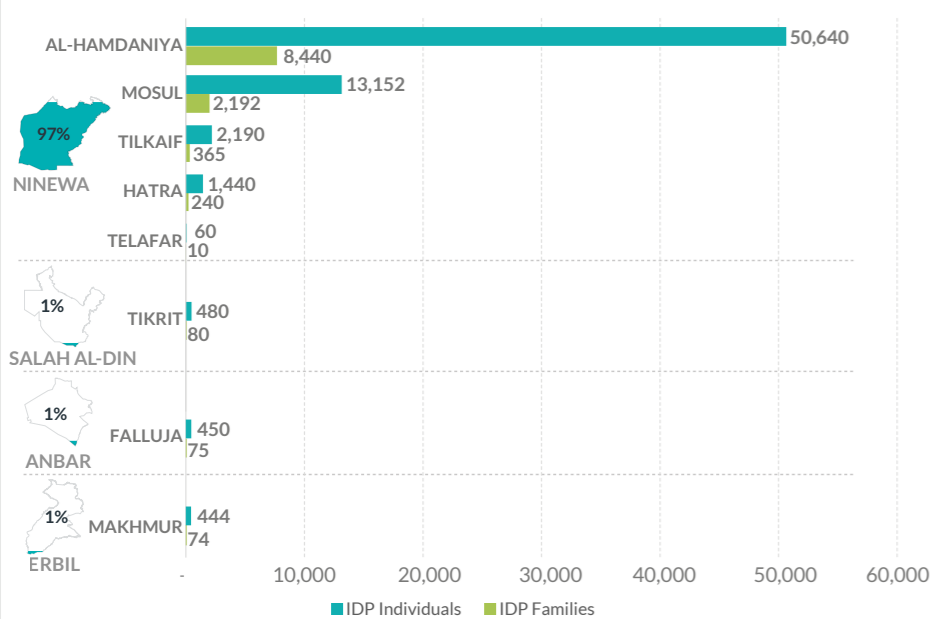
ET update provides only a snapshot of the current displacement situation for the indicated date. The data and information reported on this page are related solely to the displacement caused by the Mosul operations which started on 17 October 2016.



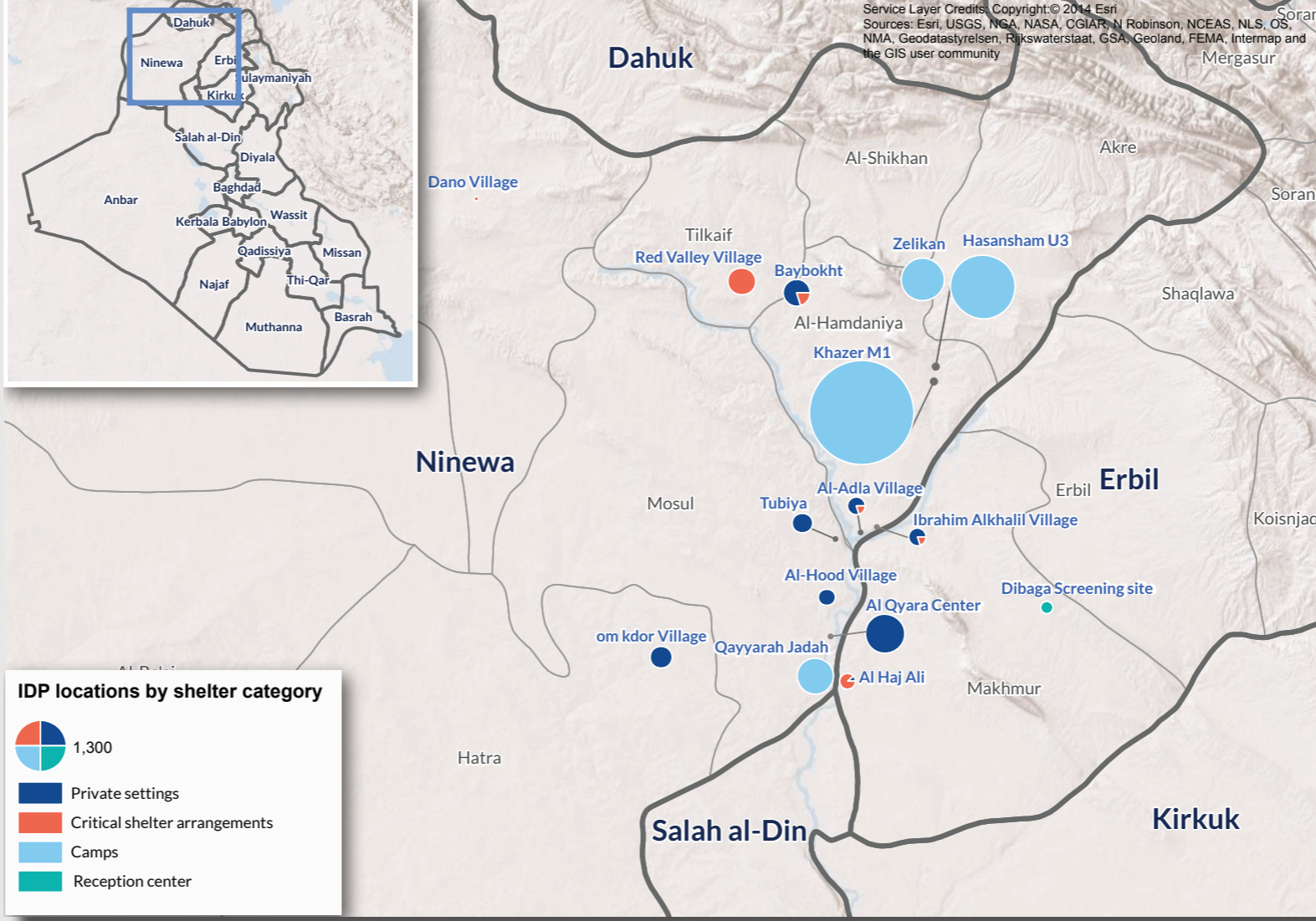
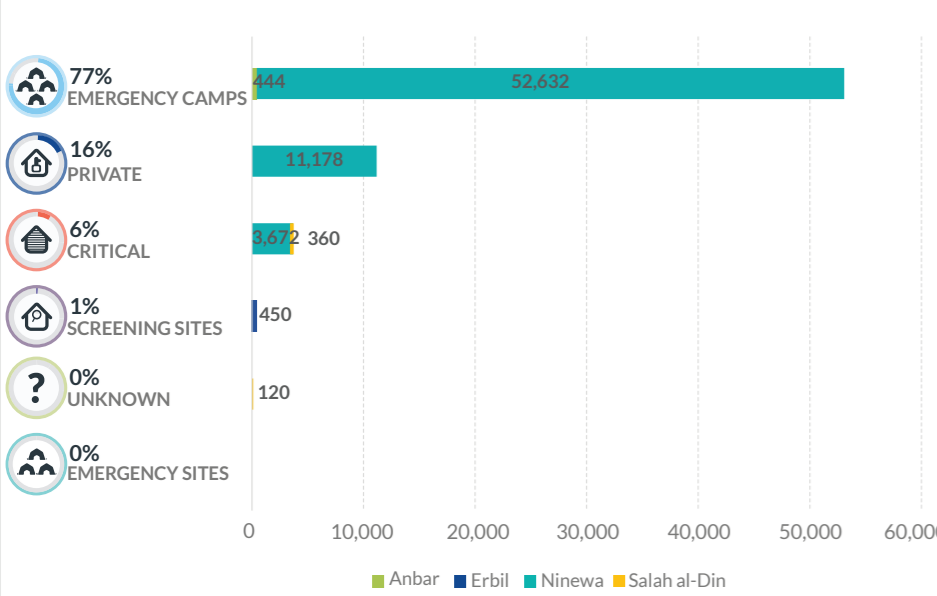
CUMULATIVE FIGURES

- Military operations started on 17 October. Displacement movements have been recorded since 18 October.
- Between 17 and 24 November 2,344 new IDP families (14,064 individuals) have been displaced.
- During the same period, return movements have been recorded as well, with 636 IDP families (3,816) returning from Qayara sub-district (particularly from Qayara Jadah camp, towards Al-Shura and Hamam al-Aleel sub-districts. The total number of returnee families is now 1,186 (7,116 individuals).
- Taking into account both new displacement and return movements, on 24 November 11,494 IDP families (68,694 individuals) are still displaced, that is, 17% more (10,248 individuals) than on 17 November.
- As of 24 November, the governorate hosting the largest number of IDPs displaced as a result of Mosul operations is Nineewa, with 98% or 67,482 individuals.
- The district that recorded the highest increase in IDP population last week is Hamdaniya, with an increase of 29% (11,460 individuals) because of new arrivals to the camps in the area, particularly Khazer M1 camp.
- Approximately 77% of the currently displaced IDPs (53,106 individuals) are hosted in camps, with a high concentration in Nineewa, particularly in Hamdaniya district.
- Between 17 and 24 November, the population in camps grew by 17% (7,776 individuals). All new arrivals (14,064 individuals) have been hosted in camps; however, a large number of individuals hosted in Qayara Jadah camp returned to their locations of origin.
