

# MOVEMENT OF CAMP IDPs

18 OCTOBER – 22 NOVEMBER 2020

## DEPARTURE OF IDPs FROM CAMP SETTINGS<sup>1</sup>



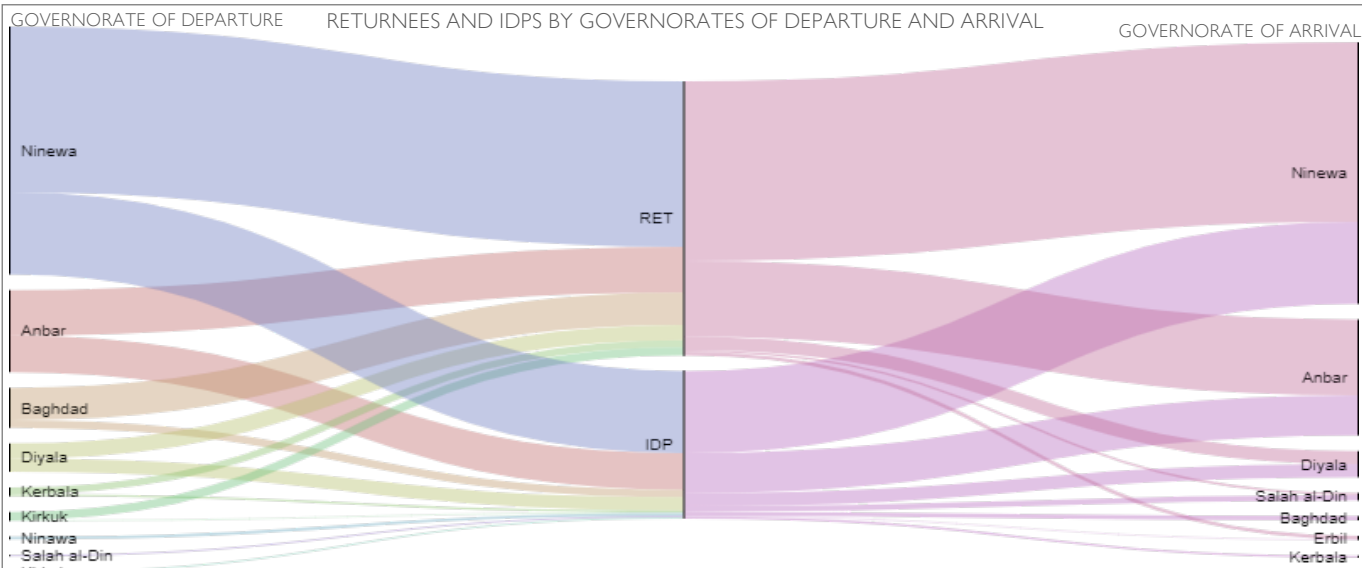
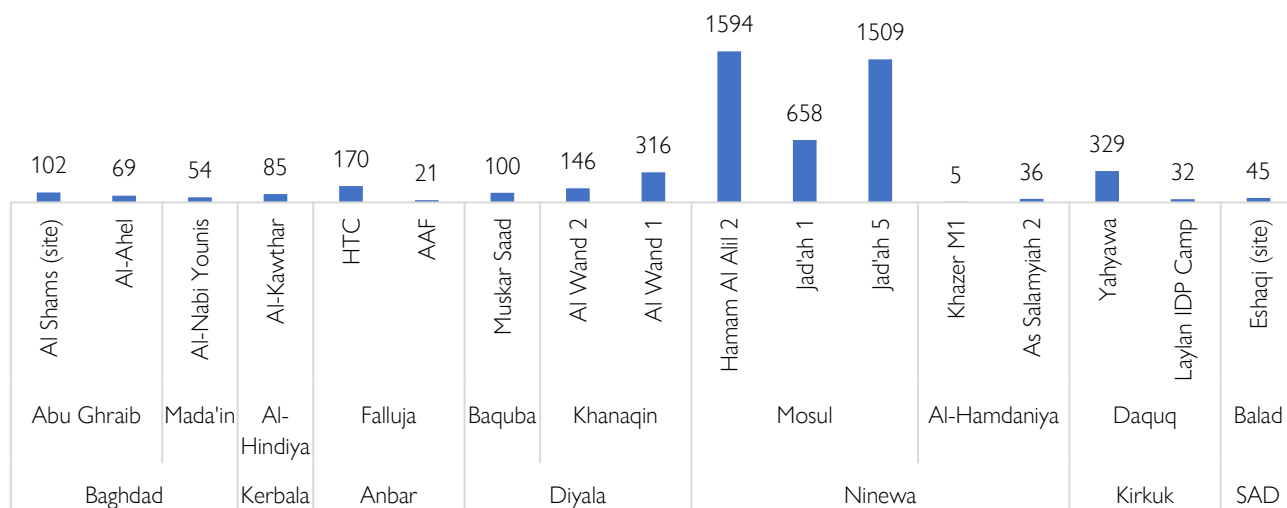

- 10% of all camp IDPs departed a formal camp<sup>3</sup>
- 13% of Anbar camp IDPs departed a formal camp
- 22% of Kirkuk camp IDPs departed a formal camp
- 22% of Ninewa camp IDPs departed a formal camp
- 60% of Diyala camp IDPs departed a formal camp
- 82% of Baghdad camp IDPs departed a formal camp<sup>4</sup>
- 100% of Kerbala camp IDPs departed a formal camp

A total of 5,271 households (25,786 individuals) have been tracked moving from camps to non-camp settings between 18 October and 22 November 2020 following the recent closure of some camps. While most departures have taken place in Ninewa governorate, departures have also been recorded from camp settings in Baghdad, Kerbala, Anbar, Diyala, Kirkuk and Salah al-Din governorates. Since the last report on 15 November, 334 households (1,928 individuals) were recorded as departing camp settings across Iraq. According to an update from November 19 on the CCCM Cluster website, 18 camps and informal sites have been closed since mid-October, with many IDPs being unable to return to their place of origin due to insecurity, and lack of services and livelihood opportunities.

# ARRIVAL OF IDPs FROM CAMPS TO NON-CAMP SETTINGS

In the same reporting period, 2,606 households (13,664 individuals) were recorded as arriving in non-camp settings in the governorates of Anbar, Baghdad, Kerbala, Ninewa, Diyala, Salah al-Din and Erbil. Mosul and Telfar districts in Ninewa and Khanaqin district in Diyala received the highest number of individuals coming from camps. Since the last report on 15 November, DTM recorded an additional 1,078 households (5,704 individuals) as new arrivals to non-camp settings. Of these new arrivals, Mosul district received the highest number of households (387), followed by Hatra and Telfar all in Ninewa. Of all the households who departed camps, 32% have not returned to their location of origin, while 1,771 households (68%) have left the camps and returned to their respective areas of
