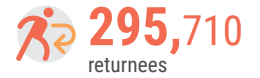
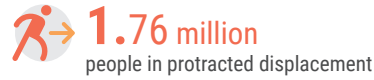

### HIGHLIGHTS

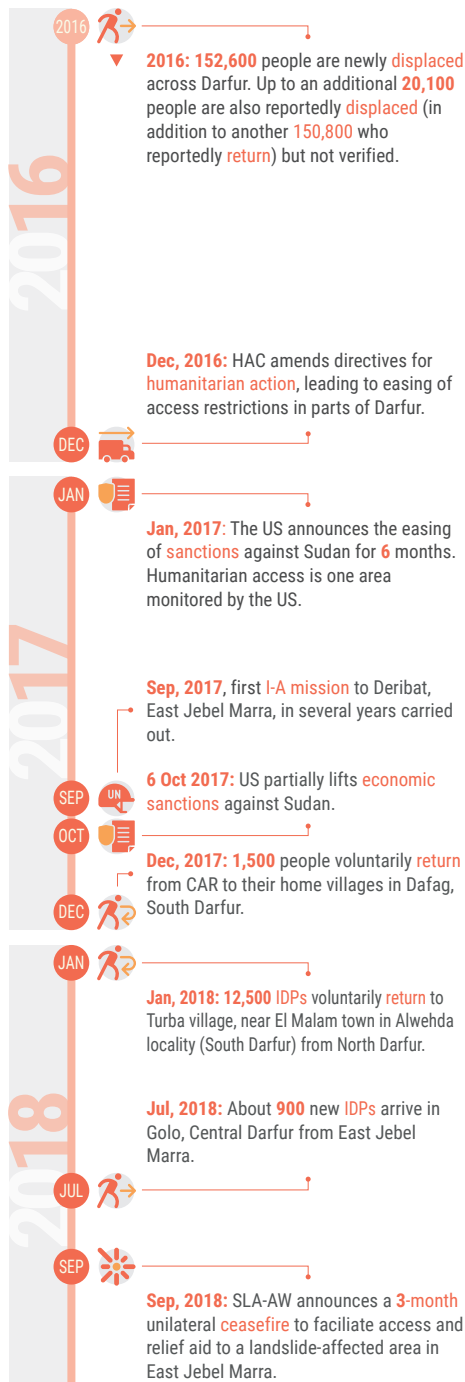
During the first half of 2018, some **15,000** people have been newly displaced in Darfur, as compared to **10,000** in 2017, and **152,000** in 2016. All the new displacement in Darfur in 2018 was in and from Jebel Marra. About **386,000** people have returned to their areas of origin in Sudan since 2015, mainly in Darfur. The UN and partners continue to work with the Government to further verify the returnees.

About **16,500** South Sudanese refugees arrived in Darfur (East and South Darfur states) between 1 January and 30 September 2018, accounting for **55** per cent of all new arrivals in Sudan during that period. This brings the total number of South Sudanese in Darfur to about **148,745** (20 per cent of all South Sudanese refugees in Sudan), according to UNHCR. The number of Chadian refugees in Darfur has reduced by **43 per cent**, following the return of over **3,200** refugees to Chad since February. There are currently **4,222** Chadian refugees in Darfur.

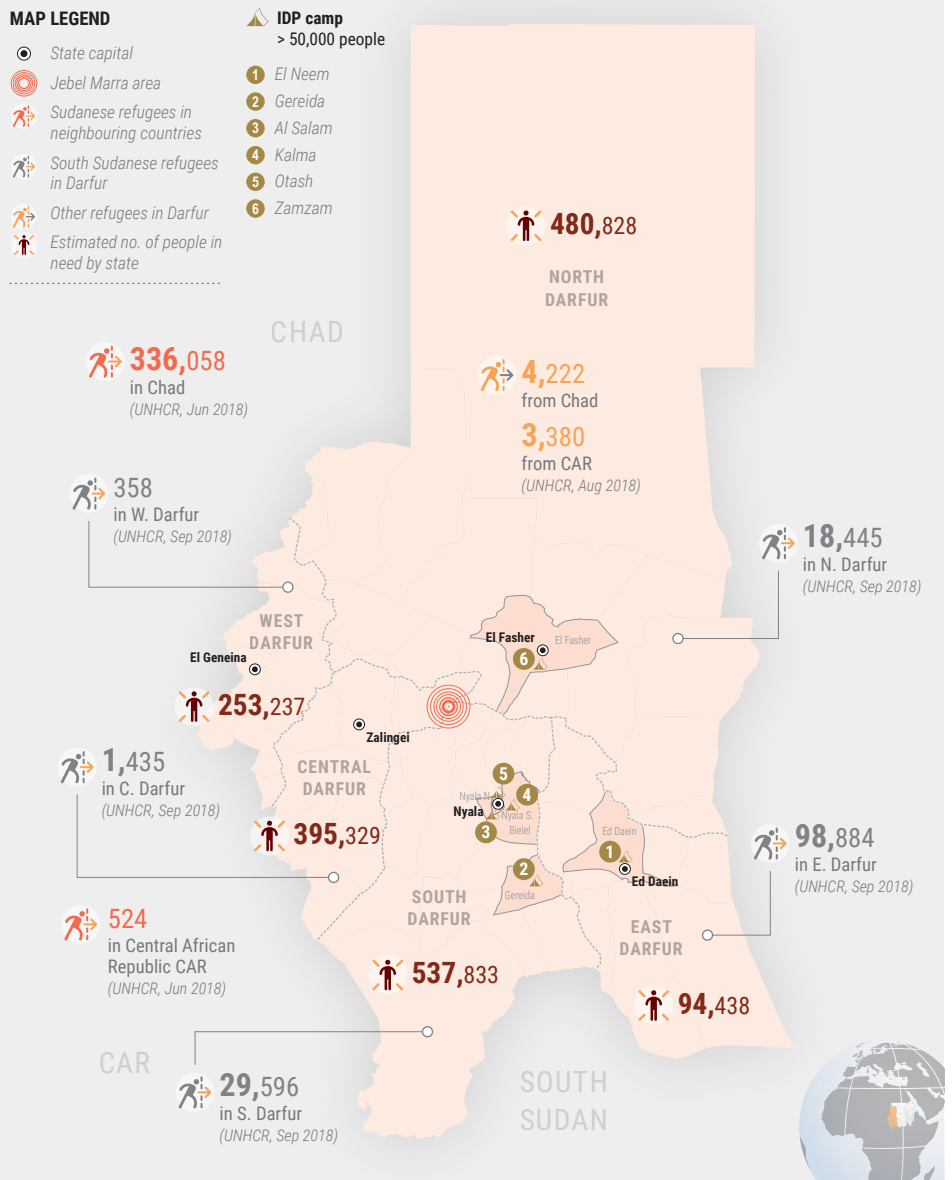
