SITUATION REPORT**

**SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 05.08.2011**

**RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY**

- Moderate to heavy rainfall with isolated very heavy falls have been reported in some parts of Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Chandigarh, Assam, Arunachal Pradesh and Himachal Pradesh.

**Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)**

- Widespread rain/thundershowers would occur along west coast and over central India.
- Fairly widespread rain/thundershowers would occur over western Himalayan region, Uttar Pradesh, east India, northeastern states, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep.
- Scattered rain/thundershowers would occur over remaining parts of the country except west Rajasthan, Andhra Pradesh and Tamilnadu where it may be isolated.

**CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)**

- There are 14 Moderate flood situation sites (Assam-03, Bihar-06, Jharkhand-01, West Bengal-01 & Uttar Pradesh-03) in the country on **05.08.2011.**

**DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)**

- 17 teams consisting of 546 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam - (6), Andhra Pradesh - (2), J&K - (2), Kerala - (1), Parliament House new Delhi- (1) and Bihar (5).

## **INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)**

- Widespread rain/thundershowers would occur along west coast and over central India.
- Fairly widespread rain/thundershowers would occur over western Himalayan region, Uttar Pradesh, east India, northeastern states, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep.
- Scattered rain/thundershowers would occur over remaining parts of the country except west Rajasthan, Andhra Pradesh and Tamilnadu where it may be isolated.

### **Warning**

- Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur over Konkan & Goa, coastal Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh during next 48 hours.
- Isolated heavy rainfall would occur over Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Bihar, Assam & Meghalaya and SubHimalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during next 24 hours.

### **Weather outlook for next two days**

- Increase in rainfall activity over northwest India.
- Fairly widespread rainfall would occur over parts of the country except interior peninsular India where it will be subdued.

## **CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level at forecast sites)**

According to the Central Water Commission (CWC) report dated 5<sup>th</sup> August, 2011, there are 14 moderate flood situation sites in the country, as per details given below:-

### **Moderate Flood Site** **Assam**

- River Brahmaputra at Neamatighat/Jorhat (Assam) is flowing at 85.28 m against the danger level of 85.04 m with Rising trend.
- River Dhansiri (S) at Golaghat/Numaligarh(Assam) is flowing at 77.65m against the danger level of 77.42m with Rising trend.
- River Jiabharali at Sonitpur/Balipara (Assam) is flowing at 77.30 m against the danger level of 77.00 m with Rising trend.

## **Bihar**

- River Ganga at Bhagalpur/Colgong (Bihar) is flowing at 31.11 m against the danger level of 31.09m with a Falling trend.
- River Bagmati at Muzafferpur/Hayaghat (Bihar) is flowing at 49.05 m against the danger level of 48.68m with a Falling trend.
- River Adhwara at Darbhanga/Kamtaul (Bihar) is flowing at 50.75 m against the danger level of 50.00 m with a Steady trend.
- River Kosi at Supaul (Bihar) is flowing at 48.00m against the danger level of 47.75m with a Steady trend.
- River Kosi at Khangaria/Choutham (Bihar) is flowing at 35.01 m against 33.85 m with Steady trend.
- River Kosi at Katihar/Khursela(Bihar) is flowing at 30.19m against the danger level of 30.00m with a Falling trend.

## **Jharkhand**

- River Ganga at Sahibganj(Jharkhand) is flowing at 27.65 m against the danger level of 27.25 m with a Falling trend.

## **Uttar Pradesh**

- River Ghaghra at Barabanki (Uttar Pradesh) is flowing at 106.58m against the danger level of 106.07 m with a Steady trend.
- River Ghaghra at Faizabad/Ayodhya(Uttar Pradesh) is flowing at 93.24 m against the danger level of 92.73m with a Rising trend.
- River Ghaghra at Ballia/Balthra (Uttar Pradesh) is flowing at 64.05m against the danger level of 64.01m with a Steady trend.

## **West Bengal**

- River Ganga at Murshidabad/Farakka(West Bengal) is flowing at 22.96 m against the danger level of 22.25m with a Falling trend.

## **DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 5<sup>th</sup> August, 2011**

- ❖ In Assam, 06 teams consisting of 178 personnel in Kamrup(17), Dhubri (31), Lakhimpur (30), Sonitpur (35), Jorhat (31) and Dhemaji (34) alongwith equipment have been deployed for emergent response and rescue operations in case of any flood or any other disaster.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 02 teams consisting of 66 personnel in Vijayawada have been deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
- ❖ In Kerala, 01 team consisting of 39 personnel in Kozhikode deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.

- ❖ In Jammu & Kashmir, 02 teams consisting of **88** personnel in Baltal (45) and Pahalgam(43) deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
- ❖ In New Delhi 01 team consisting of **12** personnel deployed at Parliament House, New Delhi for emergency response.
- ❖ In Bihar, 05 teams consisting of **163** personnel in Saharsa (24), Madhepura (35), Supaul (34), Khagaria (32) and Gopalganj (38) deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
