SITUATION REPORT

SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 03.09.2011

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Moderate to heavy rainfall with isolated very heavy falls have been reported in some parts of Orissa, Madhya Pradesh, Chattisgarh, Karnataka, Goa, Jharkhand, Himachal Pradesh, Kerala, Gujarat and Maharashtra.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Widespread rain/thundershowers would occur along west coast during next 48 hours and decrease in intensity thereafter.
- Fairly widespread rain/thundershowers would occur over plains of northwest & central India, Orissa, interior Maharashtra and Gujarat.
- Scattered rain/thundershowers would occur over remaining parts of the country outside Bihar and interior south peninsular India where it may be isolated.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)

- There are 11 Moderate flood situation sites (Bihar-07, Uttar Pradesh-02, Jharkhand-01, West Bengal -01) in the country on 03.09.2011.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

- 18 teams consisting of 521 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam - (5), Andhra Pradesh - (2), Kerala - (1), Parliament House New Delhi- (1), Punjab (2), Uttar Pradesh (2) & Bihar (5).

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Widespread rain/thundershowers would occur along west coast during next 48 hours and decrease in intensity thereafter.
- Fairly widespread rain/thundershowers would occur over plains of northwest & central India, Orissa, interior Maharashtra and Gujarat.
- Scattered rain/thundershowers would occur over remaining parts of the country outside Bihar and interior south peninsular India where it may be isolated.

Warning

- Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at a few places over Konkan & Goa and coastal Karnataka during next 48 hours.
- Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur over Gujarat, east Rajasthan, □ West Madhya Pradesh Orissa and Kerala during next 48 hours.

Weather outlook for next two days

- Fairly widespread rainfall activity would continue over central and parts of northwest India and along west coast.
- Fairly widespread rainfall activity would continue over central & adjoining east India and along west coast.

- River Ganga at Patna(Gandhighat) (Bihar) is flowing at 48.75 m against the danger level of 48.60 m with a Falling trend.
- River Ganga at Hathidah, district Patna (Bihar) is flowing at 41.97 m against the danger level of 41.76 m with a Falling trend.
- River Ganga at Bhagalpur/Colgong (Bihar) is flowing at 31.72 m against the danger level of 31.09 m with a Falling trend.
- River Burhi Gandak at Khagaria (Bihar) is flowing at 37.12 m against the danger level of 36.58 m with a Falling trend.
- River Kosi at Khangaria/Choutham (Bihar) is flowing at 34.42 m against the danger level of 33.85 m with a Falling trend.

- River Kosi at Kathihar/Khursela (Bihar) is flowing at 30.60 m against the danger level of 30.00 m with a Falling trend.
- River Sone at Patna/Maner(Bihar) is flowing at 52.28 m against the danger level of 52.00 m with Falling trend.

Jharkhand

- River Ganga at Sahibganj (Jharkhand) is flowing at 28.09 m against the danger level of 27.25 m with a Falling trend.

Uttar Pradesh

- River Ganga at Ballia (Uttar Pradesh) is flowing at 58.28 m against the danger level of 57.62 m with a Falling trend.
- River Ghaghra at Faizabad/Ayodhya (Uttar Pradesh) is flowing at 92.93 m against the danger level of 92.73 m with a Falling trend.

West Bengal

- River Ganga at Murshidabad/Farakka (West Bengal) is flowing at 23.36 m against the danger level of 22.25 m with a Falling trend.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 3rd September, 2011

- ❖ In Assam, 05 teams consisting of 132 personnel in Kamrup(15), Dhubri (26), Lakhimpur (28), Sonitpur (31) and Dhemaji (31) alongwith equipment have been deployed for emergent response and rescue operations in case of any flood or any other disaster.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 02 teams consisting of 66 personnel in Vijayawada have been deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
- ❖ In Kerala, 01 team consisting of 40 personnel in Kozhikode deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
- ❖ In Punjab, 02 teams consisting of 67 personnel deployed at Ferozpur (41) and Fazilka (26) deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
- ❖ In New Delhi 01 team consisting of 16 personnel deployed at Parliament House, New Delhi for emergency response.
- ❖ In Uttar Pradesh, 02 team consisting of 63 personnel in Gonda (28) and Gorakhpur (35) deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
- ❖ In Bihar, 05 teams consisting of 137 personnel in Saharsa (27), Madhepura (25), Supaul (31), Khagaria (31) and Gopalganj (23) deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
