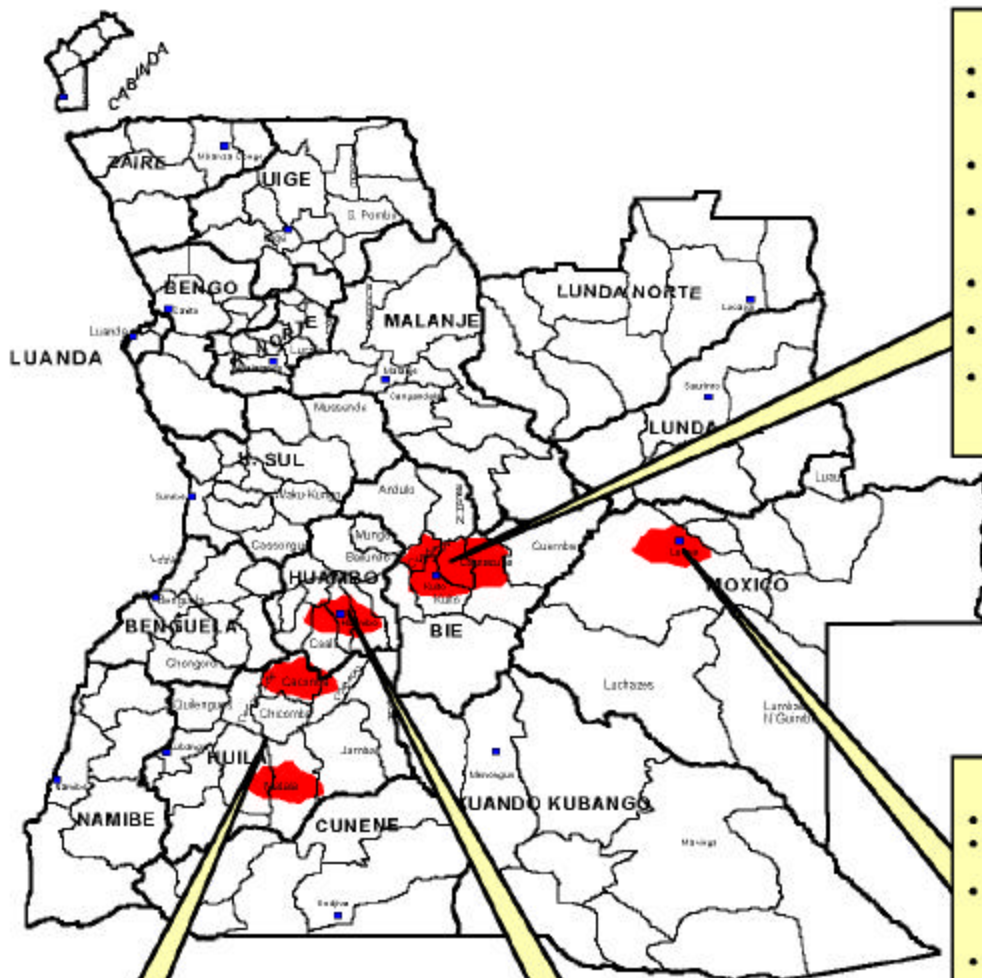

# Critical Areas



## Bié Province

- 206,000 IDPs are confirmed
- An average of 3,750 new IDPs enter Kuito, Camacupa and Cunhinga each week
- Registration systems are over-stretched
- New arrivals wait up to three weeks before receiving assistance
- IDPs lack adequate shelter and basic non-food items
- Malnutrition, morbidity and mortality levels are high
- An Integrated Plan of Action for Bié Province was developed in January

## Moxico Province

- 86,60 IDPs are confirmed
- An average of 1,400 IDPs arrive in Luena each week
- 90 percent of new IDPs are transported to Luena by military helicopter
- 50,000 new IDPs may arrive in the next five months
- Large numbers of separated children continue to arrive
- IDPs lack adequate shelter and basic non-food items
- Malnutrition, morbidity and mortality levels are high
- An Integrated Plan of Action for Moxico Province was developed in February

## Huíla Province

- 164,000 IDPs are confirmed
- An average of 1,000 IDPs arrive in Matala and Caconda each week
- IDPs lack adequate shelter and basic non-food items
- Malnutrition, morbidity and mortality levels are high
- An Integrated Plan of Action for Huíla Province will be developed in March

## Huambo Province

- 114,600 IDPs are confirmed
- An average of 500 IDPs arrive in Huambo each week
- New IDPs are crowding into four transit centres and Betania site
- IDPs lack adequate shelter and basic non-food items
- Health and nutrition conditions are serious for new arrivals
- An Integrated Plan of Action for Huambo Province will be developed in March
