



SITUATION

- Tropical Cyclone NOCK-TEN, locally named NINA, formed over the north-western Pacific Ocean, near the Federated States of Micronesia, on 21 December. It started moving north-west, heading towards the Philippines and strengthening. It affected Philippines between 23-28 December 2016 and it made a total 8 landfalls: the first one was in Bato (island-province of Catanduanes) on the 25 December early morning (UTC) as very intense Tropical Cyclone.
- According to the latest situation report from National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) of 2 January, three people have died and 21 people are reported missing.
- The number of affected people has risen to 1 986 960. The number of people reported at evacuation centres has risen to 230 097 at 282 evacuation centres.
