



## El Nino Rainfall Monitoring Report on November 24, 2015

### **Situation Overview**

There has been a general decrease in rainfall in most parts of the County except parts of Western Kenya and Nyanza regions. Heavy rainfall was experienced in Busia, Migori and Isiolo Counties. Parts of Narok, Kisii and Bungoma Counties received average rainfall, while Laikipia and Nairobi received light showers. No rains were received in the entire Coastal region and North Eastern regions.

There has therefore been no major incident reported as a result.

#### *KRCS / Other stakeholder's interventions*

KRCS in collaboration with County Governments continues with response operations in support of families affected by floods in various parts of the country. Currently the following responses are ongoing:

#### *Isiolo County*

In Mbalambate Village, KRCS and the County Government team carried out an assessment and established that 21 households had been displaced following flash floods. Distribution of NFIs is set to take place on Wednesday (25<sup>th</sup> November) targeting the affected families.

#### *Tana River County*

In Tana River County, the continued rise in water levels along the Tana River channel has forced families to move to higher areas. KRCS teams are currently carrying out registration of the displaced families in various camps in the county. At least 14 camps have been reached. Some of the areas affected include Umoja, Miyesa, Haluba A and B, Kiembeni, Korlabe A, B, and C, Vidange, Ngumo - Garjale, Baomo, Feji, Maziwa, Sera, Wolkon, Marombo - Ngelwa among other areas. Due to the rapid increase in displacement camps, there is a risk of disease outbreak due to poor sanitation in the camps.

#### *Kisumu County*

In Kisumu County, floods have affected families in several areas as detailed below:

The County Government and KRCS have distributed relief items 190 families in Kakola Sub-Location on Tuesday (24<sup>th</sup> November 2015). A detailed, multi-stakeholder assessment is ongoing targeting these areas affected by the floods.

### **Seven Day Weather Forecast**

The Seven Day forecast report from KMS indicates a likelihood of continued rainfall over several parts of the country throughout the forecast period. Parts of Southeast lowlands will receive heavy rainfall (>20mm in 24 hours) on Thursday while the Northeast region will experience heavy downpour from Friday to Sunday.

### **Likely impacts include,**

- There is a continued risk of flooding over low-lying areas and those with poor drainage.
- Land-slides are likely on steep slopes.
- Disruption of transport due to damaged roads and bridges
