Flash Flood in Aceh Tenggara, Aceh Province and 3 other parts of Indonesia

SITREP # 1: 19 April at 15.00 PM local time (UCT+7)

HIGH LIGHTS

- On 12 April 2012 at 18.15 (UCT+7), flash flood occurred in 2 sub-districts: Bukit sub-district (Kerukunan, Sebudijaya and Rikit Bur II villages) and Babel sub-district (Kuning II and Cinta Damai sub-district), Aceh Tenggara district, Aceh province. The water level reached \pm 150 cm-height and the water consisted of mud and log. The population at risk is 690 people/183 households.
- On 15 April 2012 at 15.30 PM (UCT+6), a flash flood in Lematang Indah waterfall, Perahu Dipo village, Dempo Selatan sub-district, Pagar Alam, South Sumatera province
- On 15 April 2012 at 16.30 PM Central Indonesian Time (UCT+6), a flash flood occurred in power plant of Mino Hydro (PLTM), Mantowa village, Pasar Wajo sub-district, Buton district, South east Sulawesi province.
- On 16 April 2012 at 08.30 AM, a flood affected 15 villages in Teumon sub-district, Aceh Jaya district, Aceh province. The population at risk was 9,000 people. The water level reached 1 meter-height.
- As of today, Centre for Health Crisis (CHC), Ministry of Health (MoH) reported death of 2 persons, minor injuries of 6 persons, and 24 persons as IDP.
- In addition to the data from CHC-MOH, BNPB reported that the flash flood in Aceh Tenggara caused minor injury of 5 persons and rendered 132 household (460 persons) as temporary IDP. 52 houses were severely damaged, 96 lightly damaged houses and 14 houses were swept away.
- Respected District Health Offices and Provincial Health Offices had evacuated the victims, provided medical services, and the level of alert for health facilities is still raised.
- Aceh Tenggara DHO, Aceh Jaya DHO, Pagar alam DHO, Buton DHO, Aceh PHO, Aceh PHO, South Sumatera PHO, South East Sulawesi PHO and Center for Health Crisis are monitoring the situation closely.
- WHO is in close contact with MOH to provide any assistance needed.

Situation Analysis

- The flood in Aceh Tenggara was caused by the heavy rainfall and illegal logging.
- Meanwhile the flood in Aceh Jaya was caused by the heavy rainfall and overflowed Teunom river.
- The flood in Pagar Alam and Buton was caused by the heavy rainfall.

Damaged homes, offices and infrastructure

- In addition to the data from CHC-MOH, BNPB reported damage that the flash flood in Aceh Tenggara caused minor injury of 5 persons and rendered 132 household (460 persons) as temporary IDPs. 52 houses were severely damaged, 96 lightly damaged and 14 houses were swept away.

IDP status

Temporary IDPs were reported and they have returned to their respected homes when the water receded.

Communication, Transportation and Electricity Power

Communication

No communication line was disrupted.

Transportation

Transportation line was disrupted. However, it was restored when the flood was receded.

Electricity Power

No temporary electricity outage was reported.

Response

Local Government

- Aceh Tenggara DHO established health post in SDN I Lawe Dua (Bukit Tusam sub-district) and raised the level of alert of 3 Puskesmas (Lawe Perbunga, Seumadam and Lawe Dua) and 1 mobile puskesmas in Lawe Perbunga, and provided medical service and health promotion,
- Aceh PHO also deployed provincial rapid health assesment team (2 nurses and 2 surveillance officers) to support district rapid health assessment team,
- Aceh PHO provided 22 boxes of fortified biscuit, 4 pieces of vest and 12 pieces of boot shoes.
- Aceh Jaya DHO has evacuated the victims and provided health services.
- Pagar Alam DHO has evacuated the victim;
- Buton DHO has evacuated the victim to Bau-Bau hospital and conducted death victim identification.
