

Briefs of FIDR's Emergency Flood Relief in Kampong Chhnang From 20 October 2011 to 25 January 2012

FIDR has been working on its emergency relief agenda assisting the families affected by the worst flood in more than a decade. FIDR has picked Kampong Chhnang, one of the worst affected provinces along Tonle Sap Lake, as the targeting province of the relief.

FIDR has worked on two phases for the relief, Emergency Food and Clean Water Product Relief and Post-Flood Livelihood Restoration. Below is a brief report on the two phases of the relief.

I. Phase I : Emergency Food and Clean Water Product Relief Rolea Pa-ir, Boribo and Chulkiri District

FIDR had began its first phase of emergency flood relief since October 2011 by urgently distributed foods and safe water products. Cooperating with the provincial authorities and Cambodian Red Cross, FIDR distributed the relief aids four times successively to 4,466 most flood-affected families who were calling for immerdiate helps.

111.65 tons of rice, 446.6 big boxes of canned fish, 4,466 boxes of instant noodles and 127 boxes of safe water tablet were delivered successfully and safely delivered to the hands of the families. Each of the families received: a 25kg bag of rice, a box of canned fish (10 cans), a box of instant noodle (50 small packets), a tablet of safe water product (ten pills).

**II. Phase II : Post-Flood Livelihood Restoration
Rolea Pa-ir District**

FIDR's second phase of emergency flood relief focused on the post-flood livelihood restoration of the flood-affected families. By distributing varieties of vegetable seeds, FIDR aimed to help farming families whose wet season rice was destroyed by the flood in 2011. According to the local authorities, the families could face food shortage since majority of them could not do the dry season rice.

Each family received a packet of eight varieties of vegetable seeds of 1) 200g of Water convolvulus, 2) 100g of Amaranth, 3) 02 small cans of Chinese cabbage, 4) 02 small cans of Chinese radish, 5) 02 small cans of Cucumber, 6) 02 small cans of Pumpkin, 7) 02 small packets of Wax gourd, and 8) 02 small cans of String bean. FIDR expects the families to use the seeds in their vegetable garden for their family daily consumption.

FIDR will continue cooperating with the Agriculture Department and District Agriculture Office of Kampong Chhnang to follow up and technically support the families on the planting.
