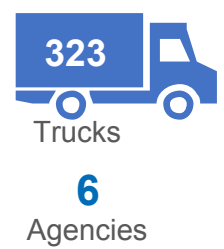
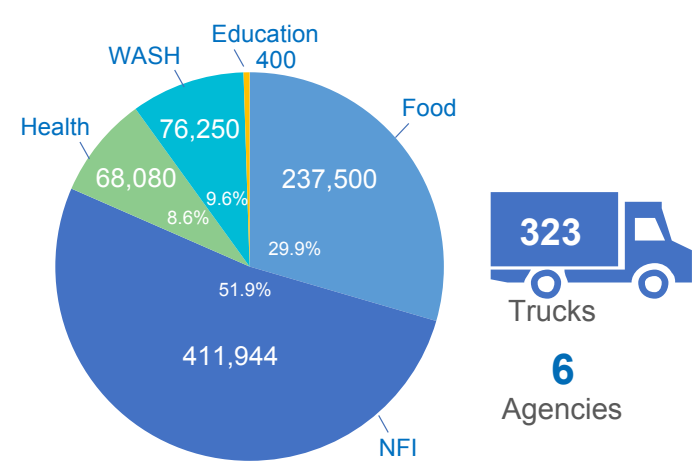


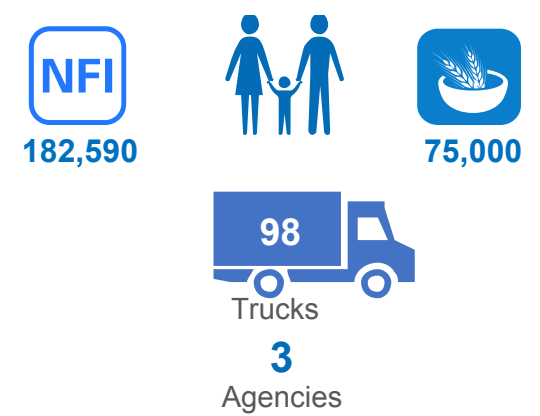
## UN Security Council Resolution 2165/2191

Through the unanimous adoption of resolutions 2165 (2014) and 2191 (2014), until 10 January 2016, the UN Security Council has authorized UN agencies and their partners to use routes across conflict lines and the border crossings at Bab al-Salam, Bab al-Hawa, Al Yarubiyah and Al-Ramtha, with Jordan, to deliver humanitarian assistance, including medical and surgical supplies, to people in need in Syria. In accordance with the resolutions, the government of Syria is notified in advance of each shipment and a UN monitoring mechanism has been established to oversee loading in neighboring countries and confirm the humanitarian nature of consignments.

## Sector Classifications

- Food:** food baskets
- NFIs:** dignity kits, blankets, jerry cans, kitchen sets, sleeping mats, mattresses, winterization kits, tarpaulins
- WASH:** basic water kits for families, water purification tablets, hygiene kits for families and babies, sanitary napkins, diapers
- Health:** emergency health kits, surgical kits, reproductive health kits, midwifery kits, medical consumables
- Education:** recreational kits

## Beneficiaries Assisted

To date, the UN and its implementing partners have assisted 650,664 people in need in Dar'a governorate, adjacent to the Jordanian border, including 62,715 people in northernmost As-Sanamayn district, 144,015 people in Izra' district, and 443,934 in Dar'a district, adjacent to the Jordanian border. The UN and its partners also assisted 143,510 people in need in Quneitra governorate, including 115,510 in Quneitra district and 28,000 in Al Fiq district.

Recent months have seen the UN scale up its operations and this momentum was maintained throughout February. Indeed, in February, the UN and its partners delivered NFI assistance to 182,590 people in need and food rations to 75,000 people in need, with a total of 98 trucks crossing Al-Ramtha border point to deliver humanitarian assistance to southern Syria.

## Potential gaps

An ongoing government offensive to retake several strategic locations in north-west Dar'a governorate has generated the largest displacement in southern Syria in more than eight months. It is estimated that, since the start of February, some 50,000 people have been newly or secondarily displaced from Kafer Nassij, Deir al-Eladas, Kafr Shams, Aqraba and surrounding areas to areas to the south and west, including Jasim, Nimer, and al-Hara, Dar'a Governorate, and Breiqa, Bir Ajam, Qarqas, Sayda, and al-Amal camp, Quneitra Governorate. Many of these IDPs, who are residing in a combination of schools and informal settlements, urgently require food, water, and winterization assistance.

## Shipment History

The first UN shipment from Jordan crossed on 6 August 2014, twenty three days after resolution 2165 was adopted, bringing food, NFIs, and WASH supplies to people in need.

To date, 22 convoys have crossed Al-Ramtha (consisting of 323 trucks), bringing humanitarian supplies from UNHCR, UNICEF, UNFPA, WFP, WHO and IOM to people in need in Dar'a and Quneitra governorates.

## Next Planned Shipment

The next shipment is scheduled to take place on 4 March 2015.
