## **NDRRMC UPDATE**

### **Sitrep No. 5 for Typhoon (TY) "KABAYAN" (Muifa)**

### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

#### **A. SEVERE WEATHER BULLETIN No. 8 issued at 31 July 2011, 11:00 PM**

- Typhoon "KABAYAN" (Muifa) has maintained its strength as it moves in a northeast direction
- At 10:00 PM, 31 July 2011, the eye of Typhoon "KABAYAN" was located at 1,125 km East of Tuguegarao City (18.1°N, 133.6°E) with maximum sustained winds of 175 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 210 kph. It is forecasted to move North at 13 kph
- TY "KABAYAN" is expected to be at 1,100 Km East of Basco, Batanes by Monday evening and at 1,045 km East Northeast of Basco, Batanes by Tuesday morning and it will be at 920 km Northeast of Basco, Batanes by Wednesday evening
- This weather disturbance is too far to directly affect any part of the country
- The estimated rainfall amount is from 10 – 25 mm per hour within the 800 km diameter of the Typhoon.
- Meanwhile, an active Low Pressure Area (ALPA) was estimated to be at 240 km West of Dagupan City (16.3°N, 117.7°E)

#### **B. DAM MONITORING**

- At 6:00 AM, 31 July 2011, one (1) gate of Ipo Dam was opened at 0.3 meter. The current water level is 99.72 which is below its normal high water level 100.20 with a deviation of -0.48

#### **C. INCIDENTS MONITORED:**

##### **Region III**

- **Flooding** affected 17 barangays in Bulacan: San Jose City (1); Meycuayan City (5); Marilao (7); Bocaue (2); Sta Maria (1); and Balagtas (1) with flood waters ranging from 1-3 ft. Flood waters have already subsided except in four (4) barangays of Marilao

- On or about 3:40 PM, 29 July 2011, a **tornado** occurred in Brgy. San Jose Paombong, Bulacan with four (4) families affected and four (4) houses damaged

## Landslides

### Region VII

- On or about 3:30 AM 31 July 2011, a landslide incident occurred at a quarry site in Sitio Abatan, Barangay Lincod, Maribojoc, Bohol. The Potat family and a couple of site workers were asleep in a makeshift shelter at the basement part when a portion of the said quarry gave way. The quarry owner, a certain Nomiriano Almene OF Brgy Cabawan, Maribojoc disclosed that the estimated damage to his property amounts to PHP 500,000.00

## Sea Mishap

### Region III

- On 28 July 2011, a motorized banca with eight (8) fishpond workers on board capsized between the waters of Hagonoy, Bulacan and Pampanga Delta due to big waves and strong winds. Six (6) of the workers survived

### Region VI

- On or about 6:00 AM, 31 July 2011, MV Trans Asia Malaysia from Cebu, with 110 passengers and 45 crew on board, was stranded between Negros and Iloilo waters, leaning on its side and was ordered to abandon ship. PCG Region VI mobilized the following assets to conduct SAR operations: six (6) motorized bancas, one (1) Bantay Dagat, MV Pilipinas Princess and MT Pilipinas of PCG craft. All 110 passengers together with the crew were accounted

- There were 204 families / 967 persons housed inside six (6) designated evacuation centers. However, as of to 31, July, 2011, a total of 38 families / 144 persons are still housed in Harmony Hills Covered Court

## II. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

### NDRRMC

- **NDRRMC OpCen** prepared and disseminated NDRRMC Advisories on Severe Weather Bulletins, Flood Bulletins for River Basin and Allied Rivers, General Flood Advisories on Typhoon “KABAYAN”; and Gale Warnings, to all Chairpersons RDRRMC, PDRRMC, and OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded the same at the NDRRMC website, Facebook, and Twitter accounts for further dissemination to their respective local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants

### REGIONAL PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE

#### RDRRMC/OCDRC III

- Disseminated domestic weather bulletins/ alerts / warnings /advisories to concerned RDRRMC III Member-Agencies, local DRRMCs, and broadcast media for widest dissemination;
- Coordinated with PDRRMCs of Nueva Ecija, Tarlac, Bataan, Zambales, Pampanga, and Bulacan to activate their respective operations center;
- Coordinated with Flood Forecasting and Warning System for Dam Operations (PAGASA Pampanga) for any dam discharge;
- Alerted PRO III Regional Public Safety for rescue assets ready for deployment; AFP Provincial Disaster Response Unit, Subic Bay Metropolitan Authority and Olongapo City Rescue Team to pre-position personnel and rescue equipment in the flood-prone areas
- Disseminated Gale Warning No. 12,; SWB No 7 on typhoon Kabangan, General flood Advisory n 7 for Central Luzon and weather advisory amf weather advisory no 1 for low Pressure Area
- **PDRRMC Bulacan** requested the assistance of Bulacan PPO to inform the PNP station in Central Luzon and Metro Manila, as well as the 18<sup>th</sup> Special Forces of the Philippine Army of the sea mishap incident

#### Region VII

- **Elements of the Maribojoc Police immediately responded to the Maribojoc landslide incident and brought the victims to Celestino Gallares Memorial Hospital where the physicians declared Junrey and Princess Potat as DOA. The Potat couple is still undergoing medical treatment while two others victims, Jimmy Tirol and Ronal Agot, only sustained minor injuries**
