| <ul style="list-style-type: none">For the period 8 – 14 April 2011 ADRA/IOM's Kosti team reported a total of 2, 484 individuals (479 HHs), tracked passing through Kosti. The main destinations were Southern Kordofan (34%), Upper Nile (28%), Central Equatoria (13%), Warrab (5%) and the rest going to various States in smaller numbers. IN comparison to the last four weeks, there is notable increase in this week's figure of almost 65%.For this reporting period ADRA/IOM's Kosti team reported <i>other organized</i> returns by GOSS and SPLM from Khartoum, Sennar, Kosti and Madeni totaling 415 individuals. | | | | | |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none">FAO and the Department of Veterinary Services undertook vaccination and treatment of animals in six areas southern Abyei.SNV and its partners ACAD and SAARF completed the distribution of 112 goats to 34 vulnerable households in Rumamer village. The assistance aimed strengthening livelihoods and poverty reduction particularly targeted female-headed and returnees' households.Despite unverified rumours of impending attacks on Abyei town, schools remained operational with eighth year students attending exams and no population movements noted. | | | | | |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none">WFP has started the distribution of Food for Training (FFT) and Food for Peace (FFP) in Kurmuk.UNHCR is planning to conduct an intention of return to the south assessment and verification mission in 20 villages populated by southerners. A final report will be produced by the end of July.MC-Scotland together with WFP is distributing tools and seeds (sorghum, millet, tomato, oca, lettuce and sesame) to 61 households in the Yabus area, and FFT for early land preparation in Bashirnogo and Komaganzi villages. MC-Scotland's governance program includes the establishment of Locality Planning Units and re-activating village development committees to ensure improved services for the people.FAO and the Ministry of Agriculture have signed contracts with some implementing partners for the distribution of seeds and tools in Kurmuk locality. Around 2,700 farmers will benefit from the first phase of distribution which is expected to start by the end of April. | | | | | |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none">WHO will support Rashad hospital and Al Faid Health Center with basic health kits; emergency health kits and dressing kits. IOM will transport the medical supplies. | | | | | |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none">UNHCR reported that the registration and verification of Hashaba IDPs willing to return to West Darfur from Nyala is completed. In total, 457 individuals were screened and registered as potential returnees. | | | | | |
| East Sudan | | | | | |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none">FAO Kassala office received 225,000 doses of various animal vaccines and drugs which will be distributed to the three states' Ministries of Animal Resources and Fisheries. Out of the total doses of vaccines received, 54,000 were immediately handed over to Red Sea State, and the remainder will be equally divided between Kassala and Gedarif states. | | | | | |

Central Equatoria

- On 11 April 96 organized returnees (mainly youth) arrived in Khartoum by air. Furthermore, UNHCR received 47 vulnerable returnees from Khartoum who are currently at the way station waiting with onward transport to various locations.
- From 13-14 April, WFP distributed food to 4,092 returnees.
- SSRRC reported that government air organized returns from Khartoum to Juba ended on 12 April. A total of 692 individuals were air repatriated to various southern states.
- CHF is expected to hand over three vocational training centers in Lobonok, Liriya, and Mangalla Payams to the Ministries of Labor and Education to accelerate reintegration.

Eastern Equatoria

Jonglei

- The Old Fangak IDP assessment mission verified 2,746 IDPs (549 households), who are in urgent need of humanitarian assistance including food, shelter, NFIs, WASH amongst others.

Lakes

- UNICEF and Save the Children in South Sudan have already obtained tents for use as additional learning spaces and some scholastic materials, specifically to support the educational reintegration efforts.
- According to IOM/SSRRC tracking reports over 4,309 basic school age returnee children (2132 boys and 2177 girls) from 4 -17 years old have returned to Lakes State.

Northern Bahr el Ghazal

- IOM completed the installation of a drinking water system in Warawar.
- WFP is currently distributing two weeks food rations to returnees with NRC support. WFP will also distribute food to returnees that have not yet been served since they arrived in Mangar Akot, Aweil North County in January 2011.
- IOM reported that from 13 April a total of 204 households (766 individuals) have arrived in the state, mainly from South Darfur and South Kordofan states.

Unity

- In an UNOCHA led mission, UNMIS-RCSO, UNHCR, UNICEF, WHO, WFP, IOM, Solidarité International and SSRRC verified and registered 2,568 individuals (683 households) both spontaneous and GoSS organized returnees in Koch Payam and Boaw Payams in Koch County.

Western Bahr el Ghazal

- RCSO is following up on the situation of the 15 families (96 individuals) of spontaneous returnees who arrived in Wau on 4th April and are putting up at the Bahr Ghazal University to avoid formation of an IDP camp at the institutional premises.
- UNRCSO and UNHCR last week have been following the case of a returnee child (above 5 years) who was admitted at the Wau Teaching Hospital during an inter- agency nutrition assessment conducted in March. The child who was severely mal-nourished is gradually responding to treatment, but according to the doctor, he has another complications requiring further treatment. RCSO and UNHCR Community Service Officer Plans to meet with WHO and MSF – Spain to inform them about the situation and to see what support they could render.

Upper Nile

- RCSO continues to receive reports of returnees going back either to the north or moving to other neighboring counties such as Renk. Although the exact numbers are not clear such movements are notable in Makal County particularly in Malakal town which has in the recent past been a battle filed between the SPLA and militia forces.

Western Equatoria

- According to WHO, the nodding diseases that has for several years devastated Mundri East and West counties is spreading. With no apparent cure, the disease typically affects children under 10 years old. Cases have been diagnosed in two villages in Yambio town; Pazuwa village and Malakia with specific mapped cases as follows: 600 in Mundri East; 560 in Mundri West; 322 in Maridi; 1,156 in Mvolo and 3 in Ibba.
