What is gbvaor.net?

gbvaor.net is a website created by the Gender-Based Violence (GBV) Area of Responsibility (AoR) in order to promote learning amongst field and global level practitioners. It contains:

- An introductory homepage and latest updates on the activities of the GBV AoR.

- A section dedicated to **Tools and Resources** for GBV practitioners working in emergency contexts. This section covers a range of key technical areas, has a search engine and provides useful links to other resources.

- A **Technical Support** section through which technical advice from experts working on GBV in the emergencies.


- An **Events and Trainings** section listing all upcoming and recently completed trainings and events in the GBV sector.

- A section dedicated to the most updated version of the **GBV AoR Work Plan**, with easy referencing to each activity, and the six GBV AoR task teams.

- A page referencing **GBV Vacancies**, including job opportunities, short-term consultancies internships, and other job opportunities.

- A section dedicated to the **GBV AoR Rapid Response Team**, and the latest updates on deployments, missions, activities and information on each member, as well as answers to frequently asked questions.

- **Country pages** providing information on new and ongoing emergencies, key field-level working group documents as well as key lessons that are emerging from countries working to address GBV-related coordination and prevention and response programming.
