



# MALI: Humanitarian Snapshot (as of 23 January 2013)

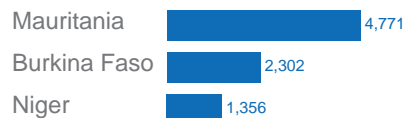
While military operations are ongoing in northern and central areas of Mali, the humanitarian situation continues to deteriorate. Humanitarian access has become more limited and the security situation had led some humanitarian partners to close or reduce activities, including in areas previously considered secure, like Kayes and Segou. Humanitarian partners do their utmost to assess the situation and respond to the most urgent needs.

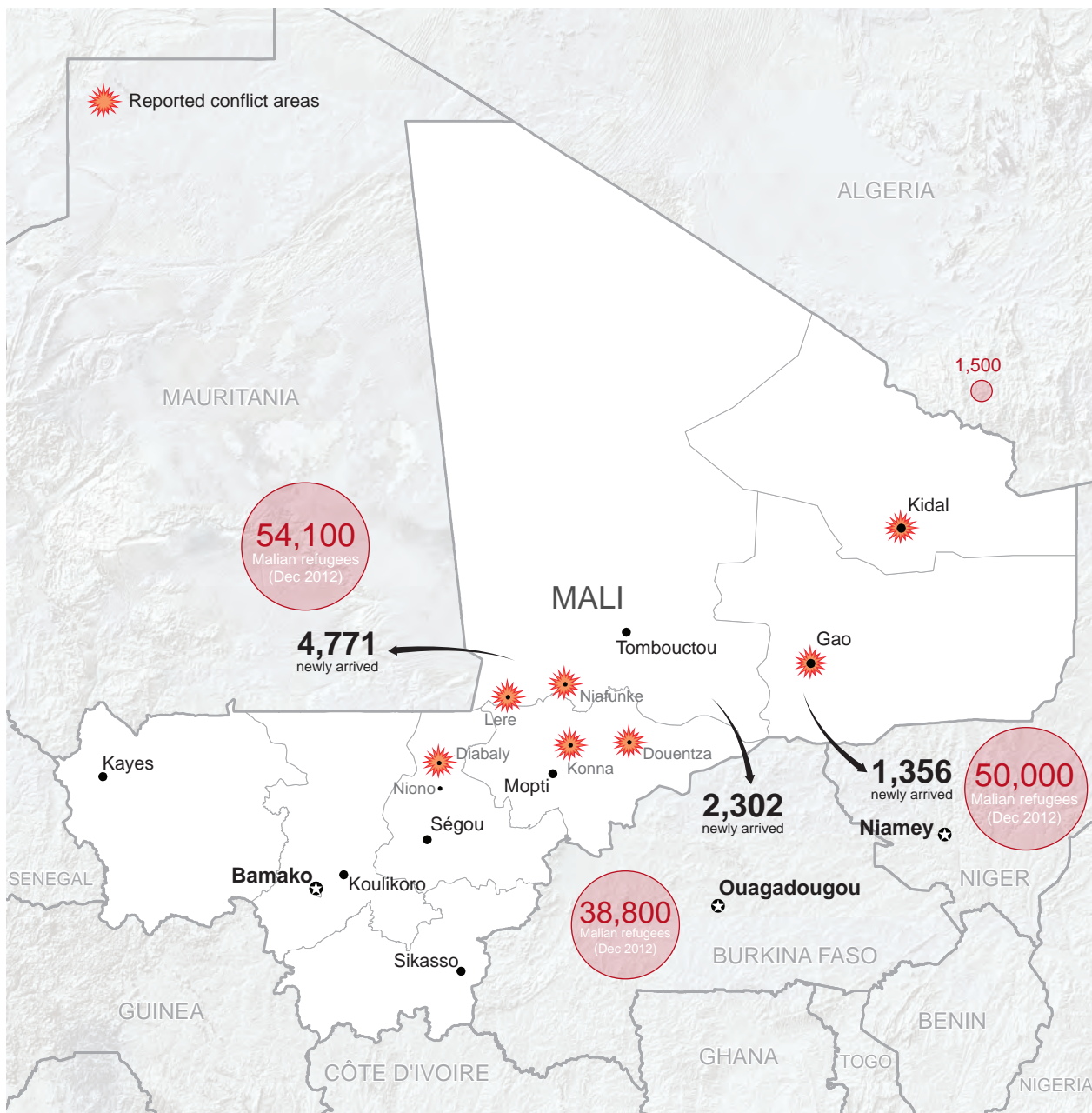
## INTERNALLY DISPLACED PERSONS

## HUMANITARIAN ACCESS



- Military operations reportedly ongoing around Mopti, Konna and Douentza

- **No** UN presence in the regions of Kayes, Segou and Mopti\*

- **No fighting** reported in Diabaly as of 22 January

- **No new movements** reported by partners as of 22 January in the regions of Timbuktu and Gao. All reported movements are related to support to the health facilities in the cities of Gao and Timbuktu.

- As of 22 January there are **no** commercial and humanitarian movements reported between Gao and Kidal

- Phone network **is functioning** in Kidal but not in Gao and Timbuktu (as of 22 January)

- As of 23 January the border between Mali and Algeria remains **closed**
