

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon “KIKO” as of 13 September 2021, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued at 12:00 PM on 10 September 2021, the Southwest Monsoon as enhanced by Typhoon “Kiko” will bring cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms over Western Visayas, Palawan and Occidental Mindoro while Metro Manila and rest of the country will have partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms. However, based on the Weather Advisory No. 9 (Final) issued at 11:00 PM on 12 September 2021, the effect of the “Habagat” (Southwest Monsoon) has weakened. Hence, this weather system will continue to bring light to moderate rains over Ilocos Region, Batanes, Babuyan Group of Islands, Abra, Benguet, Zambales, and Bataan in the next 24 hours. Typhoon “Kiko” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on the same day.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **4,738 families** or **18,818 persons** were affected by the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon “Kiko” in **14 Barangays** in **Regions III** and **MIMAROPA** (see Table 1).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Centers

There are **62 families** or **226 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **10 evacuation centers** in **Regions III** and **MIMAROPA** (see Table 2).

#### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱403.15 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD-Central Office.
- ₱8.3 million available at DSWD-FOs III and MIMAROPA.
- ₱35.3 million in other DSWD-FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to SWM enhanced by TY Kiko through inter-FO augmentation.

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 56,081 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 43,447 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 12,634 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Response Center (VDRC), Cebu City.
- 51,345 FFPs available at DSWD-FO's III and MIMAROPA.
- 281,399 FFPs in other DSWD-FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to SWM enhanced by TY Kiko through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱631.8 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD-FO warehouses countrywide.
