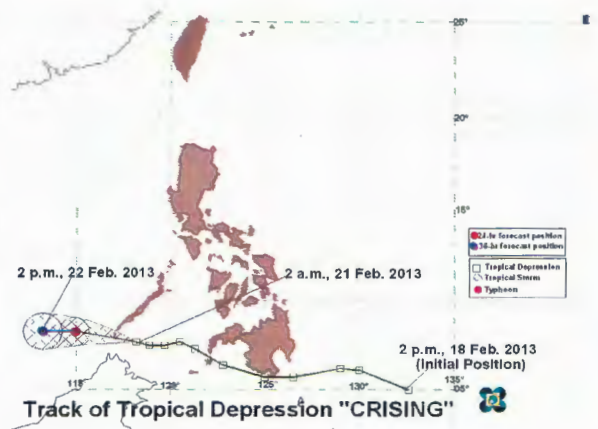

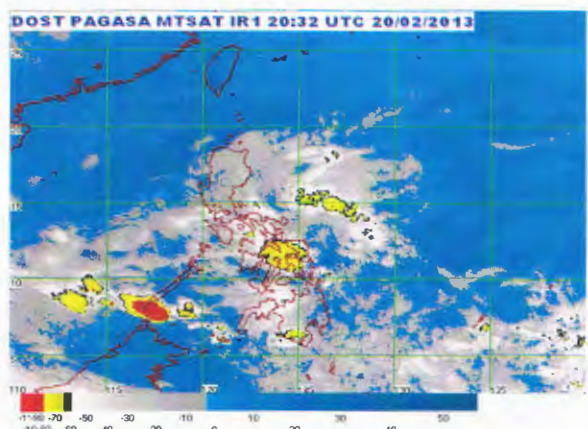
**I. WEATHER SITUATION:**

**TROPICAL DEPRESSION "CRISING" CONTINUES TO MOVE WEST NORTHWEST CLOSER TO SOUTHERN PALAWAN.**

## Areas Having Public Storm Warning Signal

	Southern Palawan

- Residents living in low lying and mountainous areas under public storm warning signal #1 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Estimated rainfall amount is from 5 - 15 mm per hour (moderate to heavy) over MIMAROPA, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, Eastern Visayas, Caraga and Northern Mindanao.
- Fishing boats and other small seacrafts are advised not to venture out into the seaboards of Northern and Southern Luzon and the eastern seaboards of Central Luzon and Visayas.

## II. EFFECTS

### A. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB A)

- **As of 21 February 2013**, a total of **25,350** families/**120,269** persons were affected in **80** barangays of Regions IX, X and XI, XII.
- Total number of evacuation centers: Seven (7) in Regions IX, X, XI and XII.

Inside **7** ECs: **864** affected families/**3,950** persons.

### B. ROADS AND BRIDGES (TAB B)

- As of 20 February 2013, a total of **seven (7)** roads and six (6) bridges were affected in Regions VIII, X, XI and XIII (CARAGA).

#### D. INCIDENTS MONITORED

- A landslide incident occurred in Barangay Malasalug, Sapad, Lanao del Norte. One (1) residential house was totally damaged, injuring two (2) of the four people residing in Nacua Residence, namely: Maria Nacua, 20 y/o and Dodong Nacua 8 y/o.
- Two (2) landslide incidents were monitored at Brgy. Villa Solidaridad, Baybay, Leyte and Brgy. Liberacion, Mahaplag, Leyte (Baybay-Tacloban) were fallen debris covered the major roads rendering it impassable for atleast 2 hours. The affected roads have already been cleared up and are already passable to the transporting public.
- Flooding also occurred in the municipalities of Palo, Sta. Fe and Abuyog, Leyte. **Flooded areas in Sta. Fe and Abuyog, Leyte have already subsided.**
- On or about 9:00 AM, 19 February 2013, a flashflood incident occurred at Brgy. Cabagayan, Tarragona, Davao Oriental where three (3) families were affected, one (1) house was totally damaged and one (1) foot bridge fell down at Sitio Mamoyapoy, Brgy. Lucatan, Tarragona, Davao Oriental.
- On or about 7:30 AM, 20 February 2013, a flashflood occurred in Datu Montawal, Maguindanao affecting five (5) barangays namely: Brgys. Bunit, Pagagawan, Nabundas, Maridagao and Datungkayo. Affected families were immediately transferred to higher grounds. No reported casualty.
- One (1) person in the name of Percela R. Apolinario, 63 years old was reported missing while crossing the river in Brgy. Magugba, Libacao, Aklan.
- **On or about 11:00 AM, 19 February 2013, one (1) fisherman named Suden Abdullah from Barangay Pinol, Maitum, Sarangani Province was reported missing due to big waves caused by Typhoon "Crising" while on his way home from fishing on the deep sea fronting Brgy. Pinol.**
- On or about 2:30 AM, 20 February 2013, an overflowing of creeks occurred in Brgys. Miputak, Dicayas and Sta. Isabela, Dipolog City due to heavy rain showers affecting nearby barangays. The families in affected barangays evacuated to higher grounds. At around 7:00 AM the water levels subsided and the affected families returned to their respective houses. There were no casualties reported.
- **On 19 February 2013 heavy rain occurred in Bukidnon Province which caused the overflowing of Pulangi River, Kabacan on 20 February 2013. Said incident caused flooding to seven (7) low lying barangays of Kabacan. There were no major damages and casualties reported, however a total number of 2,952 families were affected. At present, water level at Pulangi River is still increasing and will be expecting that more barangays will be affected. There were seven (7) barangays affected namely: Brgys. Kayaga, Salapungan, Pedtad, Buluan, Nangaan, Magatos and Cuyapon Kabacan, North Cotabato Province.**

#### E. DAMAGED HOUSES

- As of 19 February 2013, a total of eighty seven (87) houses were damaged; two (2) totally and eighty five (85) partially

## F. STATUS OF WATERWAYS

- As of 1:00 PM, 20 February 2013, at New Batangan Bridge, Barangay Batangan, Valencia City, the water is at Level 10 (10 feet) which is near critical level. The normal level is 3 ft while critical level is 10.5 ft. The families from Brgys. Batangan, Bintilan, Maapag and Katumbalan, Valencia City were pre-emptively evacuated and temporarily sheltered at the covered courts of the respective barangays. The Pulangi Dam is the hydro electric power plant being managed by the National Power Corporation.
- As of **10:00 AM, 20 February 2013**, the water level in Agusan River rises to **3.10** meters at Alert level **3**.

## III. PREPAREDNESS MEASURES

### EMERGENCY PREPAREDENESS AND RESPONSE:

#### NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS

##### NDRRMC

- **NDRRMC Operations Center is on RED ALERT Status effective on 05:00PM, 18 February 2013** for continuously monitoring and disseminating Weather Bulletins/Advisories, Gale Warnings, General Flood Advisories, and 24-Hour Public Weather Forecasts to all RDRRMCs/OCDRCs through SMS, facsimile and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels; and directed RDRRMCs concerned



through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective areas of responsibility (AOR)

## PNP

### REGION IV-B

- **Regional Tactical Operation Center (RTOC)** converted to Regional Disaster Operation Center (RDOC) effective 8:00 PM, 19 February 2013
- PRO IV-B component of the DRRMC was activated regionwide, alert personnel of affected PPOs/CPO are on standby; ready for deployment
- Coordination is being undertaken with the RDRRMC

### REGION X

- **PNP Sapad** personnel immediately responded to the incident and extricate the landslide victims.

## DOH

### REGION IV-B

- Prepositioned medicines in MIMAROPA – CHD Extensions Offices amounting to Palawan - PhP34,925.41, Romblon - PhP116,535.32, Marinduque - PhP291,918.60, Occidental Mindoro – PhP 3,125.00 and Oriental Mindoro PhP188,330.65

### REGION XII

- On Code White Alert and activated its Opcon; prepositioned medicines for all provinces in the region and closely monitoring health centers in the region; assisted OCD in the dissemination of weather and warning advisories to local HEMS.

## PAG-ASA

- Disseminated Weather Bulletins/Advisories, Gale Warnings and 24-Hour Public Weather Forecasts

## DSWD

- **DSWD FOs IX, X, XI, XII, ARMM and CARAGA QRT and SWAD Team** were alerted and advised to closely monitor the situation, in particular areas prone to landslide and flashflood within their jurisdictions. And to provide reports on the status of their standby funds and stockpile and on any eventualities.
- Mobilized the Regional QRT and Provincial-based SWAD teams to assist the LGU-affected areas in the disaster operations.
- Detailed DSWD-CO personnel at the NDRRMC Operation Center for coordination purposes as well as to address issues of DSWD concerns.
- Provided P2.25 million worth of 9,000 family food packs @ P250.00/pack to LGUs-Kapalong, Asuncion and Dujali, all in the province of Davao del Norte.
- Prepositioned P62 million worth of emergency relief resources consisting of standby funds (PhP15.53 million), 27,337 family food packs (9.9 million), other food items (P28.8 million) and NFIs (8.5 million) in all FOs lying along the path of Tropical Depression “Crising”

- Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) is closely coordinating with concerned DSWD-FOs for significant reports caused by the weather disturbance.
- PSWDO Davao Oriental and Compostela Valley distributed relief packs to the affected families.

#### PIA

- Assisted Regions XII and XIII (CARAGA) in dissemination of warning advisories to the general public through "PIA Text Blast"

#### DPWH

- Regions IV-B, XII and XIII (CARAGA) strategically positioned all maintenance crews/equipment to areas considered prone to floods, landslide and road slips. District DRRMTS already activated in anticipation of the forecasted Tropical Depression "Crising" that might hit within our area of responsibility.

#### PCG

- Prepositioned four (4) vessels for possible deployment: SARV 3504 moored at Dole Wharf, Gen Santos City; MCS 3005 moored at AMR shipyard, Zamboanga City; MCS 3009 moored at Ben Go Baliwasan Seaside Zamboanga, and; DF-315 moored at Davao.
- **PCG units in the area are on heightened alert and continuously monitoring the development and effects of the weather disturbance to ensure that regulations on prohibiting the movement of vessels in the affected areas are strictly enforced.**

#### PRC

##### REGION X

- Philippine Red Cross provided Food and Non Food items to the evacuees.

### REGIONAL PREPAREDNESS

#### OCDRCs IV-B, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XII, XIII (CARAGA) and BASULTA

- Disseminated 24 Hour Public Weather Forecast and Weather Advisories through SMS and facsimile to the RDRRMC member-agencies, Local DRRMCs and local radio/TV stations in the region, coordinates with RDRRMCs and LDRRMCs re situation in their area of responsibilities and preparedness activities to be undertaken and maintains 24/7 duty personnel to monitor LDRRMCs and concerned agencies regarding any untoward incidents and actions taken.

#### OCDRC VIII

- **MDRRMC Sta. Fe, Leyte** is continuously monitoring and conducting inspection on flood prone areas.
- **CDRRMO Tacloban and TOG 8-PAF** to conduct rescue evacuation on the affected residents in Palanog, Tacloban City.

#### OCDRC IX

- **OCDRC IX** operations center continuously monitoring the situation and coordinates with the PDRRMCs for any development.
- **CDRRMO of Dipolog City** immediately went to the affected areas and assisted the residents.
- **PDRRMCs, CDRRMCs and MDRRMCs** continuously monitoring and releasing early warning signals to all individuals.



#### OCDRC X

- Landslide victims were brought immediately to Lanao del Norte Hospital-Kapatagan for further treatment of injuries sustained.
- Sapad MDRRMC and Lanao del Norte PDRRMC Emergency Response Team verified the incident.
- Lanao del Norte PDRRMC and Sapad MDRRMC immediately responded to the incident.
- Regional Health Unit provided immediate first aid before the landslide victims were brought to Lanao del Norte Hospital – Kapatagan for further treatment of injuries sustained.
- Sapad MDRRMC and Poblacion BDRRMC facilitated the evacuation of the affected families.
- Provincial Government of Lanao del Norte provided Food and Non Food items to the evacuees.

#### OCDRC XI

- **OCD XI** is on Red Alert Status.
- **OCD XI** headed by Dir. Liza R. Mazo conducted survey of the affected areas, provided rescue equipments for augmentation in the conduct of rescue operations to the affected areas.
- **PDRRMC Davao Oriental and Compostela Valley** together with MDRRMs conducted pre-emptive evacuation to the affected families and continuously monitoring the affected areas.
- Search and rescue resources from response agencies and LGUs were prepositioned and on standby for possible deployment.
- **MDRRMC Kapalong Search and Rescue (KARES)** has been activated.
- **PDRRMC Davao del Norte** together with the **MDRRMC Kapalong** distributed relief goods to the affected families.
- **RDANA Team** conducted assessment and validation.

#### OCDRC XII

- Coordinates and alerts RDRRMCs and LDRRMCs for possible occurrence of any emergency in their AOR.
- **PDRRMO North Cotabato and MDRRMC Kabacan are closely monitoring the area.**
- **MDRRMC Kabacan immediately conducted ocular survey in the area, and are still conducting damage assessment and needs analysis.**
- **MSWDO and Department of Agriculture conducted ocular inspection and validation.**
- **OCD XII coordinated with the PDRRMO North Cotabato and MDRRMC Kabacan with regards to the situation in the area.**
- **MDRRMC Maitum coordinated to BDRRMC Pinol.**
- **RDRRMC XII Operations Center coordinated to MDRRMC Maitum Action Officer, Ms. Nelia Quimsing.**

#### OCDRC XIII (CARAGA)

- **PDRRMC Surigao del Sur** convened to prepare for the possible impact of TD Crising in their AOR.
  - **Search and Emergency Response Team of Surigao Sur (SERTSS)** on standby at OpCen and deployed for area validation.
