TROPICAL CYCLONE WINSTON  
SITUATION REPORT 45 of 02/03/2016

The purpose of this report is to provide the update on the current operations undertaken after TC Winston.

This Situation Report is issued by the National Emergency Operation Centre and covers the period from 0800 to 1600 hours on 02/03/2016. Updates in this report summarise all reports and briefs submitted from various EOC's in the four divisions.

### 1.0 HIGHLIGHTS OF LAST 12 HOURS

- ❖ Accident at Wailotua - A container truck transporting Sodium Cyanide went off the road in Wailotua, Wainbuka yesterday. Clearance of the container continues today where Police Korovou and Fire officers have secured the area last night. Spillage assessment will continue today.

The driver of the truck has been hospitalised and the General Manager for M.Y Group of Companies was detained by the police officers in the Nausori Police Station for questioning.

- ❖ *MV Iloilovatu and Vatulawa* departed Suva at 2345hrs from Suva for Taveuni. Ration scale for 1 month. *Iloilo Vatulawa* left Suva at for Nabouwalu & further to Savusavu. Ration Scale is for 2 weeks both for south Bua/Cakaudrove. All rations unloaded in Taveuni to be accounted and ration scale for a month provided to DOT with remaining rations to be dropped at Savusavu.

### 1.1 STATUS SUMMARY

Number of deaths in the four divisions remains the same. There is however an increase in the number of evacuees although there has been a slight decrease in the evacuation centres.

## 2.0 DIVISIONAL UPDATES

---

Brief summary of updates are below and the stats for the breakdown of the number of evacuation centres, evacuees and the food rations distributed is attached as **APPENDIX 1**:

### 2.1 CENTRAL DIVISION

---

Ration distribution team tasked to distribute food at the following villages in the Province of Tailevu returned at 12.45am this morning:

- Nabulini
- Nailega
- Bucalevu
- Naibita
- Wailevu

Ration distributions has been carried out to Nakorosule and Waibalavu in the province of Naitasiri.

## 2.2 EASTERN DIVISION

---

### KORO

- The Military Personnel in Koro is requesting for a Generator to provide power for deep freezer, lights and equipment in the operation room.
- Assistant District Officer Koro is requesting for:
  - 1) Six (6) handsets of VHS radio,
  - 2) 1x 200ltrs premix,
  - 3) Engine oil and
  - 4) Chainsaw file.

The items listed above from 2-4 are to be used for the chainsaw.

- Assistant District Koro has confirmed that the people parting Koro are not taking the ration with them, furthermore he is still waiting for the four (4) tyres and the tyre compressor he had requested a few days ago

### VANUABALAVU

- The Assessment Team has returned from Mago Island and the Island owner has confirmed that he will rebuild the damages, though they were unable to scope Naitauba Island because of the restrictions instated on the Island. The MV Cagivou will depart Vanuabalavu today at 1200hrs and en-route to Suva they will dispatch the rations for Tuvuca. COMMISSIONER EASTERN DIVISION Situation Report No.36 [TC WINSTON] (as of 0800hours, 02/03/2016)
- Some Civil Servants in Vanuabalavu will be travelling on-board the MV Cagivou to replenish basic items in Suva.

### OVALAU

- The Honorable Prime Minister will be travelling to Ovalau today by Patterson Shipping departing Natovi Jetty at 1500hrs

## 2.3 WESTERN DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

---

- Colleagues for helicopter to carryout survey at Vakacereivalu Memorial School to be put on hold
- Receive SITREP from Ra EOC as at 0600hrs 02/03/2016 ( attached)
- Distribution of one month ration has begun today in the Province of Ra.

- District teams are continuing with the supply of tents to the schools which are still used as EC's. These tents are distributed to the evacuees for the setting up of their temporary shelter.

## 2.4 NORTHERN DIVISION STATUS

---

The Northern Division has managed to restore almost all essential services. Government agencies on the ground are coordinating well with Divisional EOC except for Taveuni where the communication is partly restored. We hope that temporary relief supplies are taken ASAP to the worst stricken villages for them to survive for the time being while waiting for the rations to be distributed after the Detailed Assessment is done.

### 3.0.6 Water Authority of Fiji

- Continuous supply of water to affected areas from the WAF since most affected area has covered by them.
- Food ration distribution to continue as planned.
- WAF to continue restoration of water supply.
- All residents living near the Wainibuka River have been advised against using water from the river for drinking, washing and other needs.

### 3.0.7 Ministry of Fisheries

- No report from the Ministry of Fisheries during this shift.

### 3.0.8 Ministry of Education

- A total of 188 schools are still closed as of Wednesday 02nd March. Of these 188 schools, 95 schools are still being used as evacuation centres, with 63 schools completely destroyed. A total of 202 schools have been damaged.

### 3.0.9 Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA)

- Out of the 901 primary and secondary schools at 103 schools (11%) are being used as evacuation centres.
- 38% of all healthcare facilities have been damaged.
- 26,125 people in the most affected areas, (7.5% of the estimated population in these areas), have been provided with WAS supplies to ensure safe drinking water and sanitation.
- The Emergency Coordinator Osnat Lubrani joined Fiji's Ambassador for Climate Change Amena Yauvoli in visiting the cyclone hit islands of Koro in the Lomaiviti Group.

### 3.0.10 Ministry of Information Technology and Computing Services

- Telecommunications
  - Both mobile telcos approaching 100% coverage, Vodafone high 90s and Digicel in 80s.
  - TFL main issue is the Southridge line - once that is complete, comms can reach the rest of Viti Levu
  - The major remaining challenge is power, followed by accessibility of heavy equipment to severely damaged sites
- For consideration:
  - use of USO funding to support repair and infrastructure costs in rural and maritime areas
  - increased security/policing of towers running generators (esp Koro where fuel is being stolen)
- Broadcasters
  - AM radio coverage good, FM patchy and similar to TV coverage
  - Mai TV still offline, may be able to share FBC infrastructure for a short period
  - FBC and Fiji One both have good urban coverage but little in e.g. Rakiraki area
  - Power and heavy vehicle access are the main challenges
  - Broadcasters and telcos looking at possible infrastructure sharing
  - Accelerating digital TV rollout will have an impact on coverage, also on capital investment plans
- Information Technology
  - Oracle engaged to help rapidly build logistics management (workflow automation) tools. Need access to planning personnel to confirm scope and shape of the tools



### 3.0.11 Ministry of Youth and Sports

#### Western Division

- Colleagues formed part of a team in Yasawa Islands conducting IDA and distributing rations returning to Lautoka today.
- Colleagues assisted with ration distribution for the Lautoka district also distributing tents and tarpaulins for Vitogo and Raviravi areas.
- Colleagues staffed the office and worked on respective assigned tasks.
- Six staff and 3 vehicles still fully engaged at the EOC.
- YTC- Nasau truck used for ration distribution.
- Fiji National Sports Commission Team from Suva and Lautoka assisted in food distribution using 2 vehicles.

#### Northern Division

- Nagigi, Navakaka and Yaroi youths cleaned up at Naweni district school in Savusavu; 15 pax continued yesterday while the rest assisted at their own villages.
- Youth Administrator Cakaudrove is one of the team leaders for IDA/DDA assessment on the island. Currently they are distributing rations to evacuation centres.
- Youths on the island are mobilising themselves during rescue efforts and cleaning up their respective villages.
- Lavena youth assisted to clear away road debris from Lavena to Bouma to allow traffic to flow.
- Qeleni youths rescued 5 families from their village to evacuation centre during the height of cyclone.
- Nasawa youths (Lamini village) completed construction of 3 temporary shelters for village elders to live in; all 7 houses in the small village destroyed.
- YAs have also advised youths to stand-by and assist in food distribution (unloading/loading) in their own villages in Taveuni during their DDA/distribution rounds.
- The NFA moved from YTC Naqere back to their station in Savusavu. The YTC has now been cleaned and fumigated in preparation for food to arrive.
- Youth from Vatulele, Vuadomo and Nakoso finished cleaning up Savusavu secondary school.
- Youths from "Can Do Generation" in Labasa assisted food packing and distribution work with Global Compassion.
- 35 youths from Kilaka, Nakorovou completed the first day of clean up at Kubulau district school and will continue till 4 March 2016 as the quarters were destroyed and about 80% of the classrooms. A chain saw will be delivered to help the process today.
- About 40 youths and others from Naruwai completed the clean-up of Vuya district school and will begin at Nadi district school today.
- A ration distribution team covered 11 villages in Kubulau district. A total of 295 households were assisted but 75 homes were completely destroyed.

#### Eastern Division

- The following areas were contacted with landline numbers available and communication has improved in some areas.
  1. Vanuaso village in Gau Island, Lomaiviti  
 Cyclone damage was least compared to tidal waves that hit the village badly. While dwelling houses were able to stand the big waves triggered by an earthquake, toilets and kitchens were washed away.  
  
 Crops including yaqona were damaged because they were susceptible to strong winds.  
  
 Youths are now fully engaged in the rehabilitation program by using the existing planting material available. Staple food such as cassava has already changed its texture and color due to the damage that was sustained.  
  
 Sand brought by tidal waves filled the school building normal class was reportedly back on Monday.
  2. Kade village, Cawa district, Koro, Lomaiviti  
 One of the worst hit areas is considering the possibility of relocating to a new site as reported by Turaganikoro. The village is one of the most vulnerable to tsunamis, hurricanes and earthquakes. Only one house was apparently spared from the atrocities of the cyclone.  
  
 A fuel retail business assisted from the Youth Grant Programme last year was damaged but they still managed to operate.  
  
 Root crops were badly damaged and face a shortage of supply and fortunate that food rations have arrived.  
  
 Youths are still engaged in the cleaning the village compound and they have not begun replanting crops.  
  
 Primary schools remained closed.
  3. Batiki Island, Lomaiviti  
 Another of the worst hit areas (cyclone and tidal waves) and only the village church was spared and villagers are putting together whatever materials they have collected to provide shelter for their families. Root crops and yaqona are badly affected and food shortages will be experienced once the food rations delivered are finished.  
  
 Youth groups have engaged in the cleaning up and also replanting of crops from existing planting materials.
  4. Lau Group  
 Contact through mobile seems to be impossible as there seems to be no power.

## Central Division

- Seedlings are ready to be planted at the YTC Sigatoka and can also be distributed to youth clubs. Once the preparations are complete, youth clubs will be asked to start preparing the land for planting.
- Training for the “Youth Feed the Nation” programme will be done on 4 March 2016 at UTC Valelevu where trainees will plant seeds.

## Headquarters

- 6 colleagues who have worked at the NEOC have been given a few days to return to regular work before reporting again next week.
- A list of trained and trainee carpenters is being compiled for possible deployment through the NEOC and relevant Ministries.
- After discussions with UNICEF, psychosocial “first aid” has been included in training for 15 newly appointed youth administrators this week.
- A proposal is being prepared for consideration by the UN Office on Sport for Development and Peace in consultation with the Ministry of Education and other interested Ministries have been invited to contribute. This will be presented as part of the rebuilding Fiji approach. Other proposals from NGOs and possibly governments are expected to compete against our proposal.

**3.0.13 Ministry of Infrastructure and Transport**

Highlights in the last 24 hours are:

- 93 officers deployed to different locations in the 3 divisions.
- Status of GSS ships deployed as of 02/03/16:
  - Barge MLC Sigavou** - ETA Taveuni 1400hrs  
To distribute food rations, fuel drums and fresh water tanks  
Delivery of water to Yanuca and Yacata
  - Barge MLC Vunilagi** - ETA Lautoka 1600hrs Wed 02/03
  - MV Iloilovatu** - ETA Taveuni 1400hrs
  - MV Cagivou** - At Vanua Balavu, have supplied fresh water to Avea, Susui and Cikobia ETD Vanua Balavu Wed 02/03 time TBC
  - MLC Vatulawa** - ETA Nabouwalu 1700hrs to distribute food rations
- Franchise Trip departed for Northern Lau on 28.2.16 (MV Sea Rakino) carrying 8 tons of Cargo for NDMO;
- 17 villages Diesel Schemes in Koro (793 houses) has been confirmed as completely damaged with a total estimate cost of \$1M.
- 2 Wind monitoring systems confirmed to be damaged and 3 yet to be assessed due to accessibility problems to the sites.
- 1455 Solar Home Systems assessed and 449 damaged at an estimated cost of \$900,000.
- 7 MET facilities sustained damages at an estimated cost of \$700,000.

### 3.0.14 Fiji Council of Social Services

The NGO Disaster and Coordination Centre (NDCIC) continues to work with relevant government authorities leading the response to support the implementation of a simple system for duty and VAT exemption.

### 3.0.15 Ministry of Agriculture

#### **FINDINGS/RECOMMENDATIONS**

- The team kindly recommends that the Divisional EOC's be advised to provide a detailed update on the SIT-STATS as the stats that are coming in are usually lumped together and there is no breakdown of these stats.
- We request if the Divisional EOC can be advised to update only on changes that have taken place. In some cases, the data received remains the same for 2-3 SITREPS especially in data for food rations. It would be convenient if they just inform that there are no changes.
- That when teams send over their stats please highlight the changes if any and if there haven't been any updated information that please state so.
- The Team has also noticed that teams tend to not update the white boards and as such it creates confusion with the stats that the team is compiling and we end up calling the Divisions asking for the stats to be resent.

#### **1.     GROUND**

Rehabilitation stage begins here in the Ra Province. Villages in Nakorotubu-i-Wai and Bureiwai have received their tents to ease problems of acquiring shelter awaiting the distribution of their one month food rations to cater for their basic household needs. Men and women of the composite forces are now working tirelessly to fulfill existing problems left behind by TC Winston.

#### **2.     SITUATION**

Power has not been restored. Nubumakita to Nukulau Rd works are underway to be repaired by nightfall today. Higgins and Ministry Of Works are still working hard to clear up other inaccessible areas.

There are 25 Primary Schools still occupied as Evacuation Centers with 05 x Secondary Schools. Schools that are ready to open include Drauniivi Primary School, Sudha Primary, Nanuku Primary School, Navatu Primary, Naria Primary, Bureivanua District, Liwativale Primary School, Navitilevu Primary School, Wairuku primary School, Saivou District School. The opening of these schools is subject to a case by case basis. Total assistance rendered by NGO's continues to various villages and settlements in form of food packs, clothes and water.

Medical reps from Rakiraki Hospital are also putting in their best to solve all increasing post cyclone cases in the AO. The Hon PM, The Hon AG, The Hon Minister for local Govt, The Assistant Minister for DISMAC, Commissioner Western and members of the commissioner's office toured the Ra province and met with villagers and settlers that were affected by TC Winston. The entourage later stopped by EOC Ra Distribution Center before being briefed by Mr Patric Wardlaw of Higgins in regards to road clearing progress and Capt Rabuka on the Operation update in Ra. The PM as also briefed on the current situation on the ground in the Ra Province and later visited Nailuva Village in the interior of the Tikina Nailuva.

DISMAC has begun distribution operations into the previously inaccessible Tikina of Saivou and Nalawa, beginning with the first five villages in the Tikina makawa of Nailuva. The names of the villages are listed below:

- a.     Nararavou;
- b.     Nasavu;
- c.     Naqelecibi;
- d.     Nabalasere; and
- e.     Nailuva.

### 6. CONCLUSION

The Ra Province is being legging behind in terms of the distribution of rations. The main reason for this is the inaccessibility of roads into the interior of the Tikina of Nalawa and Saivou have been destroyed or partially destroyed. This will now charge with the opening up of Burelevu crossing, as well as the Nayaulevu crossing. The Higgins Road Construction team is doing a tremendous job in opening up these access roads. The China Railway Company has also arrived in AOR with heavy machinery and is assisting Higgins in the Clearance of inaccessible routes and repairing the damaged crossing. The opening up of the access roads will mean that relief ops will now be able to cover the remaining 25 percent still pending in the overall rehabilitation objective.

Troops are well and morale is high.
