11:56 local time - 25 April 2015 Epicenter: Lamjung District (north-west) of Kathmandu

4,358

Government reports **4,358 deaths** & **8,174 injured**, numbers expected to increase.

8 million

More than **8 million people** affected by the Nepal earthquake.

530,000

The Government of Nepal estimates that **530,000 houses were damaged** and another **70,000 destroyed** during the earthquake.

16

The Government of Nepal identified **16 camps in Kathmandu valley**. Formal camp service delivery mechanisms and providers still required.

90%

Up to **90 per cent** of health facilities in **Ramechapp, Nuwakot, Sindhupalchowk and Gorkha** severely damaged. People injured from Sindhupalchowk and Dhading are being airlifted to Dhulikhel Hospital.

Radio programming is communicating **basic lifeline messaging** via shortwave frequency reaching affected people nationwide.

24 HRS

Kathmandu International Airport (KTM) is open 24 hours with support from WFP and DHL and serves as the main logistics hub.

Key immediate needs include **food, shelter, WASH**, as well as **medical tents, medication, surgical kits and body bags**. Fuel reserves running low.

Foreign medical teams (FMTs) set up temporary hospital facilities in affected areas. Additional FMT support on stand by as requested by the government.

8,000

Agencies distributed **8,000 tarpaulin** and **1,000 shelter kits** to affected districts. Distribution of aid set to increase in coming days.

20,000 MT

12 districts prioritized for the provision of food assistance. Around **20,000 MT of food is needed per month** to support people affected by the earthquake.
