### Humanitarian Context

**Commercial and import uncertainty** :Based upon the [latest](#) UN snapshot on Shipping, Food and Fuel imports, the costs for the equivalent of the minimum food staples is 24% higher than pre-crisis levels. In addition, there are worrying signs for food availability in country with significant reductions in ships entering Yemen ports overall. The level of import of fuel is at 39%, which is well below the overall needs in country. WFP released a [briefing](#) noting that in the worst case scenario, the numbers of food insecure are likely to increase beyond 21 million people.

**Non-payment of government salaries:** Public-sector salaries have not been paid (or partially paid) since August. It is anticipated within the humanitarian community that the non-payment of government salaries over time will increase bureaucratic delays, further shrink access and result in increased crime and lawlessness.

## Field Program Activities

### HAJJAH AND AL HUDAYDAH

INDIVIDUALS ASSISTED: **604,212**

LOCATIONS: Az Zuhrah, Al Sukhnah, Hays (Al Hudaydah), Abs, Haradh, Hayran (Hajjah)

### Community Engagement and Coordination:

A total of 271 community awareness sessions were implemented in Abs and Hiran, the main topic was hand washing at critical time, and the prevention from diseases such as cholera and scabies where total participants reached 4,878 HHs (34,146 individuals :7,314 male, 7,027 female, 10,100 boys and 9,704 girls). Key aired messages continued in the last two weeks through Hajjah Radio Station reaching all the population across Hajjah governorate. This includes daily flashes, talk shows and especial weekly episodes.

In addition, A total of 336 community engagement and mobilization campaigns were implemented on water conservation practice and behaviors change (Water conservation, proper water storage, using different water sources, and different usage of water. Total participants 4,044 individual beneficiaries (6,064 male, 5,826 female, 8,374 boys and 8,045 girls)



### Food Security

**Unconditional Cash Transfer UCT :** Oxfam EFSVL Hajjah team implemented the first and the second installments of unconditional cash transfer (October and November 2016 payments ) which distributed in one round .Total of 2012 HHs (598 female headed HHs and 1414 male headed HHs) were paid out of the total planned 2020 under ECHO and DFID grant. The remaining are 8 beneficiaries HHs (5 of them did not show up yet while 3 HHs are duplicated. Each household beneficiary received an amount of YER 49,000 (equivalents to 196 (98 USD per 1 month ) to meet 80 % of the food basket cost . The distribution was conducted in a very organized process with full adherence to the security guidelines to avoid exposing the beneficiaries and staff to any unpredictable risk.

**Cash Transfer for livelihoods protection :** The first and the second installments of cash distribution for livelihoods protection (October and November payments which distributed in one round ) was implemented and served 60 Female – headed HHs in the targeted villages of Abs district in Hajjah governorate . Each Household beneficiary received an amount of 51000 YER (equivalents to 204 USD) as a top up for protection their livelihoods assets . The distribution process went smoothly in partnership with YBRD (financial service provider) .

**Market Price Monitoring :** The team continued the market monitoring activity in Abs district. During reporting period Stability in the basic food commodities prices such as wheat flour .rice ,Sugar and v. Cooking oil was observed compared with the last reporting period due to stability in market supply . Beans prices decreased by 7 % due to increased market supply . Stability in diesel prices was observed while prices of Petrol decreased by 8 % in the fourth week of November compared with the last week . The different between petrol prices officially in the trading fuel stations and in the black markets are 7 % . The value of Yemeni Rail rate is the same as the last week at 250 / 1 USD in the official banks, while its value dropped to 305 YER per 1 USD in the black market with a serious problem in availability.

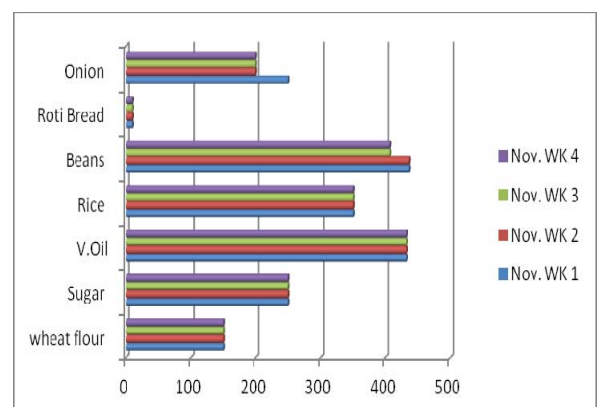


Figure 1 Market Price Change - Hajjah Nov. 2016



## WASH

**Water Trucking:** As a part of providing technical support to Bani Hassan Camp “MSF’s operation area”, Oxfam has continued providing treated trucked water to the camp with daily quantity of 277m<sup>3</sup> totalling to 4,155 m<sup>3</sup> of trucked water provided during this reporting period. Cumulatively, 32,686 m<sup>3</sup> of treated water was delivered so far benefiting 3,227 HHs represents 22,589 individuals (6,528 female; 6,642 male; 4,631 girls and 4,788 boys) from both IDPs and host community.

**Solar pumps:** As a part of support to rural water supply system for the sake of reducing O&M costs and improving the sustainability of water service in the targeted communities, the installation of one solar pump in Bani Hassan was completed totalling to 6 installed solar pumps.

**Rehabilitation of WSS:** As a part of water trucking exit strategy, rehabilitation of Bani Hassan, Barman, Muslaiba, Kedf Al-Muhrah and Al-Jamakhyah WSSs have been completed and all water tanks are now connected to the functional water supply network. In addition, rehabilitation of 14 water supply systems is under implementation while 9 WSSs are under procurement process.

**Sanitation:** Construction of 230 latrines in Al-Zuharh district has been completed. In Abs district 200 out of 400 latrines were installed while the remaining latrines still under installation. In addition, the required materials for decommissioning 100 latrines already delivered to the warehouse and it will be moved to the field next week.

**Solid Waste Management:** Abs cleaning fund completed the period agreed and signed with Oxfam for solid waste management in Abs district at village level with participation of 190 persons as casual workers. The total trips were implemented is 300 trips over the period from 26 September to 20 November 2016. In addition, a total of 192 cleaning campaigns lead by CHVs were implemented in Abs and Hayran for solid waste management at the houses and villages level with total participants of 2,688 HHs ( 18,816 individuals : 4,030 male 3,876 Female 5,566 boy and 5,348 girls).

### Public Health Promotion PHP

**Houses Visits :** During the reporting period, a total of 3,476 HHs (24,332 individuals: 5,212 male, 5,008 female, 7,197 boys and 6,915 girls) were visited by CHVs during this reporting period. In Abs and Hayran districts, results of house’s visits showed that 58% of houses have clean jerry cans and 42% have unclean jerry cans , 33% of houses observed with waste and garbage in and around their houses, 51% of households are washing their hands with water and soap, while 8% are washing hands with water. 33% of houses observed with faeces around their houses, 68% of Oxfam latrine were visited are in used, only 13% latrines with soap. Furthermore, results of visited houses showed that 702 HHs has acute non bloody diarrhea and 562 HHs in Bani Hassan affected by rashes suspected of being a scab. In addition, a total of 512 HHs (506 male, 106 female) in Abs received 1 Powder soap 2.5 kg and 6 pieces of antibacterial soap)

**Jerry can campaign:** A total of 206 jerry cans clean campaigns were implemented where 2,797 jerry cans cleaned with a number of beneficiaries of 1,854 HHs (12,978 individuals : 2,780 male 2,780 Female 3,839 boy and 3,688 girls).

**Hand Washing Campaigns:** During reporting period 324 hand washing demonstration campaigns were implemented in target areas through children activities, total beneficiaries reached was 3,888 HHs (15,785 individual : 8,050 boys and 7,735 girls).

### Cholera Response:

Oxfam Shafer is currently responding to cholera outbreak in Hajjah and Hodeidah with coordination with WASH cluster in Hodeidah governorate and HO in Hajjah governorate. A total 324 acute non bloody diarrhea cases were monitored (in Abs and Hayran districts) by 30<sup>th</sup> of November 2016.

## AMRAN

INDIVIDUALS ASSISTED: **57,757**

LOCATION: Khamir, Houth, Al-Qaflah and Bani Suraim

### Community Engagement and Coordination

A total of 20 persons trained attended a 2 days training ( 14 community mobilisers, 3 midwives from health office and 3 from CBO) the training topics covered communication skills, cholera prevention and control including cholera transmission, symptoms and prevention measurements, introduction to gender and protection, community mobilisation, monitoring and reporting of WASH activities, the pre test showed that 15% of participants has basic knowledge on WASH related diseases and this knowledge increased to 60% by the end of this training .



### Food Security

**Unconditional Cash Transfer UCT** : Under DIFD- Crises funds ,the EFSVL team has finalized collection of required beneficiaries data as a replacement for those IDP's who returned back to their original location and replaced them with new IDP's based on the agreed criteria, a total of 630 HHs has been replaced where 28 HHs out of them have been reached and received their 1<sup>st</sup> cash grant 24,500 YER while the rest will be reached by Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> Dec 2016 .On the other hand under malnourished beneficiaries category a total of 277 out of 450 families with malnourished children received the 1<sup>st</sup> UCT cycle, each HH got total of 24,500 YER (equivalent to 98 USD ) to meet 80% of the food basket cost ,they have also received 12 pieces of antibacterial soap .

**Cash for Work:** During reporting period EFSVL team have been finalized the village profiling , So far 6 targeted villages has been selected for the coming CFW proposed sachems , where the community were involved in identifying their needs and prioritized it with support from Oxfam integrated EFSVL and WASH team .

**Market Price Monitoring** : Throughout the last month the basic food commodities such as wheat flour, rice, Beans prices remain stable except sugar prices which decreased by 4% .The prices of vegetables such as potato and bananas remain stable , while price of onions increased by 5 % .Diesel and patrol prices remain stable as compared with last two weeks . The official rate of the YER against the USD remained the same (1 USD=YR 250), the exchange rate at the black market was between YR 305 and 309 / 1 USD.



### WASH

**Water Trucking** :Oxfam Continued the water trucking Supply for 5 IDPs camps in AL Qaflah district (DFID Crisis)

**Sanitation:** Dislodging activity is ongoing for 7 IDPs camps in Khamir, Houth, and AL-Qaflah (HPF) while the tender of construction of 6 new latrines in Houth camp has been finished and the contractor selected, now the process still wait for signing the contract .

#### Water Supply Scheme :

**Khamir water network section 1-** The rehabilitation works was completed and therefore 1,833 households (12,831 individual) are now connected to tap water.

**Khamir water network section 2-** The construction progress of 4 pumping rooms and 1 Reinforce Concrete Water tank has completed now. While the progress of supplying of pumping units (One submersible pump with generator and two horizontal pumps with engines funded by UNICEF) the PO has been issued and the tow selected supplier expected to start installing of those pumps in the mid of Dec 2016 .

**Other water supply** : The construction and installation of 5 Water Points with Steel Tanks in Khamir district funded by HPF is ongoing , So far three tanks out of 5 has been completed while the rest will be completed before mid of Dec 2016 .

**Hygiene Awareness rising:** The major activities during this reporting period focused on cholera prevention at community and school levels, community mobilisers and school committees supported by OXFAM staff conducted H.H visits and hygiene sessions focused on basic cholera transmission and prevention measures the overall awareness activities benefited total of 16,188 individuals (5,128 women, 3,379 men, 3,805 girls and 3,876 boys) while school activities directly benefited 2,616 boys and 2,300 girls from 6 schools in Khamir.

**Jerri can cleaning campaign:** as part of cholera prevention activities in IDPs camps targeted 398 HHs in Al-Qafla and Houth where a total of 145 Jerri cans were cleaned and while 303 Jerri cans found broken . A total of 308 individuals participated in this activity where OXFAM provided 27 detergent soap during the campaign which will be conducted on biweekly basis.

**Disease prevalence :** The overall health situation remained stable in the last weeks of November, however the community mobilisers surveillance indicated increasing of diseases by 0.9% such as malaria, cholera and respiratory infection, OXFAM is currently focusing on cholera prevention, while MSF is discussing malaria plan for risky areas.

## TAIZ

INDIVIDUALS ASSISTED: **153,898**

LOCATIONS: Al Modafar, Salah, Al Qahirah, Al-Taizyah, Alhawaban, Alturas and Al Shamayatayn

### Coordination and Community Engagement

Oxfam mobilized two teams for the disinfection of 115 water sources/ shallow wells in Maqbana district, and 640 storage tanks in the eight sub- districts of Maqbana district. Most of the shallow wells are located following a river embankment with high risk of contamination, where the highest number of suspected AWD and Cholera cases .



### Food Security

**Unconditional Cash Transfer :** EFSVL team along with YBRD team started the first round of Unconditional Cash Transfer in Al- Shamayatayn and Al-Taizyah Districts reaching 2,537 HHs(1,147 Female-headed and 1,390 Male-Headed) of the most vulnerable people of IDPs and host communities in 8 sub districts. Each household received an amount of 24,000 YER to meet their immediate needs.

**Market Price Monitoring :** The team continued in market price monitoring in Al-Shamaytayn district where it was observed that basic food commodities prices such as canned cooking oil, sugar and wheat flour were stable compared with the last reporting period , while there was around 5% drop in petrol and gas price .Dollar exchange rate increased from 304 YER per USD to 309 YER per 1 USD in the black market.

### WASH

**Water Trucking :**Oxfam continued provision of clean drinking water through water trucking in Al-Shamaytayn, Al-Qaherah, Al-Modafar, Salah and AL-Taizyah districts using exiting 114 water points and 9 schools. During reporting period Oxfam delivered 5,207,500 liters of clean water to around 132,410 beneficiaries (34,427 men, 33,103 women, 33,089 boys, 31,792 girls) with an average 3 liters of clean water per person per day.

**Water Supply Scheme:** As a part of water trucking exit strategy MoU has been signed with LWSC for maintenance of 33 generators sets, and the connection of 69 Oxfam water tanks from the main water network .

**Sanitation :** During reporting period the team managed to finish the De-sledging of identified 100 emergency latrines constructed by Oxfam, which reported full has been accomplished in Al-Taizyah district. In addition, beneficiaries and site selection is on going for the construction of 100 emergency pit latrines at IDP settlement in Al-Taizyah district and rehabilitation of three institutional latrines at schools at Al-Turba district.

**Hygiene promotion sessions:** During reporting period a total of 442 HHs ( 132 IDP and 310 Host communities ) have been reached via hygiene promotion sessions in Alhawaban and Al-Turba districts . In addition, a contact has been signed with GWQ ( local Oxfam partner) to carry out the implementation of hygiene promotions activity inside Taiz city

**Cholera Response :**

As a part of Cholera response Oxfam Taiz team proactively continued to participate in Cholera Task Force meetings in Taiz and Ibb governorates. As a lead WASH agent, Oxfam continues to provide technical and logistics support to Health offices for assessments. Oxfam also continues to facilitate CHVs refreshment training and work with GARWASP on disinfection of water sources. Oxfam facilitated a joint field visit with local HO to Maqbana district and visited health facilities and two sub-districts. Based on the findings of the field visit and other available information: Oxfam is targeting Alsaerah, Alaqhoz, Alhabebah, Almgahedah, Almaherah, Bani salah, Aladoof and Alwareef sub-districts in Maqbana district for disinfection of water at storage tanks and water sources in coordination with Taiz GARWASP.

**Key responses actions so far:**

- Water disinfected at 220 storage tanks (5 public tanks, 215 private tanks), at Al-Al-hawidah, Al-Aqhoz, Al-Magahidah sub-districts in Maqbanah district benefiting 766 HHs.
- Water disinfected at 10 water source dug-wells Al-Al-hawidah, Al-Aqhoz, Al-Magahidah sub-districts in Maqbanah district covering 262 HH.
- Water disinfected at 18 water tanks of Albarh sub-district health centre, and 4 water tanks of Al-Al-Ammer Health unit in (Al-Gamahirah sub district).
- 100 CHVS have been selected to support Cholera response in Maqbana.
- Water disinfected at storage tanks and 45 kg of HTH solution donated for general disinfection at Al-Berah health centre that is used as centre for suspected cholera and AWD cases.

## ADEN & south Total beneficiaries reached: 166,139

Oxfam team in Aden continued various activities in coordination with local communities in targeted areas in Aden & south . Some of the activities performed by Programme team with results achieved are listed below:

### PHE :

- Completed rehabilitation of water supply network in Sharman village in Lahj governorate through installation of 1,060 meter of GI pipelines and construction of 5 control chambers for regulation of water distribution system.
- Handed over three sites (Goal Maderm , Al-Musaimir and Alia Yaher in Lahj) in Lahj Governorate for rehabilitation of water supply systems and installation of water pumps and generators to the selected contractors.
- School latrines rehabilitation in Aden governorate has completed in 8 schools ( 62 latrines drop holes) out of 13 schools targeted for latrines rehabilitation.

### PHP :

- The team finalized beneficiaries list verification for hygiene kits distribution in Al-Dale'e and Al- Musaymir district in Lahj Governorate.
- Oxfam through School hygiene clubs implemented environmental cleaning campaign in four schools in Aden governorate ( Saif ben De yzsn , Al-basaten , Alshab , and Aden high school for girls) and one school ( Al-Faqeed Al-Wahbi School) in Al-Milah district of Lahj governorate
- The team implemented a drama show on Cholera infection, prevention measures and treatment , best hygiene practices and optimal use of latrines in Nashwan School and Balgess School for girls in Shiekh Othman districts of Aden governorate where total beneficiaries reached to 5,494 individuals as per below table :

### Cholera response:

- Completed all coordination aspects with MoPHP represented by Health Office, LWSC in regard to cholera response in Aden governorate and accordingly house to house awareness campaign will start Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> December.
- Cholera prevention and treatment awareness campaign implemented in 10 schools in Aden governorate through school hygiene clubs.
- Finalized assessment in two CTCs in Sheikh Othman and Al-Muala districts of Aden and identified needs for rehabilitation of sanitation facilities.
- Jointly with LWSC- Aden finalized a list of 31 wells and boreholes in Sheikh Othman and Dar Sa'ad district of Aden governorate for disinfection as part of the Cholera prevention camping.
