## Humanitarian Context

**Revised Yemen Humanitarian Response Plan (YHRP):** The YHRP was revised down from 1.8B \$ to 1.63B \$ to reach 12.6M people with lifesaving assistance. The revised YHRP figures represent a 7% decrease in the number of people targeted and 9.3% decrease in financial requirements. Despite this, humanitarian agencies hold that the scale of needs in Yemen remains enormous, and these changes do not reflect a change in context. Rather, they are guided by programme consolidation as a result of funding shortages, demonstrated performance to date and more precise needs information.

## Field Program Activities

### HAJJAH AND AL HUDAYDAH

INDIVIDUALS ASSISTED: **604,212**

LOCATIONS: Az Zuhrah, Al Sukhnah, Hays (Al Hodaydah), Abs, Haradh, Hayran (Hajjah)

### Community Engagement and Coordination:

During reporting period 15 community engagements and mobilization sessions were carried out in the target locations in Abs and Hairan districts. The main topic was to engage communities linking WMCs and CHVs and to improve community's contribution to the WSS in order to sustain its operation. Total number of beneficiaries attended was 330 HHs (2,310 individuals: 495 male; 475 female; 683 boys and 657 girls).



### Food Security

Oxfam EFSVL team received the Post Office reconciliation reports for the 4<sup>th</sup> instalment of Unconditional cash transfer and livelihoods protection, as well as the 3<sup>rd</sup> round of cash for work in the targeted villages of Abs, Asslam and Kuaidanah districts of Hajjah governorate. Redeemed vouchers for 4607HHs UCT, 347 LHP and 3000 HHs CfW were submitted to finance department.

In Addition, a planning workshop was held by EFSVL Hajjah team for three days 4-6 September to introduce the new EFSVL projects funded by DFID and ECHO with participation of gender, protection and WASH teams. The team members were taken through the whole periodic plan and log frame to enhance understanding of the project deliverables and milestones. Furthermore, the team has come up with business process flow charts for Cash Transfer Process CTP which includes both programme and support function to understand the roles and responsibilities.

### Market Price Monitoring

The team continued the market monitoring activity in Abs district to monitor basic food commodity, fuel, gas and basic food prices and availability. During reporting period Stability in the basic food commodities prices such as wheat flour, cooking oil, rice and sugar was observed compared with the last reporting period due to stability in the market supply. Similarly, diesel and petrol price was stable as well. The value of Yemeni Rail rate is the same as the last week at 250 per 1 USD in the official banks, while it is value mounted to 300 YR per 1 USD in the black market.

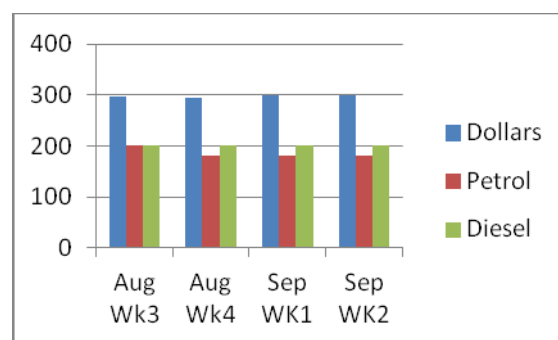


Figure 1 Market Price Change in Abs - Sep 2016



### WASH

#### Water Supply Schemes

**Water Trucking:** As a part of providing technical support to Bani Hassan Camp "MSF's operation area", Oxfam has continued providing treated trucked water to the camp with daily quantity of 277m<sup>3</sup> totalling to 4,155m<sup>3</sup> of trucked water provided during this reporting period. Cumulatively, 11,634 m<sup>3</sup> of treated water was delivered so far benefiting 3,227 HHs represents 22,589 individuals (6,528 female; 6,642 male; 4,631 girls and 4,788 boys) from both IDPs and host community. In addition, procurement process has been completed for supply and installation of solar pump system in Bani Hussein WSS (Hairan district) while the solar pump systems for Al-Deer and Bani Bajahrah is under technical analysis.

**Solar pumps:** as a part of support to rural water supply system for the sake of reducing O&M costs and improving the sustainability of water service in the targeted communities, procurement process has been completed for supply and installation of solar pump system in Bani Hussein and Al-Deer WSSs (Hairan district), Bani Bajahar WSS (Abs district) as well. In addition, the technical assessment for other five solar pumps systems is still ongoing.

**Sanitation:**

Procurement process has been completed to supply the required materials for construction of 230 latrines in Al-Zuhrah district while procurement process for supplying the required materials for construction of 400 latrines in Abs district is still ongoing. Registration of beneficiaries was already completed for both of Al-Zuhrah and Abs district.

**Rehabilitation of WSS:** for long term and sustainable solution of water provision, WASH team has completed design, BoQ, specifications and ROs for rehabilitation seven water systems WSS (Alsabeel, Deer Alagm, Deer Alhassi, Durainah Alolya, Barman, and Aljemakhiah) in Abs district and Muslaiba WSS in Al-Zuhrah district. In addition, the PHE team is preparing drawings/designs and BoQs for the remaining 19 WSS and 9 dug wells in Al-Zuhrah, Abs and Hairan districts

**Public Health Promotion**

During the reporting period, a total of 5 campaigns for cleaning jerry cans were conducted at water resources having 180 jerry cans cleaned and , thus, reaching 630 beneficiaries (135 male, 130 Female, 186 boy and 179 girls).

**AMRAN**

INDIVIDUALS ASSISTED: **54,607**

LOCATION: Khamir, Huoth, Al-Qaflah and Bani Suraim

**Community Engagement and Coordination**

A coordination meeting involving Oxfam and MSF discussed on-going and planned humanitarian activities and opportunities to coordinate efforts in order to leverage and maximise multiplier effects of the interventions. MSF reported malaria cases in Al-Qafla IDP camps. MSF will intervene by providing 200 mosquito's nets as a prevention measures in addition to attending to the medical needs of the affected cases.



**Food Security**

The EFSL team together with PHP & CHV's started the selection and verification processes for 3,000 households meeting vulnerability criteria for Unconditional Cash Transfers (UCT). So far the team had identified 1,400 HHs verified as eligible for UCT assistance. Out of the 1,400 identified thus far, 1,100 are male-headed HHs while 300 are female-headed HHs.

**Market Price Monitoring**

Prices of the basic commodities such as wheat flour, rice, Beans maintained stability. While the sugar increased by 5% .Moreover, price of vegetables, potato and Bananas were stable while the price of onions increased by 5 %. The fuel prices saw a drop with petrol price plunging by 25% while the diesel dropped by 1.2%. While the official rate of the YER against the US dollar remained the same 250 YER /1 USD , the YER weakened in the black market by 3% (**\$1=303 YER**).



**WASH**

**New Projects Planning Phase:**

This reporting period emphasised on robust planning for the project activities under DFID, HPF and SDC. The PHP teamed up with the EFSVL staff to conduct market assessment in the three districts of Huth, Khamir and BaniSuraim. The market

assessment aimed to explore opportunities and market capacity for multi-sector programming and the use of different response modalities (Cash, Voucher, in-kind) in responding to the needs of the IDPs.

### Sanitation

Oxfam continued its support for constructing new latrines in Amran. The construction work of 250 latrines in Houth and Khamir districts is 100% completed.

### Solid Waste Management

The Public Health Promoters held a meeting with Cleaning Fund in Khamir districts. The participants of the meeting discussed the plans for the waste management activities and options for sustainable solutions for solid waste management in the district.

### Water Supply Scheme WSS

Oxfam continued its efforts to support local communities needs for clean water via several activities:

- **Khamir Water Scheme – Section I-** Since the completion of the renovation work of Khamir city section one water network undertaken by Oxfam, 580 houses consisting of an estimated 1,740 households are connected to piped water.
- **Khamir Water Scheme – Section II-** Relevant logistical processes for 1 Reinforced Concrete (RC) water tank, 4 pumping rooms and 4 Pumps were completed and a contractor was selected.
- **Houth water scheme:** In support to the local water committee of Houth district, Oxfam provided and ensured the installation of pipes, cable for deepening of submersible pump and water meters required for the WSS.
- **Fuel Subsidy :**The team completed the final instalment of diesel subsidy and they managed to distribute (9,000 Litres) for 5 water schemes (2000 litter for Khamir WS ,2000 litter for Houth WS ,2600 litter for Sheharah WS,and 2400 for Alswdah WS ).
- **Al-Hujairat – Khamir water harvesting tank:**The construction of structural roof for rain water harvesting tank in Al-Hujar is 100% completed.

LOCATIONS: Al Modafar, Salah, Al Qahirah, Al-Taizyah, Alhawaban, Alturas and Al Shamayatayn

### Community Engagement



#### Food Security

##### Unconditional Cash Transfer

EFSVL team completed distribution of unconditional cash for 414 HHs in 2 sub districts Al-Gharbiah Al-Azeaz districts in Alshamyateen district funded by ECHO .

##### Market Price Monitoring

The team continued in market price monitoring in Al-Shamaytain district where it was observed that basic food commodities prices such as canned cooking oil, sugar and wheat flour were stable compared with the last reporting period. Dollar exchange rate increased from 270 YER per USD to 290 YER per 1 USD in the black market.

#### WASH

##### Sustainable Water System

Oxfam continued its support to Taiz Local Water and Sanitation Corporation LWSC via the rehabilitation of ten wells and rehabilitation of the water supply system pipe line. During reporting period three submersible pumps are provided to LWSC as per the quality agreed. In addition, PHE team is supporting the installation of six power generators.

## **ADEN & south Total beneficiaries reached: 101,000**

Oxfam team in Aden continued planning and initiation processes for various activities in coordination with local communities in targeted areas in Aden & south . The activities performed by Programme team with results achieved are listed below:

### **PHE:**

- The team has finalized the bidding process to conduct the water pumping tests in 4 Rural Water Supply Scheme ( RWSSs ) where 3 RWSS are in Lahaj and 1 RWSS in Abyan .
- The team already finished the needs assessment and finalised with the MoE 13 schools to be assisted with latrine rehabilitation.
- Review of tender documents of Aden LWSA furniture for support of district offices.
- Provision of assistance to community in Sufyan village, in Lahj Governorate to remove one pump that fell in a deep borehole.
- Needs identification visits to Jole Madram Village in Lahj Governorate.

### **PHP:**

- House to house visits continued in Gannah , Shawhat , Al Hada , Am Saeed Al Awsat villages in Lawder District of Abyan Governorate, for safe water chain , prevention of malaria, dengue fever, bilharzias and hepatitis A. In addition Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) screening continued Malnourished children are referred to the appropriate cluster/organisations
- Households registration process has started in intervention areas for the purpose of HHs profiling .This process is expected to provide more accurate information about the total number of HH, individual count of the members, status of water and sanitation access.
