I. WEATHER SITUATION

TAIL-END OF A COLD FRONT AND NORTHEAST MONSOON

The tail-end of a cold front is affecting Visayas and Mindanao while the northeast monsoon is affecting Luzon.

Visayas and Mindanao will experience mostly cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms becoming cloudy with widespread rains over Eastern Visayas which may trigger flashfloods and landslides. Luzon will have partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rains except for Eastern Luzon which mostly cloudy rains with light rains is expected.

III. PREPAREDNESS MEASURES/ACTIONS TAKEN

NDRRMC

- NDRRMC Emergency OpCen remains activated at "**RED ALERT**" STATUS to monitor the effects of the Tail-end of a Cold front while continuously providing advisories/warnings/bulletins and related information to all concerned and uploaded the same at the NDRRMC Website, Facebook, and Twitter accounts for further dissemination to their respective local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants

PAGASA

- Continuously provides NDRRMC OpCen with advisories on the Tail-end of a Cold front, Gale Warnings and General Flood Bulletins

DILG

- Continuously disseminates weather advisories to LGUs concerned particularly in Region VIII except for Northern Samar where phone lines are downed since Monday – communication to the area had been done mostly thru cellphone and email.
